WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of Anglesey) Order, 1912.

Dated 14th February, 1912.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the Council of the Administrative County of Anglesey, I hereby make the following Order:—

*Title.*

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of Anglesey) Order, 1912."

BIRDS.

*Close Time for Certain Birds varied.*

II. The period during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Act of 1880 shall be varied throughout the Administrative County of Anglesey so far as concerns the undermentioned birds, so as to be between the last day of February and the 1st day of October in any year:—

Auk, Avocet, Bee-eater, Bittern, Cornish Chough, Cuckoo, Curlew or Whaup, Stone Curlew (Thick-knee), Dotterel, Dunlin (Ox Bird), Ploverspage, Purre or Sea Lark), Fulmar, Gannet or Solan Goose, Godwit, Grebe, Greenshank, Guillemot (Marrot, Murra, Scout or Willock), Gull or Seamew (except Black-backed Gull), Hoopoe, Kingfisher, Kittiwake or Tarrock, Loon or Diver, Merganser, Nightingale, Nightjar (Night-Hawk, Goat-Sucker, Fern Owl), Oriole, Owl, Oyster Catcher, Petrel, Phalarope, Puffin (Coulterneb or Sea Parrot), American Quail or Colin, Razorbill, Redshank, Reeve or Ruff, Roller, Sanderling, Sandpiper (Summer Snipe), Shearwater, Sheldrake, Skua or Bonxie, Smew, Spoonbill, Stint, Stonehatch, Tern or Sea Swallow, Tystey, Whimbrel, Woodpecker.

*The Goldfinch protected during the whole of the Year.*

III. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Pro-
