

(Fern Owl, Goat Sucker, Night Hawk), Owl, Oyster Catcher, Redshank, Sandpiper, Shel-drake, Shrike, Common Tern, Twite, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker, and (after May 1st in each year) Lapwing (Peewit or Green Plover).

*All Eggs Protected within a Certain Area (Market-Garden Lands excepted).*

XI. The taking or destroying of the eggs of any species of Wild Bird is prohibited within the area named in Clause V for a period of five years from the date of this Order.

*Repeal of former Order.*

XII. The Order of the 13th March, 1909, is hereby repealed.

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated the 17th January, from His Majesty's Representative on the Constantinople Board of Health, stating that the following decisions were taken at a meeting of the Board held on the 16th January:—

(1) The measures in force against arrivals from the Bahrein Islands reduced to a medical visit.

(2) The measures in force against arrivals from Malta suppressed.

(3) The measures in force against arrivals from Italian ports suppressed, with the exception of arrivals from Sicilian ports, who will be still liable to a medical visit.

(4) The measures in force against Jeddah and the other Hedjaz ports reduced to a medical visit in the case of ordinary ships.
