

vious notice of their intention in that behalf, have, under the provisions of the Burial Act, 1853, made a representation to His Majesty in Council, stating that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new burial ground in the civil parish of Eglwysilan aforesaid, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, should be prohibited, and that burials should be discontinued therein, as follows, viz. :—

EGLWYSILAN.—Forthwith and entirely in the Aion Baptist Church, Tongwynlais, in the parish of Eglwysilan, in the county of Glamorgan; and in the burial ground attached thereto, except as follows :—

(a) In any walled grave now existing in the said burial ground burial may be allowed of the body of the widow or widower of the person heretofore buried in such grave, subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b) In any earthen grave now existing in the said burial ground and being enclosed with a kerb or railing, or having a monument upon it, the burial may be allowed of the body of the widow or widower of the person heretofore buried in such grave, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council, on the 8th day of April next.

And His Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the parish affected by such representation one month before the said 8th day of April.
