**W**HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter fifty, and of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and twenty-four, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the eighteenth day of January, in the year one thousand nine hundred and twelve, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her late

Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter fifty, and of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and twenty-four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting an exchange of one undivided moiety of the patronage of the benefice (being a vicarage) of Weston-upon-Trent, situate in the county of Stafford and in the diocese of Lichfield, for one undivided moiety of the patronage of the benefice (being a vicarage) of Berkswich (otherwise Baswich), situate in the said county and diocese.

"Whereas one undivided moiety of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Weston-upon-Trent is vested in the Right Reverend and Honourable Augustus, now Bishop of Lichfield, in right of his See.

"And whereas one undivided moiety of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Berkswich (otherwise Baswich) is vested for an estate in fee simple in possession free from incumbrances in the Very Reverend William Ralph Inge, Doctor in Divinity and Dean of the Cathedral Church of Saint Paul in London.

"And whereas the said Augustus, Bishop of Lichfield, and the said William Ralph Inge have respectively signified to us their

desire that the patronage of the said two benefices of Weston-upon-Trent and Berkswich (otherwise Baswich) may be re-arranged by way of exchange in the manner which is hereinafter recommended and proposed.

"And whereas we have made due inquiry and calculation as to the circumstances and relative value of the said two benefices and of the patronage thereof respectively, and we do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council that the circumstances and present values of the said two benefices are as set forth in the Schedule hereunto annexed.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the said Augustus, Bishop of Lichfield, acting as such Bishop (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and affixed thereto his episcopal seal) and with the consent of the said William Ralph Inge (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the undivided moiety of the advowson or

perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Weston-upon-Trent and the church thereof now vested in the said Augustus, Bishop of Lichfield, in right of his See, shall be assigned and transferred to and shall become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time and at all times be exercised by the said William Ralph Inge, his heirs and assigns for ever, and that in exchange for the same the undivided moiety of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Berkswich (otherwise Baswich) and the church thereof now vested in the said William Ralph Inge shall in like manner and upon and from the same date be assigned and transferred to and shall become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time and at all times be exercised by the said Augustus, Bishop of Lichfield, and his successors in the same bishoprick for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

five, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the eighteenth day of January, in the year one thousand nine hundred and twelve, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter forty-nine; of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-seven; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now

humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church called Christ Church, Llanelly, situate in the new parish (sometime district) of Saint Paul, Llanelly, in the county of Carmarthen and in the diocese of Saint David's.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church called Christ Church, Llanelly, situate as aforesaid.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend John, Bishop of Saint David's (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said new parish of Saint Paul, Llanelly, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church called Christ Church, Llanelly, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Christ Church, Llanelly.'

"And with the like consent of the said John, Bishop of Saint David's (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said church called Christ Church, Llanelly, situate as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us the said Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in Your Royal Wisdom, shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The district chapelry of Christ Church, Llanelly, being:—All that part of the new parish (sometime district) of Saint Paul, Llanelly, in the county of Carmarthen and in the diocese of Saint David's, which is bounded upon the east by the new parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Dafen, in the said county and diocese, upon the south-east and upon the south-west by the sea, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north-west and upon the north-east, by an imaginary line commencing at the southern end of the pier on the western side of the river called Afon Lliedi, and extending thence north-eastward in a straight line for a distance of ten chains and a half or thereabouts to the point where the said river is joined by the channel which connects such river with Copperworks Dock, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the said channel and of Copperworks Dock for a distance in all of twenty-nine chains

and a half or thereabouts to the wall at the north-eastern end of the said dock, and extending thence north-eastward in a straight line (thereby crossing the premises of the Llanelly Copper Works) for a distance of fifteen chains and a half or thereabouts to a point in the middle of Copperworks Road opposite to the northern end of the wall or fence forming the north-eastern boundary of the Llanelly Copper Works, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Copperworks Road for a distance of two chains or thereabouts to its junction with New Dock Road, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of New Dock Road for a distance of three chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries the line of the Great Western Railway across such road, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of one mile and thirteen chains or thereabouts to the point where it crosses the embankment near the eastern side of the Dafen River, upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Paul, Llanelly, from the said new parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Dafen."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Saint David's.

#### FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1901.

In pursuance of section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for the Home Department proposes, at the expiration of 40 days from the publication of this notice, to make an Order under section 116 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, applying the provisions of that section, with modifications, to non-textile factories and workshops which are ship-building yards, so far as concerns the work of persons employed in the building or repairing of a ship. The Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch, dated the 7th February, from His Majesty's Ambassador at Constantinople, stating that the following decisions were taken at a meeting of the Constantinople Board of Health held on the 6th February:—

1. The medical visit in force against Ineboli was suppressed.

2. The medical visit in force against Samsoun was also suppressed.

3. The medical visit in force against all Egyptian ports on the Red Sea and Mediterranean was suppressed.

4. The measures in force against ports in India and the Far East were modified as follows:—

Ordinary ships from Hindustan, in good sanitary condition, will undergo disinfection, application of the Rat-destruction Circular, and as many days' quarantine as are needed to complete five days from the port of departure. If they are already five days out from the Indian port, they will not be subjected to any quarantine at all. The operation of rat destruction, if applied, will not delay the granting of pratique, as it can be performed during or after the quarantine.

Ordinary ships from ports in the Far East, with foul bills of health, will be subject to the same régime; if with clean bills of health, they will get pratique after a favourable medical visit in the first port where there is an Officer of Health.

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated the 12th February, from the Chilean Minister in London, stating that the Government of Chile has issued a Decree, dated the 26th December, comprising the following regulations, to be observed in connection with the sanitary condition of ships and coast navigation:—

1. "The only diseases submissible to quarantine and resulting in the sanitary treatment of ships in the ports of the Republic are bubonic plague, cholera and yellow fever."

2. "In the case of anyone travelling on board a ship suffering from leprosy, tracoma, or any other chronic contagious disease, the ship will be received and allowed to communicate freely with the shore, provided that the sick person, be he either passenger or belonging to the crew, is strictly and satisfactorily isolated on board, not allowed to land, and his personal belongings disinfected."

3. "Ships arriving at Chilean ports with persons suffering from beri-beri will not be submitted, owing to this sole disease among its passengers or crew, to any sanitary measures whatsoever, thus permitting the ship to communicate freely with the shore."

4. "With regard to the sanitary treatment of infected ships, or ships suspected of infection coming from the North, the sanitary and harbour doctors of the different ports of the

Republic will act in strict accordance with the directions given by the chief of the Sanitary Station at Arica, complying with what has been set forth in previous Decrees."

To the County Council of West Sussex:—  
And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that, within any limits or place referred to in regulations made by Us, the Local Government Board, with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour;

And whereas the County Council of West Sussex, having made application to Us to make a Regulation in pursuance of the said sub-section putting the above-mentioned provisions of that sub-section in force within the limits comprising certain roads or parts of roads within the Parish of Petworth, in the County of West Sussex, We directed a Local Inquiry to be held into the matter by one of Our Inspectors, and the Inquiry was held accordingly, and Report has been made to Us thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, We do, by this Our Order, make the following Regulations:—

ARTICLE I.—The provisions of sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Act with respect to the driving of a motor car at a speed not exceeding ten miles per hour shall apply and have effect within the limits comprising the roads or parts of roads within the said Parish which are specified in the Schedule hereto.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the Twenty-sixth day of February, One thousand nine hundred and twelve.

**SCHEDULE.**

The road extending from the southern extremity of Hampers Common, along North

Street, Church Street, Back Road, Park Road and Pound Street to a point in Station Road 100 yards south of its junction with the road from Petworth to Midhurst;

So much of the road from Petworth to Fittleworth (including Angel Street) as extends from its junction with East Street to a point 50 yards east of the entrance to the Roman Catholic Chapel;

Lombard Street, Market Place (including all the streets immediately adjoining the Town Hall), New Street, Saddler's Row, Damers Bridge, Golden Square and East Street; and

### THE PUBLIC HEALTH ACTS AMENDMENT ACT, 1907.

To the Rural District Council of Sedgfield:—

And to all others whom it may concern.

**W**HEREAS the Rural District Council of Sedgfield (hereinafter referred to as "the Local Authority"), have, in pursuance of section 3 of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1907"), applied to Us, the Local Government Board, to declare Part V and certain sections of other parts of the Act of 1907 to be in force in certain contributory places within the Rural District of Sedgfield (hereinafter referred to as "the District");

And whereas proof has been given to Our satisfaction of the advertisement required by sub-section (2) of section 3 of the Act of 1907, and at least one month has elapsed after the date of that advertisement:

Now therefore, in the exercise of Our powers in that behalf, We by this Order declare, specify, and direct as follows, that is to say:—

ARTICLE I.—(1) On and after the day on which this Order comes into operation,—

(a) Sections 18, 20, 22, 23, 24, 27, 28, 29, 30, 31, 32, and 33, comprised in Part II; sections 34, 35, 36, 37, 38, 44, 45, 46, 49, and 50, comprised in Part III; sections 52, 53, 54, 55, 56, 57, 58, 59, 60, 61, 62, 63, 64, 65, 66, and 67, comprised in Part IV; and Part V of the Act of 1907 shall be in force in the several contributory places within the district;

(b) Section 25, comprised in Part II; and sections 39, 40, 41, and 42, comprised in Part III of the Act of 1907 shall be in force in the contributory places of Chilton, Cornforth, Ferryhill, and Trimdon, within the District.

(2) Where a section to which reference is made in the first column of the Schedule to this Order is a section comprised in Part V, or is one of the sections by sub-division (1) of this Article, described as comprised in Part II, Part III, or Part IV, and declared to be in force, the section, in any contributory place in which it is by sub-division (1) of this Article declared to be in force, shall be in force, subject to the following conditions and adaptations; that is to say:—

Unless and until We, by a further Order made on such application and after compliance with such requirements as are

described and set forth in section 3 of the Act of 1907, otherwise declare, specify, and direct, the said section, in its application to the contributory place and in relation to the exercise of the powers and to the discharge of the duties of the Local Authority under that section, shall have effect as if the words and figures set forth in the second column of the said Schedule opposite to the reference to that section in the first column of that Schedule were added to and formed part of the section.

ARTICLE II.—Within the period of three weeks immediately following the date of this Order, or, where in Our opinion the circumstances so require, within such later period as We by Order prescribe, the Local Authority shall cause this Order to be published by advertising the same once at least in one or more of the newspapers circulating in the District, and shall also cause a statement of the effect of this Order to be published in the London Gazette.

ARTICLE III.—This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-seventh day of March, one thousand nine hundred and twelve.

#### PART II.

Section Twenty-seven. “(7) Nothing in this section shall apply to any temporary building erected or set up for use by the Territorial Force.”

Section Thirty-eight. “Nothing in this section shall prejudicially affect any power or right exercisable by or attaching to an owner or occupier of premises by virtue of section twenty-two of the Public Health Act, 1875, or of section eighteen of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1890.”


