The following Statute made by the Governing Body of All Souls College, Oxford, on the 9th day of December, 1911 (and sealed on the 5th day of February, 1912), amending Statutes III, IV, V, VI, VII, VIII, XIIA, and XIII of the Statutes of the said College, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions contained in "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877":—

Whereas the University of Oxford Commissioners, under and by virtue of all and every the powers in that behalf enabling them contained in the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, did by an Instrument under their seal dated the 16th day of June, 1881, make certain Statutes thereunto annexed for Your Petitioners, who are therein described as "the College of All Souls of the Faithful Departed, commonly called All Souls College, in the University of Oxford."

And whereas such Statutes were approved by Her late Majesty in Council on the 3rd day of May, 1882, and have since been altered and amended from time to time.

And whereas at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of our said College, specially summoned for that purpose, and held on the 9th day of December, 1911, it was unanimously resolved that the several further alterations in and additions to the said Statutes hereinafter specified should be made, that is to say:—

In Statute III.—That Clauses Nos. 1, 3, 5, 8 (formerly 7), and 21 (formerly 20) of Statute III should be repealed and new clauses in the following words be substituted therefor respectively, namely:—

1. Subject to the provisions of these Statutes twenty-one of the Fellows shall be awarded after examination.

(1) Fourteen of these Fellowships shall be awarded after examination in such subjects connected with the studies of Law and History as the Warden and Fellows may from time to time determine.

Elections to two such Fellowships shall be made, if practicable, in every year.

(2) Seven of these Fellowships shall be awarded after examination in such subjects connected with the studies of the University as the Warden and Fellows may from time to time determine.

An election to not more than one such Fellowship may be made, but shall not be required to be made in each year.
