The following Addresses were presented to the King at Buckingham Palace on Saturday, the 10th instant:—

ADDRESS FROM THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF LONDON.

To Their Most Excellent Majesties the King and the Queen.

The dutiful and loyal Address of the Lord Mayor, Aldermen and Commons of the City of London in Common Council assembled.

*May it please your Majesties,—*

We, your Majesties' most dutiful and loyal subjects the Lord Mayor, Aldermen and Commons of the City of London in Common Council assembled, approach your presence with the most devoted loyalty and attachment to offer to your Majesties our most dutiful congratulations on your safe return to this Country from your historical and epoch-making visit to your Indian Empire.

We, together with all your faithful subjects, have followed with the deepest interest the record of the many stirring scenes in which your Majesties took part during your stay in India, especially the splendid ceremonial of your Majesties' state entry into Delhi, and the

incomparable spectacle of the Durbar, carried out with such complete success and so much magnificence amid the enthusiastic loyalty of all classes and creeds of your Indian people.

We pray that the great work accomplished by your Majesties in India may, by the blessing of the Almighty, prove of lasting advantage to the peoples of India and the Empire.

In conclusion, we pray that your Majesties and all your Royal House may be blessed by Almighty God, and that your Majesties may long be spared to reign over a happy, prosperous and contented people.

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To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious Answer:—

The Queen and I thank you most heartily for your loyal congratulations on Our return home at the conclusion of Our visit to the great Empire of India.

The homage We received from its Princes and Rulers and the devotion manifested to Us wherever We went in that vast land have deeply moved Us.

I believe that these signs of affectionate loyalty testify to an undying attachment of the Peoples of India to the Crown.

Since our return to England this spirit has vividly expressed itself in the spontaneous message of cordial goodwill and fellowship from the Princes and Peoples of India to the British Nation.

I am confident that you, the Representatives of the City of London, the heart of the Mother-Country, and all My people in these Islands, will welcome and reciprocate the assurance in that message of warm attachment to the Empire and the expression of belief that the link which unites India to My other Imperial Dominions cannot be broken.

We earnestly hope that Our visit to India and the important measures announced during its progress may result in the betterment of the Administration and further the general happiness and well-being of the People.

I feel sure that nowhere will such an advancement be more welcome than in the City of London, which has an historical connection with India from the earliest days of British influence and rule, and is bound to it to-day by ties of ever-increasing commerce.

We are touched by your sympathy with the sorrow which We feel at the loss of Our beloved Brother-in-law, the Duke of Fife, a sorrow which is shared by all who are acquainted with his life and character.

We are grateful for your prayers on our behalf. By God's help My efforts will constantly be directed towards the happiness and prosperity of all My subjects both here and in the most distant parts of My Empire.

#### ADDRESS FROM THE LONDON COUNTY COUNCIL.

To Their Most Excellent Majesties the King and Queen.

The Loyal and Dutiful Address of the Council of the Administrative County of London.

*May it please Your Majesties,—*

We, the Council of the Administrative County of London, beg loyally to offer our congratulations to Your Majesties upon Your Majesties' return from the successful performance of the high and important functions which Your Majesties' Sovereign position has caused Your Majesties to undertake in the interest alike of the Kingdom and the Empire. We take leave to assure Your Majesties that the many evidences of personal affection and loyalty which all sections of the people of India exhibited throughout the entire series of events which culminated with the creation of the ancient and historical City of Delhi to be the capital City of India were considered with the greatest interest and satisfaction by all classes of the inhabitants of London, and we venture to affirm that Your Majesties' home coming to the capital of the Empire affords the opportunity, in no insignificant manner, of manifesting the fresh bonds of constitutional relationship which knit India with the British Dominions in entire devotion to their Sovereign Lord and Lady, King and Queen.

We cannot refrain from expressing our deep sorrow at the death of His Grace the Duke of Fife, husband of the Princess Royal, and Lord Lieutenant of our county, and beg respectfully

to tender our sympathy with Your Majesties and the Royal Family in this severe bereavement.

We are heartfelt in our feelings of thankfulness that Your Majesties' health and strength have been preserved throughout the great events which have just passed, and we beg leave, on behalf of all London, to give expression to our continued devotion and loyalty.

To which address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious Answer:—

The Queen and I thank you heartily, and through you the inhabitants of London, for the warmth of their welcome to Us on Our return from India.

We were touched by the assembly in the streets of the crowds who gave Us so hearty a reception, both on Our arrival and as We proceeded to and from St. Paul's Cathedral on the following day.

It has been a matter of gratification to Us to feel that the brilliant and momentous events of the past three months have been followed with such sympathetic interest here in London; and I trust that this interest will lead to a deeper realisation by all My people of their responsibilities towards My Indian Empire.

The enthusiastic and affectionate loyalty which have greeted the Queen and Myself throughout Our journey, will always be to Me a source of inspiration in My endeavours toward the general welfare of My subjects.

We appreciate deeply your sympathetic reference to the death of Our beloved Brother-in-law, the Duke of Fife, which has clouded the bright occasion of Our home coming.

I acknowledge with gratitude the assurances of the loyalty and devotion to My Throne and Person to which your Address gives expression.

“Whereas by section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, and other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the 4th day of May, 1911, Your Majesty was graciously pleased to approve of an addition of £10 for each complete year's full pay service in the rank of Paymaster in Chief on the Active List being allowed in the assessment of Retired Pay of Officers of that

rank retired on or after the 1st April, 1911, subject to the total Retired Pay not exceeding £500 per annum:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to authorize us to adjust the Retired Pay of such Officers accordingly, as from the 1st April, 1911.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty’s Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

“And whereas by an Order in Council of Her late Majesty bearing date the 12th day of November, 1900, sanction was given for the employment of retired Naval or Army Medical Officers to conduct the final medical examination of locally raised recruits at certain Recruiting Centres, the officers so appointed receiving a non-pensionable allowance of £100 a year, in addition to Retired Pay:

“And whereas it has been found convenient that the Examining Medical Officer at Liverpool should also undertake the examination of men for enrolment and re-enrolment in the Reserves and other special medical duties in the Recruiting District:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the following arrangements:—

“(1) The non-pensionable allowance of the Examining Medical Officer at Liverpool to be increased from £100 to £150 a year as from the 1st April, 1911:

“(2) The allowances of Examining Medical Officers in other districts to be increased in similar circumstances at our discretion, subject to the concurrence of the Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty’s Treasury, up to a maximum of £150 a year where the additional duties involved are considered to justify the payment of increased emoluments.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty’s Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by the Burial Act, 1853, as amended by the Burial Act, 1900, it is provided that, in case it appears to His Majesty in Council, upon the representation of the Local Government Board, that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new burial ground in any city or town, or within any other limits, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, should be prohibited, or that burials in any city or town, or within any other limits, or in any burial grounds or places of burial, should be wholly discontinued, or should be discontinued subject to any exception or qualification, it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order that no new burial ground shall be opened in any city or town, or within such limits, without such previous approval, or (as the case may require) that, after a time mentioned in the Order, burials in such city or town, or within such limits, or in such burial grounds or places of burial, shall be discontinued wholly, or subject to any exceptions or qualifications mentioned in such Order, and so from time to time as circumstances may require: Provided always that notice of such representation, and of the time when it shall please His Majesty to order the same to be taken into consideration by the Privy Council, shall be published in the London Gazette, and shall be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the parishes affected by such representation, one month before such representation is so considered: Provided also that no such representation shall be made in relation to the burial ground of any parish until ten days' previous notice of the intention to make such representation shall have been given to the Incumbent and the Vestry Clerk or Churchwardens of such parish:

And whereas the Local Government Board, after giving to the Incumbent and the Churchwardens of the parish of St. Mark, Friday Bridge, in the Isle of Ely, ten days' previous notice of their intention in that behalf, have made a representation to His Majesty in Council that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new burial ground in the civil parish of Elm, in the Isle of Ely, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, should be prohibited, and that burials should be discontinued in the said parish as hereinafter directed:

And whereas by an Order in Council dated the 16th day of December, 1911, notice of such representation was given, and it was ordered that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council, on the 29th day of January, 1912, and that the said Order in Council be forthwith published in the London Gazette, and copies thereof affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the parish affected by such representation one month before the said 29th day of January, 1912.

And whereas the said Order in Council of the 16th day of December, 1911, has been duly published in the London Gazette and copies thereof have been affixed in the manner directed by the said Order:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the opening of any new burial ground in the said civil parish of Elm, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, be and the same is hereby prohibited, and that burials in the said parish be discontinued as follows, viz.:—

ELM.—Forthwith and entirely in the Church of Saint Mark, Friday Bridge, in the civil parish of Elm, in the Isle of Ely, and in the churchyard.

WHEREAS the Local Government Board, after giving to the Incumbent of the parish of Church Honeybourne with Cow Honeybourne, in the county of Worcester, ten days' previous notice of their intention in that behalf, have, under the provisions of the Burial Act, 1853, made a representation to His Majesty in Council, stating that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new burial ground in the civil parish of Church Honeybourne aforesaid, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, should be prohibited, and that burials should be discontinued therein, as follows, viz.:—

CHURCH HONEYBOURNE.—Forthwith and entirely in the parish church of Saint Egwin, Church Honeybourne, in the county of Worcester, and in the Churchyard.

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council, on the 25th day of March next.

And His Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the parish affected by such representation one month before the said 25th day of March.

WHEREAS by the Extradition Acts, 1870 to 1906, it was amongst other things enacted that, where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that His Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of His Majesty's dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions, and qualifications as may be deemed expedient:

And whereas a Treaty was concluded on the  $\frac{11\text{th}}{24\text{th}}$  day of September, 1910, between His Majesty and His Majesty the King of the Hellenes for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, which Treaty is in the terms following:—

Who, after having exhibited to each other their respective full powers and found them in good and due form, have agreed upon the following Articles:—

#### ARTICLE 1.

The High Contracting Parties engage to deliver up to each other, under certain circumstances and conditions stated in the present Treaty, those persons who, being accused or convicted of any of the crimes or offences enumerated in Article 2, committed in the territory of the one Party, shall be found within the territory of the other Party.

#### ARTICLE 2.

Extradition shall be granted for the following crimes or offences when provided for by the laws of the requisitioning State and of the State applied to:—

1. Murder (including parricide, infanticide, poisoning), or attempt or conspiracy to murder, manslaughter
2. Kidnapping and false imprisonment.
3. Abandoning or exposing children below the age of 7 years.

17. Fraudulent bankruptcy.

18. Malicious injury to any house or building calculated to cause danger to life or property.

Participation in the aforesaid crimes is also included, provided that such participation is punishable by the laws of the demanding State and of the State applied to.

## ARTICLE 3.

No Greek subject shall be surrendered by the Government of His Majesty the King of the Hellenes to the Government of His Britannic Majesty, and no British subject shall be surrendered by his Government to the Government of His Majesty the King of the Hellenes.

## ARTICLE 4.

Extradition shall not take place if the person claimed on the part of His Britannic Majesty's Government, or of the Government of His Majesty the King of the Hellenes, has already been tried, discharged, or punished, or is waiting trial in the territory of the United Kingdom or in Greece, respectively, for the crime or offence for which his extradition is demanded.

If the person claimed on the part of the Government of His Majesty the King of the Hellenes, or of his Britannic Majesty's Government, should be awaiting trial or undergoing sentence for any other crime or offence in the territory of Greece or in the United Kingdom, respectively, his extradition shall be deferred until after he has been discharged, whether by acquittal or on expiration of sentence.

## ARTICLE 5.

Extradition shall not be granted if exemption from prosecution or

Neither shall it be granted in the case of persons convicted by default, or otherwise, unless the sentence inflicted be at least one year's imprisonment.

## ARTICLE 6.

The person claimed shall not be surrendered if the crime in respect of which extradition is applied for be deemed by the party to whom application is made to be a political offence, or connected with such an offence, or if the person claimed proves that the application for extradition has in fact been made with a view to try or to punish him for an offence of this character.

## ARTICLE 7.

A person whose surrender has been granted shall in no case be detained or tried in the State to which the surrender has been made for any other crime, or on account of any other matters than those for which the extradition shall have taken place.

This stipulation does not apply to crimes committed after the extradition.

The person who has been claimed, and whose extradition shall have been granted, shall not be tried or punished for any political offence committed prior to his extradition, nor for any matter connected with such an offence, nor for any crimes or offences not provided for in the present Treaty.

## ARTICLE 8.

The requisition for extradition shall be made through the Diplo-

The requisition for the extradition of an accused person must be accompanied by a warrant of arrest issued by the competent judicial authority setting forth clearly the nature of the crime or offence with which the person claimed is charged. The said warrant shall also be accompanied by such evidence as, according to the laws of the place where the accused is found, would justify his arrest if the crime had been committed there.

If the requisition relates to a person already convicted, it must be accompanied by a copy of the judgment passed on the convicted person by the competent Court of the State that makes the requisition for extradition.

A sentence passed *in contumaciam* is not to be deemed a conviction, but a person so sentenced may be dealt with as an accused person.

In the event of any doubt arising as to whether the crime or offence, in respect of which the prosecution has been instituted, comes within the stipulations of the present Treaty, the Government applied to shall be at liberty to require all such further information as it may consider necessary or of assistance in order to form an opinion, after which it shall decide what action shall be taken on the demand for extradition.

The requisitioning Government, in furnishing such further information to the Government applied to, shall, at the same time, place at the disposal of the latter all such documents as may be necessary or useful in enabling it to form an opinion.

Provisional arrest shall be effected in the manner and in accordance with the rules laid down by the laws of the State applied to. It shall not be maintained if, within a period of one month from the date on which it has been effected, the State applied to has not been furnished with one of the documents specified in Article 8 of the present Treaty.

## ARTICLE 14.

If the accused or sentenced person be not a subject of one of the Contracting Parties, the Government to whom application for extradition is made shall be at liberty to take such action in respect of the application, as it may think fit, and to surrender the person claimed to be tried in the State in which the crime or offence has been committed.

Nevertheless, the Government of His Majesty the King of the Hellenes reserves to itself the option of surrendering the person claimed to the State to which he belongs, instead of surrendering him to the State in which the crime or offence has been committed.

## ARTICLE 15.

If a fugitive criminal who has been arrested has not been surrendered and conveyed away within three months after his arrest, or within three months after the decision of the Court upon the return to a writ of *habeas corpus* in the United Kingdom, he shall be set at liberty.

## ARTICLE 16.

When extradition is granted all articles connected with the crime or offence, or which may serve as proofs of the crime, which are found in the possession of the person claimed at the time of his arrest, or which may be afterwards discovered, shall, if the competent authority of the State applied to so direct, be seized and restored to the requisitioning State.

Such restoration shall be carried out, even if extradition be not carried out owing to the escape or death of the person claimed.

The rights, however, which third persons, not involved in the prosecution, may have acquired over the said articles are reserved, and the latter shall, should the case arise, be restored to them, free of charge, at the termination of the proceedings.

## ARTICLE 17.

All expenses arising out of an application for extradition, also the costs of the arrest, maintenance, and transport of the person whose extradition shall have been granted, as well as of the dispatch and forwarding of the articles which, by the provisions of Article 16, are to be returned or restored, shall be borne by the requisitioning State and by the State applied to within the limits of their respective territories.

The cost of transport or other expenses outside the territory of the State applied to shall be borne by the demanding State.

## ARTICLE 18.

The stipulations of the present Treaty shall be applicable to the Colonies and foreign possessions of His Britannic Majesty.

The requisition for the surrender of a fugitive criminal who has taken refuge in any of such Colonies or foreign possessions shall be made to the Governor or chief authority of such Colony or possession by the Chief consular officer of Greece in such Colony or possession.

His Britannic Majesty shall, however, be at liberty to make special arrangements in the British Colonies and foreign possessions for the surrender of criminals from Greece who may take refuge within such Colonies and foreign possessions, on the basis of the provisions of the present Treaty.

Requisitions for the surrender of a fugitive criminal emanating from any Colony or foreign possession of His Britannic Majesty shall be governed by the rules laid down in the preceding Articles of the present Treaty.

#### ARTICLE 19.

The present Treaty shall come into operation ten days after its publication in conformity with the laws of the respective countries.

Crimes committed prior to the coming into force of the Treaty shall not form the subject of an application for extradition except in cases in which the persons claimed shall have taken refuge in the territory of the State applied to after the exchange of ratifications.

Each of the Contracting Parties shall be at liberty at any time to denounce the present Treaty upon giving six months' notice to the other Party of its intention to do so.

It shall be ratified, and the ratifications shall be exchanged at Athens as soon as possible.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the Council of the Administrative County of Anglesey, I hereby make the following Order:—

*Title.*

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of Anglesey) Order, 1912."

BIRDS.

*Close Time for Certain Birds varied.*

II. The period during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Act of 1880 shall be varied throughout the Administrative County of Anglesey so far as concerns the undermentioned birds, so as to be between the last day of February and the 1st day of October in any year:—

Auk, Avocet, Bee-eater, Bittern, Cornish Chough, Cuckoo, Curlew or Whaup, Stone Curlew (Thick-knee), Dotterel, Dunlin (Ox Bird), Ploverspage, Purre or Sea Lark), Fulmar, Gannet or Solan Goose, Godwit, Grebe, Greenshank, Guillemot (Marrot, Murra, Scout or Willock), Gull or Seamew (except Black-backed Gull), Hoopoe, Kingfisher, Kittiwake or Tarrock, Loon or Diver, Merganser, Nightingale, Nightjar (Night-Hawk, Goat-Sucker, Fern Owl), Oriole, Owl, Oyster Catcher, Petrel, Phalarope, Puffin (Coulterneb or Sea Parrot), American Quail or Colin, Razorbill, Redshank, Reeve or Ruff, Roller, Sanderling, Sandpiper (Summer Snipe), Shearwater, Sheldrake, Skua or Bonxie, Smew, Spoonbill, Stint, Stonehatch, Tern or Sea Swallow, Tystey, Whimbrel, Woodpecker.

*The Goldfinch protected during the whole of the Year.*

III. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Pro-

tection Act, 1880, does not extend, the killing or taking of the Goldfinch is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of Anglesey.

#### Eggs.

##### *Certain Eggs protected.*

IV. The taking or destroying of the Eggs of the following species of Wild Birds and of those appearing in Clause II of this Order (being the birds named in the Schedule to the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as amended by the Act of 1881) is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of Anglesey:—

Eider Duck, Shoveller Duck, Mallard or Wild Duck, Goldfinch, Lark, Pochard or Dun-bird, Snipe, Teal, Widgeon, Woodcock, and (after April 1st in each year) Lapwing (Peewit or Green Plover).

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of the Parts of Kesteven, Lincolnshire) Order, 1912."

#### BIRDS.

##### *Close time extended.*

II. The time during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Act of 1880 shall be extended throughout the Administrative County of the Parts of Kesteven, Lincolnshire, so as to be between the last day of February and the 16th day of August in each year.

##### *Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.*

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply throughout the Administrative County of the Parts of Kesteven, Lincolnshire, to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:—Common Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Hobby, Kestrel,

House Martin, Sand Martin, Merlin, Swallow, Swift, Wryneck.

##### *Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.*

IV. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as extended by Clause II. of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of the Parts of Kesteven, Lincolnshire:—Goldfinch, Kingfisher, House Martin, Owl (all species), Swallow.

#### Eggs.

##### *Certain Eggs protected throughout the Administrative County.*

V. The taking or destroying of the Eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of the Parts of Kesteven, Lincolnshire:—Common Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Wild Duck (all species), Goldfinch, Hobby, Kestrel, Kingfisher, House Martin, Sand Martin, Merlin, Nightingale, Nightjar, Owl (all species), Ruff or Reeve, Swallow, Swift, Teal, Woodpecker, Wryneck.

## THE URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL OF PORTSLADE-BY-SEA.

Section Thirty-eight. "Nothing in this section shall prejudicially affect the right of owner or occupier of premises by virtue of section twenty-two of the Public Health Act, 1875, or section eighteen of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1890."

## PART IV.

Section Fifty-nine. "Nothing in this section shall apply to a public or circulating library which is not within the district."

## PART VI.

Section Seventy-six. "Nothing in this section in relation to powers of the local authority shall prejudicially affect any prohibition or restriction which applies or would otherwise apply, except so far as subsection (4) of this section otherwise allows, by virtue of any conveyance, grant, agreement or other instrument with respect to a public park or pleasure ground."
