The KING has been pleased to issue a Warrant under His Majesty's Royal Sign Manual to the following effect:—

**GEORGE, R. & I.**

GEORGE THE FIFTH, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith. To all whom these Presents may concern. Greeting:

Whereas by the Small Landholders (Scotland) Act, 1911, it is amongst other things enacted that the Chairman of the Scottish Land Court constituted by the said Act shall forthwith on his appointment have the same rank and tenure of office as if he had been appointed a Judge of the Court of Session.

And whereas it has been humbly represented unto Us that it is expedient to determine the style and title to which the Chairman of the Scottish Land Court is entitled, and also to determine the style and designation to be borne by the wife of the Chairman of the Scottish

Land Court, and to fix and define their respective places in the Scale of General Precedence in Scotland and in the Scale of Precedence for Ladies in Scotland.

Now know ye that We have ordained and declared and of Our Royal Prerogative Proper Motion and Good Pleasure do by these Presents ordain and declare that the Chairman of the Scottish Land Court shall be designated for life by the style and title of "Lord" with the prefix "Honourable," by which style and title a Judge of the Court of Session is commonly known and addressed: We do also by these Presents ordain and declare that the wife of the Chairman of the Scottish Land Court shall be entitled to assume and use the title "Lady," and to continue to use the same during the life of her husband and after his death so long as she remains a widow.

And Our further Will and Pleasure is that the said Chairman of the Scottish Land Court shall have on all occasions the place pre-eminence and precedence in Scotland accorded to a Senator of the College of Justice, taking rank amongst the Lords of Session according to seniority of appointment: and that the wife of the Chairman of the Scottish Land Court shall in like manner have the precedence

accorded to wives of Knights Bachelor and wives of Senators of the College of Justice who take precedence amongst themselves according to the dates of their husbands' creation as Knights or appointment as Senators of the College of Justice respectively.

Our Will and Pleasure therefore is that Lyon King of Arms, to whom cognisance of matters of this nature in Scotland doth properly belong, do see this Order observed and kept, and do cause the same to be recorded in the Lyon Office in Edinburgh, to the end that Our Officers of Arms there and all others upon occasion may take full notice and have knowledge thereof, and for so doing this shall be his Warrant.

All Officers, whether on the active or retired lists of the Royal Navy and the Royal Marines, of whatever rank, will communicate with and obtain their cards from the Private Secretary to the First Lord of the Admiralty. All Civil Officers of the Admiralty will follow the same rule.

All Officers, whether on the active or retired lists, of the Army, Special Reserve, Militia, Territorial Force, Yeomanry, or Volunteers, of whatever rank, except those on the Indian and Colonial Establishments, will communicate with and obtain their cards from the Private

Secretary to the Inspector-General at the Horse Guards, Whitehall, but Officers of the Household Cavalry or the Brigade of Guards should communicate with the Lord Chamberlain at St. James's Palace.

All Officers of the Indian Civil Service and of the Indian Army, of whatever rank, whether on the active or retired lists, will communicate with and obtain their cards from the Private Secretary to the Secretary of State at the India Office, Whitehall.

His Majesty the King has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal of the First Class to Henry Merritt, a fireman, and to the widow of Thomas Stokes, a miner, under the following circumstances:—

An underground fire broke out, on the 14th December, 1911, in the intake airway of the No. 9 Cannock Chase Colliery, which rendered necessary the withdrawal of all the workmen. Most of the men, including Merritt and Stokes, reached the shaft safely, but it was found that five were still in the pit. Merritt went with Stokes to their rescue, and penetrated 800 yards along the return airway, in spite of the smoke, which was rapidly increasing in density, and found the men. One of them got out by holding on to Merritt, but the other four were suffocated, and Stokes also lost his life. Merritt did not at first discover that the other men had not followed him, and when he became aware of this he made two further attempts to reach them, but was finally driven back by the smoke, and reached the surface in an exhausted condition.

In the Matter of the Railway and Canal Traffic Act, 1888, and of an application by the London and North Western Railway Company for a warrant authorising the abandonment of certain portions of the Shropshire Canal.

## WARRANT OF ABANDONMENT.

Whereas by section 45, sub-section (1), of the Railway and Canal Traffic Act, 1888, it is enacted that where, on the application of a Canal Company, it appears to the Board of Trade that any canal or part of a canal belonging to the applicants (hereinafter referred to as an "unnecessary canal") is at the time of making the application unnecessary for the purposes of public navigation, the Board of Trade may by warrant signed by their Secretary authorise the abandonment by the existing proprietors of such unnecessary canal. And by sub-section (2) of the same section it is enacted that in the case of an unnecessary canal no warrant of abandonment shall be granted unless the Board of Trade are satisfied:—

(a) That it is unnecessary for the purposes of public navigation;

(b) That the application has been expressly authorised by a resolution of a majority of the shareholders of the Canal Company owning the canal present and voting at an extraordinary or special general meeting of that Company;

(c) That such public and other notices of the application have been given as the Board of Trade may require;

(d) That compensation has been made to

all persons entitled to compensation by reason of the proposed abandonment of the canal:

And whereas by virtue of section 46 of the above mentioned Act the expression "Canal Company" in the hereinbefore recited section includes a "railway and canal company" so far as relating to any canal of any such last mentioned company:

And whereas by a public Act of Parliament 28 Geo. 3, c. 73, a company was incorporated by the name of "the Company of Proprietors of the Shropshire Canal Navigation," and was empowered to make and maintain "a navigable canal," herein called the Shropshire Canal, "from the canal at Donnington Wood, in the county of Salop, to or near a place called Southall Bank, and from thence by two several branches to communicate with the River Severn, one near Coalbrook Dale and the other near Madeley Wood, in the said county, and also certain collateral cuts to join such canal":

And whereas the Shropshire Canal was made accordingly and was vested in the London and North Western Railway Company by virtue of the London and North Western Railway (Additional Powers) Act, 1861, and an Agreement dated the 25th March, 1857, scheduled to that Act:

And whereas the London and North Western Railway Company on the 5th day of October, 1905, made application to the Board of Trade pursuant to the hereinbefore recited section 45, sub-section (1), of the Railway and Canal Traffic Act, 1888, for a warrant authorising the abandonment of the undermentioned portions of the Shropshire Canal on the ground that the same were unnecessary for the purposes of public navigation within the meaning of the said section, namely, the inclined plane communicating between the upper and lower portions of the canal at or near Coalport, in the county of Salop, and also the lower portion of the canal situate between the foot of the said inclined plane and the London and North Western Railway Company's Coalport station:

And whereas the Board of Trade have satisfied themselves on the matters referred to in the hereinbefore recited sub-section (2) of the said section 45 of the Railway and Canal Traffic Act, 1888:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon the Board of Trade by section 45 of the Railway and Canal Traffic Act, 1888, the Board of Trade do hereby authorise the abandonment by the London and North Western Railway Company of the aforesaid portions of the said Shropshire Canal.

And whereas John Albert Cole is a District Auditor duly appointed under the provisions of the Statutes in that behalf:

NOW THEREFORE, We, the Local Government Board, hereby certify the appointment to the office of District Auditor of the said John Albert Cole (hereinafter referred to as "the District Auditor"), and do order and prescribe as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—It shall be the duty of the District Auditor to audit the accounts of the following Authorities and their Officers, namely,—

(1) The Guardians of the Poor of the several Poor Law Unions named in the Schedule to this Order.

(2) The Overseers of the Poor of the several parishes comprised in the said several Unions.

(3) The several other Authorities for the time being whose accounts are or may be by law subject to be audited by a District Auditor, and whose districts or the areas of whose jurisdiction are for the time being wholly situated within one or more of the said Unions, and whose accounts are not subject to audit by any other District Auditor.

(4) The Board of Management of the Walsall and West Bromwich School District.

(5) The Joint Committee appointed to exercise the powers and duties of a Burial Board by the Parish Councils of the parishes of Halesowen, Hasbury, Hawn, Lapal, Lutley, and The Hill, and the parish meetings of the parishes of Illy and Hunnington.

(6) The Joint Committee appointed under sub-section (1) of section 17 of the Light Railways Act, 1896, by the urban district councils of Brierley Hill, Quarry Bank, and Rowley Regis.

(7) Such other Authorities whose accounts are or may be by law subject to be audited by a District Auditor, and whose districts or the areas of whose jurisdiction are for the time being partly situated within one or more of the said Unions, as We may hereafter prescribe.

ARTICLE II.—The District Auditor shall audit the said accounts according to the provisions of the several Statutes and of the Orders issued by competent authority in force for the time being in that behalf, and shall perform all such duties and exercise all such powers in connection with the audit of such accounts as are prescribed and conferred by the said Statutes and Orders.

ARTICLE III.—The district in which the District Auditor shall act as Auditor, and which We hereby assign to him for the performance of his duties under this Order, shall be termed "The Warwickshire Audit District," and shall, until We otherwise prescribe, comprise the several Poor Law Unions named in the Schedule to this Order, the district of the Board of Management named in paragraph (4) of Article I. of this Order, the areas subject to the jurisdiction of the Authorities referred to in paragraphs (5) and (6) of the said Article, and the districts or areas subject to the jurisdiction of any such Authority as is mentioned in paragraph (7) of the said Article.

ARTICLE IV.—Any Order in force assigning a district to the District Auditor for the discharge of his duties or prescribing his duties, shall, on and after the date of the operation of

this Order, be rescinded, but nothing in this Order shall affect or interfere with the existing duties and powers of the District Auditor as regards any audit of which notice has already been given; or any matters or proceedings already commenced.

**ARTICLE V.—In this Order—**

The term "Overseers of the Poor" includes Churchwardens and Assistant Overseers.

**ARTICLE VI.—**This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-second day of April, one thousand nine hundred and twelve, provided that, for the purpose of the giving by the District Auditor of notices of any audit, it shall operate from the date hereof.

**MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.**
