STOUR AND ORWELL.

A line drawn straight from the Tower, in Walton-on-the-Naze, in the county of Essex, to the seaward extremity of Landguard Point, in the county of Suffolk.

Provided that nothing in the said Order shall apply to any wild duck decoy, for the time being used as such, or any pond used in connection therewith, in the said portion of the said Administrative County or in any of the foregoing parishes.

Eggs.

Certain Eggs protected throughout the Administrative County.

VI. The taking or destroying of the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of East Suffolk:—

Hedge Accentor (Hedge Sparrow), Avocet, Bittern, Cirl Bunting, Great Bustard, Buzzard, Chiffchaff, Crane, Tree Creeper, Crossbill, Dotterel (Stone-runner), Sheld Duck, Dunbird, Dunlin (Ox Bird, Plover's Page, Purre, Sea Lark), Peregrine Falcon, Pied Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher, Garganey (Summer Teal), Goldcrest (Golden-crested Wren), Goldfinch, Great Crested Grebe, Little Grebe or Dabchick, Harrier, Hobby, Hoopoe, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Wood Lark, Magpie, House Martin, Sand Martin, Nightjar (Goat Sucker, Night Hawk, Fern Owl), Nightingale, Nuthatch, Oriole, Owl, Oyster Catcher, Meadow Pipit (Titlark), Rock Pipit, Tree Pipit, Kentish Plover, Pochard, Rail, Raven, Lesser Redpoll, Redshank, Redstart, Reeve, Robin, Sandpiper (Summer Snipe), Shoveller, Snipe, Stint, Stonechat, Stone Curlew (Norfolk Plover, Thick-knee), Stonehatch (Ringed Plover), Swallow, Swift, Teal, Tern (Sea Swallow), Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), Long-tailed Tit, Woodpecker, Grey Wagtail, Pied Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail, Blackcap Warbler, Dartford Warbler, Garden Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Marsh Warbler, Reed Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Willow Warbler, Wood Warbler, Wheatear, Whinchat, White-throat, Lesser Whitethroat, Woodcock, Wren, Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snake Bird), and (after April 20th in each year) Lapwing (Pewit or Green Plover), and Redshank.

Repeal of former Order.

VII. The Order of the 20th October, 1909, is hereby repealed.

SAWBRIDGEWORTH FAIRS.
