#### PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the Burial Act, 1855, it was, amongst other things, enacted that it should be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, from time to time to postpone the time appointed by any Order in Council for the discontinuance of burials, or otherwise to vary any Order in Council made under any of the Acts recited in the said Act, or under the said Act (whether the time thereby appointed for the discontinuance of burials thereunder, or other operation of such Order, should or should not have arrived), as to His Majesty, with such advice as aforesaid, might seem fit:

And whereas an Order in Council was made on the 8th day of June, 1854, directing the discontinuance of burials in, amongst other places, the burial ground of the Cathedral of Norwich:

And whereas Orders in Council were made on the 8th February, 1855, the 21st July, 1855, the 7th December, 1855, the 30th January, 1856, the 2nd February, 1857, the 22nd February, 1860, the 21st March, 1862, the 3rd May, 1882, and the 6th February, 1892, varying the said Order in Council of the 8th June, 1854:

And whereas it seems fit to His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, that the said Order in Council of the 8th day of June, 1854, as varied by the above-mentioned Orders in Council should, in so far as it affects burials in the burial ground of the Cathedral of Norwich, be further varied:

NOW, THEREFORE, His Majesty, by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the said Order in Council of the 8th day of June, 1854, so varied as aforesaid, be further varied so that, notwithstanding anything therein contained, the burial may be allowed in the burial ground of the Cathedral of Norwich of the bodies of the late Right Reverend John Sheepshanks, formerly Bishop of Norwich, and of his widow at her decease.

The Secretary of State for India in Council has appointed Messrs. James William Harris Hall, Reginald Stuart Back, and James Arthur Clarke to superintend the transfer of lascars or other persons, at Grimsby and Immingham, and to grant the certificate required under section 125 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894 (57 and 58 Victoria, cap. 60).

The fee to be paid for every lascar, or other person, in respect of whom such certificate is applied for is limited to three shillings, and in no case is the total amount of fees in respect of one crew to exceed five pounds.

## Civil Service Commission,

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations have been approved by the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz.:—

REGULATIONS RESPECTING BOY CLERKS REGIS-TERED FOR TEMPORARY EMPLOYMENT IN PUBLIC DEPARTMENTS.

1. Two Registers of Boy Clerks for temporary employment in Public Departments will be kept by the Civil Service Commissioners.

2. These Registers will contain the names of boys who, being either natural-born or naturalised British subjects, are certified by the Civil Service Commissioners to be of good health and character, and duly qualified under the following Regulations (3 and 4). One Register will contain the names of boys for service in London, Edinburgh, and provincial towns of England, Scotland, and Wales. The other will contain the names of boys for service in Dublin and provincial towns in Ireland.

3. The limits of age are 15 to 16. If an Examination begins in one of the first three months of any year Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first of January in that year. If an Examination begins in April or May of any year, Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first of April in that year. If an Examination begins in June, July, or August of any year, Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first of June in that year. If an Examination begins in one of the last four months of any year Candidates must be

of the prescribed age on the first of September in that year.

4. The subjects for Examination are :-

1. Handwriting and Orthography.

2. Arithmetic, including vulgar and decimal fractions.

3. English Composition.

4. Copying Manuscript.

And any three of the following, except that not more than two languages may be taken:—

5. Geography.

6. English History.

7. Latin.

8. French.

9. German.

Mathematics.
 Elementary Science.

No Candidate will be regarded as qualified who fails to obtain such an aggregate number of marks as may indicate in the judgment of the Civil Service Commissioners a competent amount of general proficiency.

5. Open Competitive Examinations for the purpose of testing the qualifications of Candidates in the above-mentioned subjects will be held by the Civil Service Commissioners from time to time as may be necessary, and a certain number, regulated by the probable demand from the Public Departments, of those who show sufficient proficiency will be placed upon the Registers kept by the Commissioners, and will be available for employment as their services are required. The Competitions for the Irish service will, as a rule, be held at the same time as the Competitions for service in Great Britain, and the list of successful Candidates for Ireland will be separate from that of the successful Candidates for service in Great Britain. Candidates can enter for both Competitions, when they are held simultaneously, paying only one fee. If successful in both they paying only one fee. If successful in both they will be entered on the Register for Great Britain only, or on that for Ireland only, or on both Registers according to their choice.

6. The fee payable for attending an Examination will be 5s.

7. Boy Clerks placed on these Registers will be summoned for employment in any of the Public Departments as they are wanted. When not wanted, they will have no claim to employment. Refusing to serve when called upon, except for reasons satisfactory to the Civil Service Commissioners, they will be The order in removed from the Registers. which they may be employed, the Departments to which they may be assigned, and their retention generally on the Registers, will be determined by the Civil Service Commissioners; but they will be subject to the orders of the Departments in which they are serving during the time of their actual employment, and will be liable to dismissal from them by the authorities thereof, without notice, for inefficiency or misconduct

Boy Clerks resigning, or procuring their own discharges from Departments, except for sufficient reasons proved to the satisfaction of the Civil Service Commissioners, will be removed from the Registers.

Their assignment for service will, as a general rule, be according to their order of merit in the Examination; but exceptions to this general rule may be made when the engagement offered is very short, or for other sufficient reasons. 8. Boy Clerks will usually be engaged and paid by the week of 39 hours, viz.:—7 hours a day on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays, and 4 hours on Saturdays; and they will be paid 15s. per week during the first year of their service. After a year of approved service, an increase of pay to 16s. a week may be allowed.

16s. a week may be allowed. In any case of absence without pay a Boy Clerk's increment shall be postponed one day for every day of such absence,—absence without pay equally with the interval between two successive engagements not being reckoned as service for any purpose contemplated by the Regulations.

Boy Clerks may also be engaged and paid by the hour at the rate of  $4\frac{1}{2}$ d. per hour during their first year of service; and at the rate of 5d. per hour thereafter. Any who may be engaged by the week and who may be required to attend for more than  $7\frac{1}{2}$  hours on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, or Friday, or more than  $4\frac{1}{2}$  hours on Saturday, will be paid at the hourly rate for the overtime attendance in excess of the normal attendance for such day. But in no case must overtime attendance exceed 6 hours in any one week. They may also be paid by the Civil Service Commissioners, with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of the Treasury.

9. No service in the capacity of Boy Clerk will confer any claim to superannuation or compensation allowance; and Boy Clerks will not be retained, as such, after they shall have reached the age of 18<sup>\*</sup>; subject to the follow-ing provisos: ---(1) Boy Clerks who have had no opportunity of entering a Competition for Assistant Clerkships after reaching the age of  $17\frac{1}{2}$  may be retained until the next Competition takes place and, provided they enter the Competition, until the announcement of the result and for not more than one month after-(2) Boy Clerks who reach the age of wards. 18 after entering a Competition for Assistant Clerkships may be retained until the announcement of the result and for not more than one month afterwards. (3) A Boy Clerk who has been declared successful in a Competition for Assistant Clerkships may be retained as a Boy Clerk until he is assigned to a vacant post as Assistant Clerk, unless he be rejected by the Civil Service Commissioners as not duly qualified in respect of age, health, or character for the permanent situation.

10. If a public holiday, on which the office is closed, fall within the period of a Boy Clerk's engagement, he may be paid in respect of it as for a working day. Boy Clerks may, with the consent of the Department in which they are serving, or if not at the time serving, with the consent of the Civil Service Commissioners, be allowed holidays, with full pay in the proportion of 12 days a year. No Boy Clerk shall be allowed to take more than 12 days' leave under these conditions between the 1st day of January and the 31st day of December.

Holiday pay can only be allowed for holidays actually taken, not for days on which the Boy Clerk is drawing pay in respect of employment in any capacity in the Public Service.

11. Boy Clerks who may fall ill while serving in any Department, and whose illness may be

\* Boy Clerks who have entered the service on the results of the competition of September 22, 1908, or any previous competition, may be, as hitherto, retained on the Register up to the age of twenty. attested by medical certificate to the satisfaction of the authorities of such Department, may be allowed sick-leave, receiving three-fourths of the rate of pay for the official day; provided that no Boy Clerk shall be paid for sick-leave for more than 24 days within any one year, exclusive of public holidays, except in cases of severe illness, when sick-leave, at the threefourths rate of pay, may be allowed for a further period, not exceeding 12 days, making a total of not more than 36 days in all in any one calendar year.

12. Except in conformity with Regulations 10, 11, 14, and 15, Boy Clerks will only receive pay for the hours, or parts of hours, during which they actually attend.

13. Persons who have entered upon or completed a course of education or training for the occupation of teacher, on account of which grants are payable from the Exchequer, are not eligible for employment as Boy Clerks until the consent of the Board of Education in England, the Committee of Council on Education for Scotland, or the Commissioners of National Education, Ireland, as the case may be, given in conformity with rules sanctioned by the Lords of the Treasury, has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

14. If any case of infectious disease should occur in the house where a Boy Clerk is living, he must immediately report the fact to the officer under whom he is employed, and must, if required, at once discontinue his attendance. In cases of such enforced absence from his employment, it is in the discretion of the Head of the Department in which he has been serving to allow the Boy Clerk full pay at the usual rate for the period for which it is medically certified that his attendance at the office would be likely to be dangerous to his colleagues.

15. In any year in which an open Competition for situations as Assistant Clerk (Abstractor Class) in the Civil Service, for situations as Officer of Customs and Excise or for Clerkships of the Second Division is held, a Boy Clerk who obtains from the Head of the Department in which he is serving leave of absence to attend such Examination may also, at the discretion of the Head of the Department, be allowed pay, at the usual rate, for the days during which he is attending the Examination.

16. Service Marks for each full period of three calendar months of actual approved service in the capacity of Boy Clerk, subject to a maximum of eight such periods\*, will be allowed to Candidates attending Examinations for the situations of

Clerk in the Second Division of the Civil Service,

Officer of Customs and Excise,

who are serving or have served as Boy Clerks, provided they shall have rendered not less than six months' approved service in that capacity; but the number of marks to be allowed for each period may be different at successive Examinations.

17. In the promotions of permanent Civil Servants [Assistant Clerks (Abstractor Class) and others] under Clause 45 of the Order in Council of 10th January, 1910, not less than

\* Boy Clerks who have entered the service on the results of the competition of September 22, 1908, or any previous competition will, as hitherto, be allowed to reckon twelve such periods for service marks. one year's and not more than two years' approved service as Boy Clerk may be allowed to reckon towards the six years' established service required by the said clause.

#### PORT OF LONDON.

OTICE is hereby given, that the Port of London Authority propose to make the following bye-laws:

## BYE-LAWS for the protection, preservation and regulation of the fisheries within the limits of the Port of London.

The Port of London Authority, in exercise of the powers and authority vested in them by the Thames Conservancy Act, 1894, as amended by the Port of London Act, 1908, and of every other power them thereunto enabling, do make the following bye-laws, that is to say:-

#### Former Bye-laws repealed.

1. All bye-laws, rules and orders for the protection, preservation and regulation of the fisheries within the limits of the Port of London, for the time being in force, so far as the same apply to the river as hereinafter defined, shall, after these present bye-laws have been confirmed by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, be, and the same are hereby, repealed.

#### Short Title and Commencement of Operation of Bye-laws.

2. These bye-laws may be cited as "The Port of London Fishery Bye-laws, 191," and shall come into operation the day after the same are confirmed by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.

#### Interpretation.

3. In these bye-laws the words and expressions hereinafter mentioned shall have the meanings hereby assigned to them respectively, unless there be something in the subject or context repugnant to such construction, namely :-

expression "the Port Authority" The means the Port of London Authority. The expression "the river" means and in-

cludes so much of the River Thames as defined by the Thames Conservancy Act, 1894, as amended by the Port of London Act, 1908, within the limits of the Port of London, as defined by the last mentioned Act, as is above or to the westward of an imaginary straight line drawn from the entrance to Yantlet Creek, in the county of Kent, to the City Stone opposite to Canvey Island, in the county of Essex. The word "person" includes a corporation,

whether aggregate or sole. The word " court " means any court of summary jurisdiction, whether consisting of two or

more justices or a stipendiary magistrate. The expression "fishing" includes includes eel, oyster, and shell fishing. The word "fish" includes eels, shrimps,

crabs, lobsters, crayfish, oysters and shell fish, and the spat, spawn, brood, ova or fry of cels, shrimps, crabs, lobsters, crayfish, oysters, shell fish or fish. The word "vessel" includes any ship, barge,

lighter, keel, launch, houseboat, pleasure or other boat, randan, wherry, skiff, dingey, shallop, punt, cance, yacht, raft, float, float of timber, or craft whatever, whether navigated by steam or otherwise. The word "fisherman" means any person

whose name is registered under the provisions of these bye-laws as a fisherman or as the

owner of a vessel used for fishing or let for hire for fishing on the river.

Words importing the masculine gender shall include females, and words in the singular shall include the plural, and words in the plural shall include the singular.

#### Application of Bye-laws.

4. Except when the application of any bye-law is expressly limited to any specified part of the river or to any specified class of fish or mode of fishing, the same shall be applicable to the river as defined by the last preceding. bye-law and to every class of fish and mode of fishing.

#### Instruments for Fishing.

5. No person shall use any instrument, net, or apparatus for taking fish except the following:

(1) (a) A rod and line.
(b) A landing net with a diameter not exceeding two feet and a depth not exceeding three feet from the ring to the bottom of the net and having not more rows of knots than seventy-two to the linear yard. (c) A minnow net with a diameter not ex-

ceeding three feet in any part thereof.

(d) A hand or well net with a diameter not exceeding twelve inches in any part thereof and a depth not exceeding eighteen inches and a handle not exceeding twentyfour inches in length.

(e) A grig wheel with a diameter not exceeding six inches.

(f) A gaff hook.
(2) (a) A trim-tram or fore-beam net with a weighted beam not exceeding twenty-one feet in length and a mouth of a total circumference not exceeding sixty feet, measuring, in each of the sides, and of a length not exceeding thirty feet from the beam to the extreme end of the cod of the net and having not more rows of knots than ninety-six to the linear yard.

(b) A trawl net with a beam not exceeding thirty feet in length and of a length not exceeding seventy-five feet from the beam. and having not more rows of knots than ninety-six to the linear yard.

(c) A flounder net not exceeding ninetysix feet in length, measured along the head rope, and nine feet in depth and having not: more rows of knots than thirty to the linear yard.

(d) A drag net not exceeding three hundred feet in length measured along the head rope and having for one hundred feet measured along the head rope from each end thereof not more rows of knots than sixty to the linear yard and for the remaining one hundred feet measured along the head rope which shall join the said two portions of one hundred feet measured from each end not more rows of knots than seventy-two to the linear yard. (e) A hand line.

And no person shall use any instrument, net. or apparatus specified in sub-clause (2) of this. bye-law in the river above London Bridge.

#### Measurement of Nets.

6. All measurements of nets referred to in: these bye-laws shall be made when the net is wet.

## Rod and Line and Hand Line.

7. No person shall fish with a rod and line or a hand line excepting with a natural or artificial bait and in a proper manner, and no person shall fish with more than two rods and lines at the same time or in such manner as to take fish with a rod and line or a hand line otherwise than by hooking them in the mouth.

#### Landing Net and Gaff Hook.

8. No person shall use a landing net or a gaff hook except a person angling with a rod and line, or an assistant to such person, for the purpose of landing a fish already hooked.

#### Minnow Net.

9. No person shall fish with a minnow net except a person angling or about to angle in the river, or his servant or agent, for the purpose of obtaining minnows for bait for fishing in the river.

#### Grig Wheel.

: 10. No person shall lay or place any grig wheel near any dam or weir.

#### Drag Net.

11. No person shall fish with a drag net except for the purpose of taking smelts.

#### Injury of Fish.

12. No person shall use any tackle or device which does not admit of the fish taken therewith being returned to the water without serious injury.

#### Fixed Net.

13. No person shall fix or attach any net to the soil or make the same stationary in any way, and a net held by any person on any vessel, or attached thereto when moored or anchored upon the river, shall be deemed to be a fixed net for the purposes of this bye-law.

#### Nets at mouths of Tributaries.

14. No person shall place in the river at the mouth of any river, creek, backwater or brook communicating with, or running into, the river, or at any mill sluice, race or branch of the river any net or device which might stop or catch fish or impede the free movement of the same into, out of, or up or down, the river.

#### Close Season for Salmon, &c.

15. No person shall fish for, take, or attempt to take, salmon or salmon-trout between the 1st day of September and the 31st day of March following, both inclusive, and no person shall fish for, take, or attempt to take, trout or char between the 11th day of September and the 31st day of March following, both inclusive.

#### Close Season for Smelts.

16. No person shall fish for, take, or attempt to take, smelts between the 25th day of March and the 27th day of July following, both inclusive.

#### Close Season for Lampreys and Lamperns.

17. No person shall fish for, take, or attempt to take, lampreys or lamperns between the 1st day of April and the 24th day of August following, both inclusive.

#### Sizes of Fish.

18. No person shall take in or out of the river, or have in his possession or expose for sale on the river or the shore or banks thereof, or on any land adjoining or near thereto, any fish of the species hereinafter mentioned of less than the sizes and dimensions hereinafter specified, that is to say:—

and all shrimps so taken shall be sifted, when alive, through a wire sieve with spaces onequarter of an inch between the wires, all of which shall be placed either vertically or horizontally, and all shrimps that will pass through such sieve shall be returned alive to the water

such sieve shall be returned alive to the water. Provided that this bye-law shall not apply:—

(a) To any person who takes any undersized fish unintentionally and at once returns the same to the water with as little injury as possible, and

(b) To any roach, dace, gudgeon, bleak or minnows, taken for use as bait for fishing in the river. Provided that except for the purpose of baiting grig wheels no person shall be entitled to have in his possession or under his control at any one time more than 50 of such fish for use as bait, or to take by himself, his servants or agents, more than 50 of such fish on any one day.

#### Undersized Fish.

19. Any person who shall have in his possession in, upon, or about the river, or upon or about the banks or towing paths thereof, or any land adjoining or near thereto, any fish of less dimensions than those specified in the last preceding bye-law shall be deemed to be guilty of an offence against such bye-law unless he prove to the satisfaction of the court before which he is tried that he was lawfully in the possession of such fish. Provided that this byelaw shall not apply to a person in charge of a boat entering Hadleigh Ray in order to land, at Leigh, fish which have not been taken from the river.

#### Registration of Fishermen.

20. No person shall follow the business of a fisherman on the river, or let for hire any vessel to be used on the river for fishing, unless his name and address be registered in a book kept for that purpose by the Port Authority and such registration shall be renewed annually on the 15th day of March. Provided that

where a person whose registered address is not in the county of Essex or Kent has caused his name and address to be registered, either by the Port Authority or the Conservators of the River Thames, and a certificate thereof is in force, his registration by the other of those authorities shall not be required.

For the purposes of this bye-law the Port Authority and the Conservators of the River Thames may respectively, during office hours, inspect the register of fishermen kept by the other, and shall afford to one another all reasonable information in regard thereto.

#### Regulations for Registration.

21. Every person applying to the Port Authority for registration as required by byelaw 21 shall be subject to the following regulations:—

(a) He shall furnish to the Port Authority particulars in writing of his name, address and occupation.

(b) On the registration of his name and address he shall pay a fee of one shilling and a further fee of one shilling in respect of each vessel; but on renewal of such registration on or before the date of the expiration thereof no fee shall be payable.

(c) The name of every such vessel and the name of the owner thereof and his registration number shall be painted white on a black ground in capital letters not less than three inches long and proportionately broad on the bows of such vessel except in cases where such vessel is so constructed that the name thereof and the name of the owner thereof and his registration number cannot be conspicuously displayed without risk of obliteration on the bows thereof in which cases such names and numbers shall be painted as aforesaid on some part of such vessel so that the same shall always be conspicuously displayed without risk of obliteration and to the satisfaction of the Port Authority and their officers.

(d) On failure to comply with any of the provisions of this bye-law, in addition to any other penalty, his registration shall, on conviction, be cancelled.

Provided that this bye-law shall not apply to any vessel already marked in accordance with any law or regulation in force on the river.

#### Fish, &c., for Scientific Purposes.

22. Nothing in these bye-laws shall prevent any person, with the previous consent in writing of the Port Authority, under their Common Seal, for the purpose of artificial propagation and other scientific purposes, from obtaining fish from any part of the river, or from having in his possession salmon roe or trout roe, or from taking, or attempting to take, salmon or trout when spawning or near the spawning beds.

The following bye-laws, Nos. 23 to 27 inclusive, shall apply only to so much of the river as is situate above London Bridge.

#### Number of Baits.

23. No person shall fish with a rod and line having more than three separate baits attached thereto.

#### Close Season.

24. No person shall take, or attempt to take, any fish between the 15th day of March and the 15th day of June following, both inclusive. But this bye-law shall not prohibit any person from taking, or attempting to take, trout between the 31st day of March and the 15th day of June following, both inclusive. Provided that no bait shall be used for that purpose other than an artificial fly, or spinning or live bait.

#### Night Fishing.

25. No person, when on any vessel upon the river, shall fish for, take, or attempt to take, any fish between the expiration of the first hour after sunset and the last hour before sunrise.

#### Preservation and Incubation.

26. No person shall, in either of the hereinafter specified parts of the river, which are staked and marked out for the preservation and incubation of fish, that is to say:—

The part of the river at Richmond between Richmond Bridge and Buccleuch House, a distance of seven hundred yards or thereabouts; and the part of the river at Twickenham between the upper end of the lawn at Pope's Villa and the Island at Cross Deep a distance of four hundred yards or thereabouts,

do, or attempt to do, or aid or assist or attempt to aid or assist in doing, any of the following things:—

(a) Take up, remove, injure, or destroy, any stake, burr, boat, punt, or any other thing placed for the protection of fish or for the purpose of impeding fishing.

(b) Disturb the preserves, in this byelaw specified, or any spawning bed or place to which fish resort before, during, or after spawning.

(c) Fish for, take, or attempt to take, fish by any mode whatsoever except with a rod and line.

Provided that any fisherman may use, in the said preserves, grig wheels for the purpose of taking eels during the time such grig wheels may be lawfully used.

#### Trailing.

27. No person, on any vessel under way upon the river, shall draw, or cause or suffer to be drawn, in the direction in which such vessel is proceeding, any line with hook or bait attached thereto whether such line be attached to a rod or otherwise.

#### Penalty.

28. Any person acting in contravention of these bye-laws shall, for every such act, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5, and shall, on the direction of the court, forfeit any net, engine, device, apparatus or fish, found in his possession or control. Every such penalty shall be recoverable, enforced and applied according to the provisions of the Thames Conservancy Act, 1894, and the Port of London Act, 1908. 015

## Illegal Instruments.

29. If any net, engine, apparatus or device, the use of which is prohibited by these byelaws, or if any fish, during the time at which the capture of the same is prohibited, or of a size less than that permitted to be taken by these bye-laws, is found in the possession or under the control of any person on the river, or on the shore thereof, or on any lands adjoining to or near the river, such person shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these byelaws unless he prove to the satisfaction of the court before which he is tried that the same was legally in his possession or under his con-And if any such net, engine, apparatus, trol. device or fish has been lawfully seized the court may, either before or after such trial, order the same to be destroyed, but without prejudice to the infliction of a penalty on, or any other remedy against, the person charged.

#### Saving.

30. Notwithstanding anything contained in these bye-laws the following persons, that is to say:—

Henry Pearce, of 3, Thames Road, Chiswick,

Thomas Odell, of 9, Church Walk, Chiswick,

Moses Gibson, of 31, Felsham Road, Putney,

Henry Brown, of 133, Devonshire Road, Chiswick,

James Brown, of 199, Devonshire Road, Chiswick,

may use, in that part of the river which is between Isleworth Church Ferry and London Bridge, the following nets, that is to say:—

(a) A flew or stream net not exceeding ninety-six feet in length, measured along the head rope, and having not more rows of knots than twenty-four to the linear yard.

(b) A seine or draft net not exceeding ninety-six feet in length, measured along the head rope, and having not more rows of knots than thirty to the linear yard.

(c) A blay net not exceeding seventyeight feet in length, measured along the head rope, and having not more rows of knots than thirty-six to the linear yard.

(d) A smelt net not exceeding ninety-six feet in length, measured along the head rope, and having for thirty feet measured along the head rope from each end thereof, not more rows of knots than sixty to the linear yard, and for the remaining thirty-six feet, measured along the head rope, which shall join the said two portions of thirty feet measured from each end, not more rows of knots than seventy-two to the linear yard.

(e) A flounder net.
