PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter ninety-four; of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four; and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme or representation, bearing date the ninth day of May, in the year one thousand

nine hundred and twelve, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter ninety-four, of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme or representation for altering the boundaries of the new parish of Saint Paul, Worcester, of the new parish of the Holy Trinity, Worcester, and of the new parish of Rainbow Hill, all in the county of Worcester and in the diocese of Worcester.

“ Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the third day of September in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-four and published in the London Gazette on the eighteenth day of the same month a separate district for spiritual purposes was constituted out of the parish of Saint Peter, in the city and diocese of Worcester, and the said district was named ‘The District of Saint Paul, Worcester.’

“ And whereas by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the fourteenth day of September in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six and published in the London Gazette on the eighteenth day of the same month a consolidated chapelry was assigned to the consecrated church of the Holy Trinity, situate partly in the parish of Saint Martin, Worcester, and partly in the parish of Claines, both in the said diocese of Worcester, and the said consolidated chapelry was named ‘The Consolidated Chapelry of the Holy Trinity, Worcester.’

“ And whereas by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the twenty-third day of August in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three and published in the London Gazette on the following day, a separate district for spiritual purposes was constituted out of the said parish of Claines, and the said district was named ‘The District of Rainbow Hill.’

“ And whereas the said district of Saint Paul, Worcester, the said consolidated chapelry of the Holy Trinity, Worcester, and the said district of Rainbow Hill, have become new parishes of the character contemplated by the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, by the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, and by the above mentioned Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four.

“ And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint Paul, Worcester, of the said new parish of the Holy Trinity, Worcester, and of the said new parish of Rainbow Hill, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned.

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Huyshe Wolcott, Bishop of the said diocese of Worcester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme or representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and

propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme or representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint Paul, Worcester, of the said new parish of the Holy Trinity, Worcester, and of the said new parish of Rainbow Hill, shall be altered so that (firstly) all that portion of the said parish of Saint Peter, Worcester, which is described in the First Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured green shall be dissevered from such parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said new parish of Saint Paul, Worcester; (secondly) all that portion of the said parish of Saint Martin, Worcester, which is described in the Second Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured violet shall be dissevered from such parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said new parish of the Holy Trinity, Worcester; and (thirdly) all that portion of the said parish of Claines which is described in the Third Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink shall be dissevered from such parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said new parish of Rainbow Hill.

“ And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending, or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

“ The SCHEDULES to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

#### “ The FIRST SCHEDULE.

“ The territory to be dissevered from the parish of Saint Peter, Worcester, in the county of Worcester and in the diocese of Worcester, and to be annexed to the new parish of Saint Paul, Worcester, in the same county and diocese, being:—All that portion of the said parish of Saint Peter, Worcester, which is bounded upon the north-west by the said new parish of Saint Paul, Worcester, upon the north partly by the parish of Saint Martin, Worcester, and partly by the new parish of the Holy Trinity, Worcester, both in the said county and diocese, upon the east partly by the said new parish of the Holy Trinity, Worcester, and partly by the said parish of Saint Martin, Worcester, upon the south-east by the last mentioned parish, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south, and upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Saint Martin, Worcester, from the said parish of Saint Peter, Worcester, at the junction of Wyld’s Lane with Park Street, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Park Street for a distance of seven chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries Park Street across the Worcester and Birmingham Canal, and extending thence first south-westward along the middle of the

said canal for a distance of ten chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the place where the ancient City Wall meets the western side of the said canal, and extending thence first westward to and then first westward and then generally northward along the said city wall for a distance of eight chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said parish of Saint Peter, Worcester, from the said new parish of Saint Paul, Worcester.

“ The SECOND SCHEDULE.

“ The territory to be dissevered from the said parish of Saint Martin, Worcester, and to be annexed to the said new parish of the Holy Trinity, Worcester, being:—All that portion of the said parish of Saint Martin, Worcester, which is bounded upon the west by the said parish of Saint Peter, Worcester, upon the north by the said new parish of the Holy Trinity, Worcester, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the east and upon the south, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said new parish of the Holy Trinity, Worcester, from the said parish of Saint Martin, Worcester, crosses the middle of Midland Road, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Midland Road for a distance of ten chains or thereabouts to its junction with Wyld's Lane, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Wyld's Lane for a distance of ten chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said parish of Saint Martin, Worcester, from the said parish of Saint Peter, Worcester.

“ The THIRD SCHEDULE.

“ The territory to be dissevered from the parish of Claines, in the said county and diocese, and to be annexed to the new parish of Rainbow Hill, in the same county and diocese, being:—All that portion of the said parish of Claines which is bounded upon the south-east partly by the said new parish of Rainbow Hill and partly by the new parish of Saint George, Claines, in the said county and diocese, upon the west and upon the north-west by the new parish of Saint Stephen, Barbourne, in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the north, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Stephen, Barbourne, from the said parish of Claines, at the centre of the bridge which carries Bilford Lane across Barbourne Brook, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Bilford Lane for a distance of fourteen chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries such lane across the Worcester and Birmingham Canal, upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Claines from the said new parish of Rainbow Hill.”

And whereas drafts of the said scheme or representation have been transmitted to the patrons and to the Incumbents of the cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such scheme or representation, and such patrons and Incumbents have with the exception hereinafter mentioned respectively signified their assent thereto.

And whereas the Incumbent of the vicarage of the said new parish of Saint Paul, Worcester, has not signified his assent to the said scheme or representation.

And whereas a period of more than two calendar months has elapsed since a draft of the said scheme or representation was transmitted to such Incumbent, and he has not made any objection to the said scheme or representation.

And whereas the said scheme or representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme or representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Worcester.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the Dockyard Ports Regulation Act, 1865, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council from time to time, by Order in Council, to define the limits of a Dockyard Port for the purposes of that Act, and to make regulations in relation to any Dockyard Port for all or any of the purposes in the said Act particularly mentioned, and for such other purposes as from time to time seem necessary, with a view to the proper protection of His Majesty's vessels, dockyards, or property, or to the requirements of His Majesty's Naval Service.

And whereas by the same Act it is also enacted that in relation to any Dockyard Port it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council from time to time, by Order in Council, on the joint recommendation of the Admiralty and the Board of Trade, to make rules concerning the lights or signals to be carried or used, and the steps for avoiding collision to be taken by His Majesty's vessels and other vessels navigating the waters of the port and of the approaches thereto.

And whereas in pursuance of the said Act certain regulations were made by Order in Council, dated the 17th of January, 1912, with reference to the Dockyard Port of Dover.

And whereas it appears expedient to repeal the said Order in Council and regulations and to substitute therefor this Order and the regulations and rules contained in the First and Second Schedules hereto respectively.

And whereas the provisions of section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the powers in this behalf by the said Act or otherwise in Him vested, and so far as regards the rules contained in the Second Schedule hereto, on the joint recommendation of the Admiralty and the Board of Trade, by and

with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

#### PRELIMINARY.

1. This Order shall take effect from one calendar month from the date hereof.

2. On this Order taking effect the said Order of the 17th January, 1912, shall cease to operate, and in lieu of the regulations thereby made the regulations and rules set forth in the First and Second Schedules to this Order are hereby made and shall have effect in relation to the Dockyard Port of Dover.

3. In this Order, and in the Schedules hereto, unless the context shall otherwise require, the terms "vessel" and "master" shall have the same meaning as in the said Dockyard Ports Regulation Act, 1865, and the term "the Dockyard Port" shall mean the Dockyard Port of Dover as described in paragraph 4 hereof.

#### DESCRIPTION OF LIMITS.

4. For the purposes of the said Act and of this Order and of the Schedules hereto the terms "Dockyard Port of Dover," "Admiralty Harbour" and "Commercial Harbour" shall be defined as follows:—

##### Dockyard Port of Dover.

The term "Dockyard Port of Dover" shall mean all the waters, bays and creeks so far as the tide flows lying between the lines drawn as follows:—

On the east a line drawn south true through a point on the shore at high-water mark situated 400 yards N. 57° E. true, from the root of the Eastern Arm.

On the west a line drawn south true through a point on the shore at high-water mark situated 400 yards S. 77° W. true, from the root of the Admiralty pier.

On the south a line drawn east and west, true, through a point situated 870 yards south, true, from the flagstaff in Archcliffe Fort.

##### Admiralty Harbour.

The term "Admiralty Harbour" shall mean that portion of the Dockyard Port which is enclosed by the Eastern Arm, Detached Mole and Prince of Wales' Pier, and by lines joining their extremities.

##### Commercial Harbour.

The term "Commercial Harbour" shall mean that portion of the Dockyard Port which is enclosed by the Admiralty Pier, Admiralty Pier Extension, and Prince of Wales' Pier, and by a line joining the extremities of the last two mentioned piers.

#### DELINEATION OF LIMITS.

5. On the chart accompanying this Order are drawn all the limits of the Dockyard Port, the Admiralty Harbour, and the Commercial Harbour respectively.

#### PENALTIES.

6. Any infringement of the regulations contained in the First Schedule hereto shall render the person infringing liable to the penalty prescribed in clause 12 of the said Schedule.

#### LOCAL AUTHORITIES.

7. Nothing in this Order shall affect the authority of the Harbour Board for Dover under the Acts of Parliament relating to them.

#### FIRST SCHEDULE.

##### REGULATIONS.

1. The Admiralty Harbour shall, subject to the provisions of clause 4 of this Schedule, be for the exclusive use of His Majesty's ships, and no merchant or other private vessel shall, without permission from the King's Harbour Master, anchor or lie in it.

2. No merchant or other private vessel shall, without licence in writing from the King's Harbour Master, be moored or fastened to any Government moorings, buoys, piles or vessels in the Dockyard Port.

3. The berths alongside the Admiralty Pier Extension eastward of the position of the old head of that pier are to be cleared whenever required for His Majesty's Service.

4. As far as practicable a fairway will be kept through the Admiralty Harbour for vessels passing between the eastern entrance of the Admiralty Harbour and the Commercial Harbour.

5. Moorings for His Majesty's ships, mark buoys, and other aids to navigation, and such other buoys as may be required for any purpose in connection with naval or military operations may be placed by the King's Harbour Master in such positions as he may from time to time consider the requirements of His Majesty's service demand.

6. No person shall lay moorings for private vessels in the Dockyard Port without the permission in writing of the King's Harbour Master, and all such moorings shall be in such positions as the King's Harbour Master shall deem fit, and shall be forthwith removed on the requisition of the King's Harbour Master to that effect.

7. If at any time the anchor of any merchant or other private vessel hooks any Government moorings, or any electric cables, or moorings of buoys, the master or other person having the charge or command of such vessel shall not proceed to unhook the same, but shall forthwith give notice thereof to the senior naval officer, or to the King's Harbour Master, in order that aid may be given for clearing such moorings or cables without doing damage to the same.

8. No merchant or other private vessel shall make fast to, or lie at, any of the buoys marking the channels or shoals in the Dockyard Port.

9. No vessel other than His Majesty's ships shall use the eastern entrance to the Admiralty Harbour between one hour after sunset and one hour before sunrise, without the special authority of the King's Harbour Master.

10. No ballast, stones, sand, earth, clay, refuse, ashes, rubbish, dust, filth of any description, nor refuse from any quarry, mine, or pit, nor any other matters solid or liquid whatsoever shall be unladen, cast or allowed to fall into the waters of the Dockyard Port except in such places as may be appointed by the King's Harbour Master, or upon the banks or any portion of the shore of the said Dockyard Port

where the same may be liable to be washed into the waters of the said Dockyard Port by rain, tide or otherwise.

11. No vessel shall anchor in the approach to the eastern or western entrance to the Admiralty Harbour in such a position as to obstruct the free passage of any vessel through either of these entrances.

12. The master of every merchant or other private vessel to which this Order relates shall observe and cause to be observed the said regulations in this Schedule as far as they relate to his vessel, and if any master or other person acts in any respect in contravention of any of the said regulations, or fails to observe or to cause the same to be observed, he shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding the sum of ten pounds.

## SECOND SCHEDULE.

### RULES.

1. When any seagoing steamship, steam vessel towing, steam dredger or steam hopper, within the limits of the Dockyard Port (excluding the Commercial Harbour) shall, by reason of the crowded nature of the anchorage or from other cause, find it unsafe or impracticable to keep out of the way of a sailing vessel, or of a boat under oars or sail or steam or other mechanical power, she shall signify the same to the sailing vessel or boat by four short blasts of the steam whistle, blown in rapid succession, when the sailing vessel or boat shall keep out of the way of the other vessel; provided always that the latter shall be navigated with due care and at a moderate speed.

2. When one of His Majesty's ships or any other vessel in charge of His Majesty's officers intends to pass in or out of the Admiralty Harbour through the eastern entrance she shall hoist the Union Flag superior to Commercial Flag J (blue white blue horizontal) at the foremast-head, and all other of His Majesty's ships present in the port shall hoist the Pilot Jack superior to Commercial Flag J as a general warning, and the same signal shall also be hoisted on the flagstaff on the Eastern Breakwater for the same purpose: and all other vessels under way in the harbour or in the approach to the eastern entrance outside the harbour, shall keep out of the way of the said ship flying the Union Flag superior to Commercial Flag J; provided always that the said ship shall be navigated with due care and at a moderate speed.

3. Outgoing steamers shall have priority of passage through the eastern entrance to the Admiralty Harbour over incoming steamers, and incoming steamers shall not approach the eastern entrance to the Admiralty Harbour within a distance of half a mile until it shall have been ascertained that no vessel is coming out.

4. When one of His Majesty's ships or any other vessel in charge of His Majesty's officers intends to pass in or out of the Admiralty Harbour through the western entrance she shall hoist the Union Flag at the foremast-head, and all other of His Majesty's ships present in the port shall hoist the Pilot Jack as a general warning. The Union Flag shall not, however, be so hoisted when other vessels are using or are about to use the western entrance as indi-

cated by signal at the Commercial Harbour Master's flagstaff, except in cases of emergency, when priority of passage shall be given to His Majesty's ships or other vessels in charge of His Majesty's officers. All other vessels, under way in the harbour or in the approach to the western entrance outside the harbour, shall keep out of the way of the said ship flying the Union Flag; provided always that the said ship shall be navigated with due care and at a moderate speed.

5. Should a vessel sink or become a wreck in any part of the Dockyard Port, so that an obstruction in a navigable fairway is caused which in the opinion of the King's Harbour Master it is necessary to mark, such vessel or wreck will be indicated by the following marks or lights, exhibited from the wreck itself or from a wreck-marking craft.

*By Day:*—Three balls on a yard 20 feet above the sea, two placed vertically at one end and one at the other, the single ball being on the side nearer the wreck.

*By Night:*—Three white fixed lights similarly arranged, but not the ordinary riding lights.

If the obstruction is not considered by the King's Harbour Master of sufficient importance to be marked both by day and night, a green buoy only will be used with the word "wreck" on it in white letters.

6. The speed of all merchant and private vessels inside the Admiralty Harbour is not to exceed six knots.

NOTE.—The master of every merchant or other private vessel to which the rules in this Schedule relate must observe and cause to be observed the provisions of these rules as far as they relate to his vessel, and any such master by his wilful default infringing or causing any infringement of any of the provisions of these rules is guilty of a misdemeanour.

WHEREAS by section 659 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894 (which is a section in Part XI of that Act and which re-enacts similar provisions by the said Act repealed of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1854) it is (among other things) enacted that His Majesty may by Order in Council fix the establishments to be maintained by each of the General Lighthouse Authorities on account of the services of lighthouses, buoys, and beacons, or the annual or other sums to be paid out of the Mercantile Marine Fund in respect of those establishments, and that an increase of any establishment or part of an establishment so fixed shall not be made without the consent of the Board of Trade:

And whereas by section 1 of the Merchant Shipping (Mercantile Marine Fund) Act, 1898, it is (among other things) provided that references in Part XI of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, to the Mercantile Marine Fund shall be construed as references to the General Lighthouse Fund by the now reciting Act constituted:

And whereas His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales acting under the authority of a Commission of His late Majesty dated the 5th day of March, 1910, by Order in Council dated the 22nd day of April, 1910, was pleased to fix the establishment which might be maintained by the Commissioners of Irish Lights and the amount of the salaries to be paid to the officers of the said establishment:

And whereas it is expedient that the establishment of the said Commissioners should be varied in manner hereinafter appearing:

And whereas it has been made to appear to His Majesty that the Board of Trade have consented to such variation of the establishment:

Now, therefore, His Majesty by virtue of the power vested in Him by the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, and of any other powers Him thereunto enabling, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, is pleased to fix as follows, that is to say:—

(1.) The maximum salary payable to the clerk whose salary was by the Schedule to the said Order in Council dated the 22nd day of April, 1910, fixed at £290, rising by annual increments of £15 to £350, shall from the date of this Order be £370 per annum.

(2.) The number of Lower Grade Clerks on the establishment of the Commissioners of Irish Lights and named in the Schedule to the said Order in Council dated the 22nd day of April, 1910, shall from the date of this Order be increased to four, and the increments of salary payable to such Lower Grade Clerks after the same date shall, in lieu of the increments specified in the said Schedule, be as follows, viz.: £7 10s. per annum until the salary reaches £125 per annum, and £10 per annum thereafter, until the maximum salary of £250 per annum has been reached, and Lower Grade Clerks appointed before the date of this Order shall receive the increments above mentioned from the date in each case at which the last annual increment became due in ordinary course; but the increase of such salaries shall be only granted on a certificate by the Commissioners of Irish Lights that the preceding period of the officer's service has been distinguished by zeal, industry and regularity.

And His Majesty, by virtue and in further exercise of the powers so vested in Him as aforesaid, and by and with the advice aforesaid, is further pleased to fix and doth hereby fix that the salaries payable under the provisions of this Order shall be paid out of the General Light-house Fund.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 23rd day of May, 1912, in the words following, viz.:—

“Whereas by section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is en-

acted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, and other allowances in the nature thereof; payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an officer, seaman or marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions; and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas by Your Majesty's Order in Council bearing date the 8th day of August, 1911, it is provided, *inter alia*, that the Medical Officer in charge of the medical duties of a ship of war at sea with a complement of not less than 650 officers and men shall receive charge pay at the rate of 3s. 6d. a day:

“And whereas we consider that charge pay should be granted in certain cases which are now excluded by the requirement that the actual complement of the ship should be not less than 650:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the grant of charge pay at the rate of 3s. 6d. a day, as from the first day of July, 1911, in the following cases, viz.:—

“(1) To the Senior Medical Officer of any sea-going parent ship where the combined complements of parent ship and tenders exceed 650 officers and men:

“(2) To the Senior Medical Officer of ships conveying reliefs where the numbers actually borne exceed 650:

“(3) To the Medical Officer of Your Majesty's Yacht ‘Victoria and Albert.’

## COUNTY OF SOUTHAMPTON.

## BOROUGH OF BASINGSTOKE.

To the county council of Southampton;—  
And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 9  
of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter re-  
ferred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that,  
within any limits or place referred to in regu-  
lations made by Us, the Local Government  
Board, with a view to the safety of the public,  
on the application of the local authority of the  
area in which the limits or place are situate, a  
person shall not drive a motor car at a speed  
exceeding ten miles per hour;

regulation in pursuance of the said sub-section

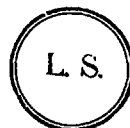
