With reference to the Notice published in the London Gazette of January 26th last, His Majesty's Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has received a telegram from His Majesty's Ambassador at Rome, stating that an official notification from the Italian Government, dated the 6th inst., declares an extension of the blockade of the Ottoman Red Sea littoral, from the 8th inst., from Ras Isa to a point of the coast north of Loheia, situated 15° 40' north latitude and 42° 43' longitude east of Greenwich.

A period of five days, dating from the commencement of the blockade, will be allowed to neutral ships within which to leave places now blockaded. Neutral vessels proceeding to the sanitary station at Kamaran in connection with pilgrims to Mecca will be able to approach the island by a passage from the southern side under the supervision of the blockading squadron.

MOTOR CARS.

Use of Motor Cars on Highways.

THE MOTOR CARS (USE AND CONSTRUCTION) (SCOTLAND) ORDER, 1912. DATED MARCH, 30, 1912.

In pursuance of the powers given to me by the Motor Car Acts, 1896 and 1903, and by any other statutes in that behalf, I, the undersigned, His Majesty's Secretary for Scotland, do hereby make the following Regulations applicable to Scotland, with respect to the use of motor cars on highways and the conditions under which they may be used, viz.:—

under which they may be used, viz.:—

1. Article IV of the Motor Cars (Use and Construction) (Scotland) Order, 1904, shall, from and after the fifteenth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and twelve, have effect as if there were added as Regulation No. (7) of that Article the following Regulation; that is to say,—

"(7) He shall not use any cut-out, fitting, or other apparatus or device, which will allow the exhaust gases from the engine of the motor car to escape into the atmosphere without first passing through a silencer, expansion chamber or other contrivance, suitable and sufficient for reducing as far as may reasonably be practicable the noise which would otherwise be caused by the escape of the said gases:

"Provided that this Regulation shall apply only to a motor car propelled by an internal combustion engine and shall not

extend to a motor cycle.

- 2. Where in any Order under the Motor Car Acts, 1896 and 1903, applicable to Scotland, the Motor Cars (Use and Construction) (Scotland) Order, 1904, is referred to, such reference shall be deemed to mean and include a reference to the said Order as amended by this Order.
- 3. This Order may be cited as "The Motor Cars (Use and Construction) (Scotland) Order, 1912."

part of the section.
