His Majesty the KING has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal of the First Class to Albert Opie and the Edward Medal of the Second Class to William Kemp under the following circumstances:-

On April 26th, 1911, three men employed at the East Pool and Agar United Mines at

Camborne were descending to their work and were accidentally lowered into an accumulation of water, which was known to exist, but had greatly increased during the previous night without the knowledge of the management. Two of the men, who were on the outside of the skip, jumped off; but the man who was inside was drowned. One of the two survivors caught hold of a ladder and managed to climb up the shaft to safety, while the other held on to an air pipe, but was afraid to jump across the intervening space to the ladder. On the alarm being given, Opie immediately came down the shaft to try and get this man out; but failed to reach him. Accompanied by Kemp, he then descended another shaft and travelled along a cross cut to the shaft where the man was hang-This cross cut was nearly filled with water, which was constantly rising, and at one point actually touched the roof. Opie, at the risk of his life, plunged under the water, came up on the other side, and made his way to the shaft where the man was hanging. He succeeded in bringing him out by dragging him through the water in the cross cut. Kemp did not go under water, but stayed in a position of considerable danger to maintain a light while

the man was being brought out.

TRADE BOARDS ACT, 1909.

In accordance with Regulations made under section 18 of the above Act, by the Board of Trade, and dated 27th April, 1910, the Trade Board established under the above Act for that branch of the Box Trade in Great Britain which is engaged in the making of Boxes or parts thereof made wholly or partially of Paper, Cardboard, Chip or similar material, have given notice as required by section 4 (3) of the above Act, that they have fixed minimum time-rates for the trade of making Boxes or parts thereof made wholly or partially of Paper, Cardboard, Chip or similar material as follows:—

(a) For female workers in a factory or workshop not being a domestic workshop, 3d. an hour.

(b) For female homeworkers, including workers in a domestic workshop, 3d. an hour.

The above rates are to come into force on 11th March, 1912, and are to apply to all female workers in the respective classes as specified above (excepting all female learners as defined by the Trade Board) who are during the whole or part of their time employed in the making of Boxes or parts thereof as aforesaid or in any branch or process thereof, but shall not apply to any female workers who are merely employed in work incidental or ancillary thereto.

The above Trade Board have also given similar notice that they have fixed the following minimum time-rates for female learners (as defined by them):—

The minimum (or lowest) time-rate for learners under 14 years of age shall be 4s. a week, and on reaching the age of 14 they shall be entitled to the amounts shown in Column 1 above as if they had commenced at 14.

The above rates are weekly rates based on a week of 52 hours, but they shall be subject to a proportionate deduction or increase according as the number of hours actually spent in any week by the learner in the factory or workshop is less or more than 52.

FINANCE ACT, 1911.

Regulations under Section 10.

BRITISH WINES.

- The Commissioners of Customs and Excise, in pursuance of the powers vested in them by section 10 of the Finance Act, 1911, hereby prescribe the following Regulations, which are to be observed on and after the first day of April, 1912.
- 1. A Manufacturer for sale of British Wines or Sweets or Made Wines (hereinafter referred to as British Wine) must not

(a) mix any British Wine with any Foreign Wine, except in the course of manufacture; or

(b) in course of manufacture mix with any British Wine any Foreign Wine in any quantity exceeding the proportion of fifteen gallons of Foreign Wine to one hundred gallons of British Wine; or

(c) mix any spirits with any British Wine except for the sole purpose of fortifying the wine.

- 2. Every Manufacturer for sale of British Wine must, on sending out any British Wine, enter in the Entry Book obtained by him from the Officer of Customs and Excise the following particulars, that is to say:—
 - (a) the name and address of the person to whom wine is sent out; and
 - (b) the quantity and description of the wine sent out; and
 - (c) the date when the wine is sent out.

The entries must be made before the expiration of the day on which the wine is sent out, and are additional to the entries required to be made in the book pursuant to the regulations made on the 8th day of August, 1906, under sub-section (2) of section 7 of the Revenue Act, 1906.

- 3. A Dealer in or Retailer of Foreign Wine or British Wine must not
 - (a) mix for sale any Foreign Wine with any British Wine; or
 - (b) sell or expose for sale any British Wine which contains Foreign Wine in any quantity exceeding the proportion of fifteen gallons of Foreign Wine to one hundred gallons of British Wine; or
 (c) sell or expose for sale any British Wine

(c) sell or expose for sale any British Wine to which spirits have been added except for the sole purpose of fortifying the wine.

4. A Rectifier or Compounder of spirits must not mix any British Wine with any spirits either for the manufacture of British Compounds or for any other purpose.

5. A Dealer in or Retailer of spirits must not mix any British Wine with any spirits except for the sole purpose of colouring or fining the spirits.

6. British Wine manufactured in conformity with these Regulations must not, by reason of the admixture therewith of Foreign Wine, be sent out or sold or exposed for sale, otherwise than under the designation of a British Wine. Dated this 8th day of March, 1912.

Any provision of Chapter I of the Foreign Animals Order of 1910 which relates to an animal brought from a port in a scheduled country shall apply in like manner to a foreign animal brought from a port in a country which is not a scheduled country, if the animal since it was taken on board at that port has entered a port in a scheduled country.

(2.) It shall not be lawful to land in Great Britain, except under the authority, and subject to the conditions, of a licence granted by the Board, cattle, sheep, goats or swine taken from the United Kingdom, the Channel Islands, or the Isle of Man into a port in a scheduled country.

Amendment of Article 45 of the Foreign Animals Order.

2. Article 45 of the Foreign Animals Order of 1910 is hereby revoked, and the following. Article shall be substituted therefor:—

"45.—(1.) This Order shall not, except where otherwise expressly stated, apply in relation to animals brought from the Channel Islands or the Isle of Man.

"(2.) Chapters 1 and 3 of this Order shall not apply to an animal the landing of which at a Foreign Animals Quarantine Station has been approved by the Board under the Foreign Animals (Quarantine) Order of 1896.

Short Title and Construction.

3. This Order may be cited as the Foreign Animals (Amendment) Order of 1912, and shall be read with the Foreign Animals Order of 1910.
