THE PUBLIC HEALTH ACTS AMENDMENT ACT, 1907.

BOROUGH OF WEYMOUTH AND MELCOMBE REGIS.

NOTICE is hereby given, that by an Order dated the 20th day of January, 1912, the Local Government Board have confirmed an Order made on the 6th day of November, 1911, by the Town Council of Weymouth and Melcombe Regis, in pursuance of section 112 of the Public Health Act, 1875, as amended by section 51 of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907, declaring each of the trades of Fish frier, dealer in Rags, Bones, Fat, Animal Skins, and other putrescible animal products, Blood drier, Fat melter or Fat extractor, Nettlings or Chitterling boiler and Gut scraper, within the borough of Weymouth and Melcombe Regis, to be an offensive trade.

SOUTHGATE URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Right Hon. Reginald McKenna, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, has, in pursuance of the power conferred upon him by section 3 of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907, made an Order declaring

section 81 (extending the definition of public place and street for certain purposes), modified by the omission of all the words after "the following offences," except the words, "Every person who wilfully and indecently exposes his person," of Part VII, Part VIII (Fire Brigade), and Part IX (Sky Signs), of the said Act to be in force in the urban district of Southgate.

CITY OF BRADFORD.

NOTICE is hereby given, that by an Order dated the 29th day of January, 1912, the Local Government Board have confirmed an Order made on the 12th day of January, 1912, by the Town Council of Bradford, in pursuance of section 112 of the Public Health Act, 1875, as amended by section 51 of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907, declaring each of the trades of Fat melter, Gut scraper, Size maker, manufacturer of Manure from fish offal, blood, or other putrescible animal matter, Fish frier, Hide and Skin dealer, Rabbit Skin drier, and Oil distiller and refiner, within the city of Bradford, to be an offensive trade.

CITY OF SHEFFIELD.

NOTICE is hereby given, that on the 17th day of January, 1912, the Local Government Board made an Order declaring that section 24 comprised in Part II of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907, should be in force in the City of Sheffield on and after the 14th day of February, 1912, and that such section should have effect subject to the operation of section 33 of the Act of 1907, and as if the said section 33 were incorporated with and formed part of the said section 24.

The effect of the Order is to empower the Sheffield Corporation as the Urban Sanitary Authority to make bye-laws with respect to the height of chimneys of buildings and with respect to the height of buildings, and with respect to the structure of chimney shafts for the furnaces of steam engines, breweries, distilleries or manufactories.

Section 33 exempts the buildings of railway companies and others from the operation of such bye-laws.
