In the Matter of the Baronetcy of Turing of Foveran.

NOTICE is hereby given that, in accordance with the provisions of Clause IV of the Royal Warrant of the 8th February, 1910, the Secretary of State for the Home Department has referred to the Committee of His Majesty's Privy Council, appointed for the purposes of the said Warrant by Order in Council, dated the 5th March, 1910, a Petition presented by Mr. Robert Fraser Turing to be placed on the Official Roll of Baronets in respect of the Baronetcy of Turing of Foveran, and that the said Committee has provisionally fixed Tuesday, the 11th day of June next, for the consideration of the said Petition.

And notice is hereby further given, that any person desiring to oppose the said Petition must, not later than Monday, the 27th day of May next, give notice of his intention in that behalf to the Clerk of the Council, Privy Council Office, Whitehall, S.W., and lodge in the Privy Council Office 20 printed copies of his Case against the said Petition.
