# WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of Chester) Order, 1912.

Dated 29th January, 1912.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the Council of the Administrative County of Chester, I hereby make the following Order:—

#### Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of Chester) Order, 1912."

#### BIRDS.

#### Close Time Extended.

II. The time during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds or any of them is prohibited by the Act of 1880, shall be extended, throughout the Administrative County of Chester, so as to be between the 1st day of March and the 13th day of August in any year.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the whole of the Administrative County of Chester to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:—

Heron, Kestrel.

Other Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

IV. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the area named in Clause V of this Order to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:—

Common Bunting, Reed Bunting, Chiffchaff, Spotted Flycatcher, Meadow Pipit (Titlark), Red-backed Shrike, Missel Thrush, Wagtail (all species), Blackcap Warbler, Garden Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Wood Warbler, Wheatear, Whinchat, Golden-crested Wren.

#### All Birds Protected during the Whole of the Year within a Certain Area (Market-Garden Lands excepted).

V. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as extended by Clause II of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited within the undermentioned area:—

The portion of the Hundred of Wirral embracing the low-lying lands and sandbills situate between the estuaries of the Rivers Dec and Mersey, of which the boundaries shall commence to the south at a point of the main highway of the county of Chester 200 yards to the west of the Dock Cottages near "Docks" Railway Station of the Wirral Railway, run along the main highway to Bidston Village, and then turn in a northerly direction and run to Bidston Railway Station of the same railway, then turn in a westerly direction and run along the Wirral Railway until it reaches the Meols Station of such railway, then run along the highway near to the Meols Railway Station in a northerly direction to the Irish Sea, then on the north along the margin of high-water mark of the Irish Sea to a point at New Brighton where the Yellow Noses joins the said Irish Sea, and then run in a southerly direction to "Warren Drive" or road, and along "Warren Drive" to the most northerly house and grounds on the west side of such drive, then along the western boundary of the houses and premises situate along the western side of such drive or road to a point 100 yards

or so from Grove Road, then turning in a westerly direction along the northern boundaries of the houses and premises in Grove Road, Wallasey, until it reaches the Wirral Railway, then turning in a southerly direction along the Wirral Railway until it reaches the Wallasey Marsh, then along the edge of the marsh in a southerly direction until it reaches the Poulton Halfpenny Bridge, then turning in a westerly direction on the edge of the said marsh until it reaches along the edge of the marsh the main highway leading from Poulton to Meols.

Provided that such parts of the area aforesaid as are market-garden lands are excepted from the operation of this Clause and of Clauses IV and XI of this Order.

The area aforesaid (except market-garden lands, which are left uncoloured) is coloured pink and outlined in red on a map sealed with the seal of the Secretary of State, dated the 29th January, 1912, and deposited in the office of the County Council.

### Further Protection for all Birds.

VI. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as extended by Clause II of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited in such portions of the Rivers Dee and Mersey as are within the district of the Administrative County of Chester.

Additional Protection for the Gull and Tern.

VII. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as extended by Clause II of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of the Gull and Tern is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of Chester.

# Certain Districts Exempted from the Operation of Clause VII.

VIII. I hereby exempt from the operation of Clause VII of this Order so much of the Administrative County of Chester as does not lie within the parishes of Puddington, Burton, Ness, Neston-cum-Parkgate, Gayton, Heswall-cum-Oldfield, Thurstaston, Caldy, Hoylake-cum-West Kirby, Wallasey, Lower Bebington, Bromborough, Eastham, Hooton, Ellesmere Port, Ince, Great Stanney, Frodsham Lordship, Weston, Runcorn, Halton, Norton, Moore, Acton Grange, Walton Inferior, including therein so much of the estuaries of the Rivers Dee and Mersey as lie within the Administrative County of Chester.

#### Certain Birds Protected during the whole of the Year.

IX. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as extended by Clause II of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of Chester:

Bittern, Shoveller Duck, Goldfinch, Great Crested Grebe, Little Grebe or Dabchick, Heron, Kingfisher, Brown Linnet, Nightjar (Fern Owl, Goat Sucker, Night Hawk), Owl, Lesser Redpole, Siskin, Twite, Green Wood-pecker, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker.

Eggs.

Certain Eggs protected throughout the Administrative County.

X. The taking or destroying of the Eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of Chester:

Bittern, Dunlin, Great Crested Grebe, Little Grebe or Dabchick, Black-headed Gull, Hawfinch, Heron, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Nightjar (Fern Owl, Goat Sucker, Night Hawk), Owl, Oyster Catcher, Redshank, Sandpiper, Sheldrake, Shrike, Common Tern, Twite, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker, and (after May 1st in each year) Lapwing (Peewit or Green Plover).

# All Eggs Protected within a Certain Area (Market-Garden Lands excepted).

XI. The taking or destroying of the eggs of any species of Wild Bird is prohibited within the area named in Clause V for a period of five years from the date of this Order.

### Repeal of former Order.

XII. The Order of the 13th March, 1909, is hereby repealed.

#### WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of Huntingdon) Order, 1912.

Dated 2nd February, 1912.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the Council of the Administrative County of Huntingdon, I hereby make the following Order:-

#### Title.

I. This Order may be cited as the Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of Huntingdon) Order, 1912.

#### BIRDS.

# Close Time varied.

II. The time during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Act of 1880 shall be varied, throughout the Administrative County of Huntingdon, so as to be between the 14th day of March and the 1st day of September in each year, except as regards Wild Duck, the close time for which will remain as fixed by the said Act, namely, between the first day of March and the first day of August in each year.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the Administrative County of Huntingdon to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:

Bullfinch, Hedge Sparrow, Heron, Linnet, Nuthatch, Robin, Swallow, Wren (all species).

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

IV. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as varied by Clause II of this Order, does not extend, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of Huntingdon:

Bullfinch, Goldfinch, Hedge Sparrow, Heron, Kingfisher, Owl (except Little Owl), Robin, Swallow, Wren (all species).

Certain Birds protected on Sundays throughout the Administrative County.

V. During those periods of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as varied by Clause II of this Order, does not extend, it shall be unlawful throughout the Administrative County of Huntingdon to kill or take on Sundays any of the Wild Birds mentioned in the Schedule to the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as amended by the Act of 1881, or added thereto by Clause III of this Order.

All Birds protected on Sundays in certain Areas.

VI. During those periods of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as varied by Clause II of this Order, does not extend, the killing or taking of Wild Birds on Sundays is prohibited on such portions of the River Ouse and River Nene as are situate within the County of Huntingdon, their banks, backwaters, and tributaries, and within a distance of 50 yards on each side thereof.

### Eggs.

Certain Eggs protected throughout the County.

VII. The taking or destroying of the Eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of Huntingdon:

Bullfinch, Goldfinch, Hedge Sparrow, Heron, Kingfisher, Nightingale, Nuthatch, Owl (except Little Owl), Robin, Swallow, Wild Duck, Woodpecker, Wren (all species).

Repeal of Former Order.

VIII. The Order of the 15th July, 1904, is hereby repealed.

# DEVONSHIRE (EPIZOOTIC ABORTION) ORDER OF 1912.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

### Limitation of Scope of Order.

1. This Order shall not apply to a premature calving resulting from accident or some other definite cause other than epizootic abortion.

# Notice of Premature Calving and Isolation pending Inquiry.

2.—(1.) Every person having in his possession or under his charge a cow which has calved prematurely shall with all practical speed give notice of the fact to a constable of the police force for the police area in which the cow is.

(2.) The constable receiving such notice shall forthwith give information of the receipt by him of the notice to an Inspector of the Local Authority, who shall forthwith report the same

to the Local Authority.

(3) The cow and its calf (if any) shall be kept separate by the owner or person in charge thereof from any bull or cow (other than a calf) pending the inquiry by the Local Authority as to the existence of epizootic abortion.

(4.) The membranes, discharges and other matter liable to cause infection, and the calf, if born dead, shall be destroyed by the owner or person in charge of the cow as soon as possible by burning or burial in lime, but not until such samples as are required for the purpose of the prescribed veterinary inquiry have been taken by the officer employed by the Local Authority to carry out such inquiry. Such matter shall, as far as practicable, be removed from contact with cows by the owner or person in charge of the cow.

Inquiry by Local Authority as to existence of Epizootic Abortion.

3.—(1.) The Local Authority on receiving information of a premature calving shall forthwith cause inquiry to be instituted, with the assistance and advice of a Veterinary Inspector or of a veterinary practitioner qualified according to the Act of 1894 to be a Veterinary Inspector, to ascertain whether it was caused by epizootic abortion.

(2.) The owner and occupier of any premises on which there is a cow which has calved prematurely shall give all reasonable facilities for the inquiry by the Local Authority under this

Article.

Isolation of Diseased Animals by Notice served by Inspector of Local Authority.

4.—(1.) The Local Authority, unless satisfied by an inquiry under the preceding Article that the premature calving was not caused by epizootic abortion, shall forthwith cause a Notice (in the Form set forth in the Schedule to this Order or to the like effect) to be served by an Inspector of the Local Authority on the owner or person in charge of the cow affected requiring that the cow and its calf (if any) be detained on or in a field, yard, shed, or other place specified in the Notice, and after the service of such Notice it shall not be lawful for any person, until the expiration of three calendar months from the date of the calving, or the previous withdrawal of the Notice by an Inspector of the Local Authority-

(i.) to move the cow or its calf, or permit either to stray, from or out of such field, yard, shed, or other place, except as hereinafter provided;

(ii.) to permit the cow or its calf to come in contact with any bull or cow (other than a

- (iii.) to remove from or out of such field, yard, shed, or other place any dung, fodder, litter, or other thing that has been in contact with the cow, without the written permission of an Inspector of the Local Authority.
- (2.) The owner or person in charge of the cow or calf shall from time to time, as often as occasion may require, or as an Inspector of the Local Authority may direct, cleanse and disinfect such internal and external parts of the cow as have been in contact with infectious membranes, discharges or other matter, and also cleanse and disinfect the calf.
- (3.) An Inspector of the Local Authority, if satisfied that the movement of a cow or its calf to which a Notice applies to some other place of detention is expedient for purposes of isolation or other necessary purpose, may by Licence authorise such movement, and

the cow or its calf may thereupon so moved, subject to the directions the Inspector, by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay, to such place of detention, and thereupon the Notice shall have effect as if such place of detention

were therein specified.

(4.) A cow or its calf detained under a Notice under this Order may be moved from or out of the place of detention specified in the Notice to a slaughterhouse, if accompanied by a Movement Licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the premises are situate from which the cow or calf is to be moved. On arrival at the slaughterhouse the cow or calf shall be there detained until it is slaughtered.

(5.) Every Licence granted under this Article shall be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest police station in the same District by the person in charge of the cow or calf at the time of completing the movement

authorised by the Licence

(6.) An Inspector shall with all practicable speed send copies of any Notice or Licence issued by him under this Article to the Local Authority, and to the police officer in charge of the nearest police station of the District. Where the place of destination is in another District the Inspector shall also send a copy of the Licence to the Local Authority of that District.

(7.) A calf placed with a cow shall, for the purpose of this Article, be treated as its calf.

Provision in case of Second Case of Premature Calving.

5. Where a premature calving of a cow takes place on any farm or premises on which there is a cow which has aborted from epizootic abortion within three calendar months, the Local Authority may cause a Notice in respect of the subsequent premature calving to be served preceding Article without the under the necessity of the veterinary inquiry hereinbefore prescribed, unless at or immediately after their receipt of the information of premature calving they are furnished by the owner or person in charge of the cow with a veterinary certificate to the effect that the premature calving was not caused by epizootic abortion.

Cleansing, Disinfection and other Precautions.

- 6. The occupier of any premises on which there is a cow required by this Order to be kept separate from other animals shall take such steps as may be necessary to prevent its dung or urine coming in contact with any other cow, and shall from time to time, as occasion may require, or as an Inspector of the Local Authority may direct, cleanse and disinfect the part of the premises used for the cow in manner. following : -
  - (i.) The part of the premises shall be thoroughly soaked or drenched with a four per cent. (minimum) solution of carbolic acid (containing not less than ninety-five per cent. of actual carbolic acid); then

(ii.) The part of the premises shall, if the nature thereof so permit, be scraped and, where necessary, swept, and the scrapings and sweepings and all dung, sawdust, litter, and other matter shall be effectually removed therefrom; then

(iii.) The part of the premises shall be thoroughly washed or scrubbed or scoured with water, and then be thoroughly coated or washed with-

(a) a one per cent. (minimum) solution of chloride of lime containing not less than thirty per cent. of available chlorine; or

(b) a four per cent. (minimum) solution of carbolic acid (containing not less than ninety-five per cent. of actual carbolic acid), followed by a thorough sprinkling with limewash; or

(c) a disinfectant equal in disinfective efficiency to the above-mentioned solution of carbolic acid, followed by a thorough

sprinkling with limewash.

(iv.) In the case of a field, yard, or other place which is not capable of being so cleansed and disinfected, it shall be sufficient if such field, yard, or place be cleansed and disinfected as far as practicable, and to the satisfaction of an Inspector of the Local Authority.

(2.) The scrapings and sweepings, and the dung, sawdust, litter, and other matter removed under this Article shall forthwith be burnt or well mixed with quicklime and be effectually removed from contact with cows.

# Granting of Movement Licences.

7. A Movement Licence granted under this Order shall not be available if granted by the owner of the cow or calf to be moved, or by his agent, or by the consignee of the cow or calf, or by the occupier of the farm or premises or slaughterhouse from or to which the cow or calf is to be moved, or by any individual member of an Executive Committee or Sub-Committee of a Local Authority.

#### Withdrawal of Notices of Isolation.

8. A Notice of Isolation may be withdrawn by a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Local Authority acting under the direction of the Local Authority, served on the owner or person in charge of the cow.

# Extension of certain Sections of Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

9. Epizootic abortion of cows shall be a disease for the purposes of this Order and of the following sections of the Act of 1894 (namely):

Section forty-three (Police); Section forty-four (General Administrative Provisions);

and also for the purposes of all other sections of the said Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those sections and this Order, including such sections as relate to offences and legal proceedings.

# Interpretation.

10. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires-

"The Board" means the Board of Agricul-

ture and Fisheries: The Act of 1894" means the Diseases of

Animals Act, 1894: "Inspector" includes Veterinary Inspector: ",Cow " includes heifer.

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Act of 1894.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

11. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

#### Extent.

12. This Order extends to the District of the Local Authority of the county of Devon.

#### Commencement.

13. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-sixth day of February, ninetcen hundred and twelve.

#### Short Title.

14. This Order may be cited as the DEVON-SHIRE (EPIZOOTIC ABORTION) ORDER OF 1912.
