HARROW-ON-THE-HILL URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL.

To Their Most Gracious Majesties King George V and Queen Mary.

May it please your Majesties—

We, the Members of the Urban District Council of Harrow-on-the-Hill, on behalf of our fellow-townsmen, respectfully beg to offer a most loyal and hearty welcome on the occasion of your Majesties' first visit to our town.

Cherishing as we do a grateful remembrance of the visits of your Majesties' Illustrious Predecessors, we are proud to think that the welfare of our town and of its ancient school is an object of your Majesties' kindly interest.

We rejoice to have this opportunity of expressing our dutiful allegiance and our fervent hope that your Majesties may long continue to reign in peace and prosperity over the vast Empire of which it is our privilege to form a part.

To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious answer:—

The Queen and I thank you most heartily for your loyal Address of welcome. It is with great pleasure that We visit for the first time your beautiful town and its historic school, in which many of our greatest and most distinguished citizens have passed their early years. We are confident that in the future, as in the past, Harrow School will furnish men well qualified to serve and to adorn Our Empire.

We shall continue to watch the prosperity of your town and school with added interest, as a result of to-day's visit.

On their Majesties' arrival at the school the following Address was presented:—

HARROW SCHOOL.

To the King's Most Excellent Majesty.

May it please your Majesty,—

We, the scholars of the Ancient School of Harrow, founded in the year 1571 by a Royal Charter granted to John Lyon by Queen Elizabeth, beg leave humbly to approach your Majesty and your Royal Consort on the occasion of this your gracious visit to our school, and to offer you in the name of all its mem-

bers, the governors, masters, scholars, and former scholars, a most loyal and respectful welcome.

We number, Sir, among our cherished records the four visits of your Royal Father and Mother in the years 1864, 1871, 1894, and 1905. Their latest visit must always hold a special place in our traditions.

It may interest your Majesties to learn that the day you have kindly appointed for your own visit is already among the brightest in the annals of Harrow; for it was on June 15th, in the year 1871, that, with great rejoicings, the school celebrated its three hundredth birthday. From that historic festival some of our chief buildings date their origin, including the Speech Room, in which at this hour we have the high honour to present our homage to your Majesties in person.

Henceforth June 15th will live yet more brightly in the memories of Harrovians, as recalling the gracious presence of King George and Queen Mary.

If we may turn for a moment to events in the reign of your Majesties, there are two which have in a special manner stirred our hearts as Harrovians; one that at the solemn Coronation of your Majesties, amid the prayers and blessings of your peoples, the hand which placed the crown on the heads of your Majesties was the hand of a Harrow Archbishop; and again, that the predecessor of your Royal uncle as Viceroy of Canada was a distinguished son of Harrow, who during seven years had won in an eminent degree the love and respect of that great and growing Dominion.

We hope it is not too late to tender humbly to your Majesties our most respectful congratulations on your happy return from your auspicious journey to India, where so many millions of devoted subjects found fresh cause to bless and venerate your names.

During those eventful weeks, when the daily words and acts of your Majesties were followed with eager interest throughout your Empire, it was a proud satisfaction to us to reflect that the Viceroy and the Secretary of State for India who were in attendance on your Majesties were also our own school-fellows.

We would offer our prayer to God that your Majesties may long be spared to reign over a loyal people and a united Empire, and we trust that in the future, as in the past, Harrow men will always be found ready, in Church and State, at home and abroad, to show themselves faithful servants of the Crown.

To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious Answer:—

The Queen and I are delighted by your welcome to Us on Our first visit to Harrow, and We thank you for your loyal Address and for your congratulations on Our return from Our visit to My Indian Empire.

We remember the pleasure which My beloved Father and Mother derived from their visits to you; and, like them, We take a deep interest in the welfare of this historic school, and We are glad that Our coming on this day recalls your commemoration in 1871 of the

grant of the Royal Charter to John Lyon, of Preston, three hundred years before. You have legitimate cause for pride that in those centuries your school has grown steadily in honour and renown.

I know well the distinguished part played by Harrovians in all paths of civic and national life. Byron, Palmerston, Peel, and Dalhousie are but a few of the famous names written in the annals of your school. I am certain that in the future, as in the past, men who owe to Harrow their early training will not be "the last nor the faintest" in the great work of governing and defending the Empire. This generous tradition lays on you and on your successors the high duty of fitting yourselves to follow in their steps. By turning to good account not only your studies and discipline, but also the liberty you so largely enjoy, you are preparing yourselves to do good and strenuous service to your King and country, be it "twenty or thirty or forty years on."

REGULATIONS dated the 19th June, 1912, made by the Commissioners of Customs and Excise under Section 14 of the Copyright Act, 1911.

The Commissioners of Customs and Excise in pursuance of the powers vested in them by section fourteen of the Copyright Act, 1911, hereby prescribe the following Regulations which are to be observed on and after the first day of July, nineteen hundred and twelve:—

1. 2. Any notice in regard to any book or other printed work in which copyright subsisted on the 30th day of June, nineteen hundred and twelve, which was given to and accepted by the said Commissioners on or before that day pursuant to section forty-two of the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, or section one of the Revenue Act, 1889, shall for a period of twelve months from the first day of July, nineteen hundred and twelve, if the copyright so long subsists be treated as a notice given under section fourteen of the Copyright Act, 1911, unless the notice is withdrawn or superseded or the said Commissioners require a further notice to be given.

3. The notice in writing to be given to the said Commissioners under section fourteen of the Copyright Act, 1911, by the owner of the copyright in any work (other than a book or other printed work) in which copyright subsists

under the said Act or his agent who is desirous that copies thereof made out of the United Kingdom shall not be imported into the United Kingdom may be either a general notice in the Form No. 2 in the Schedule hereto or as near thereto as circumstances permit or a special notice in the Form No. 3 in the same Schedule relating to a particular importation.

4. Every notice given in pursuance of these regulations in the Form No. 1 or No. 2 in the Schedule hereto shall be accompanied by a statutory declaration in the Form No. 4 in the same Schedule.

5. NORTHAMPTON ALLOTMENT GARDENS (SWINE FEVER) ORDER OF 1912.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Premises to which this Order applies.

1.—(1.) This Order shall apply to the premises described in the Schedule hereto, and

also to any other premises in the county borough of Northampton or to any premises in the administrative county of Northampton, to which the Order may be applied by a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Board or of the Local Authority of the said borough or county, as the case may be, and served upon the occupier of the premises described in such Notice.

(2.) This Order shall cease to apply to any premises upon service on the occupier thereof of a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Board.

(3.) A copy of every Notice served under this Article shall forthwith be sent to the Board by the Inspector signing the same.

Restriction on Movement of Swine from or to Premises to which this Order applies.

2. Swine shall not, except as expressly authorised by this Order, be moved from or to any premises to which this Order applies.

Movement of Swine from Premises to which this Order applies.

3.—(1.) Swine (not being in a Swine-Fever Infected Place and their movement not being

prohibited by Notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board) may be moved from any premises to which this Order applies under and in accordance with the following provisions.

(2.) Swine may be moved to a slaughterhouse situate in the county borough of Northampton, for the purpose of immediate slaughter if accompanied by a licence in the Form D set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 authorising such movement, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of that borough.

(3.) Before a licence (Form D) is granted by an Inspector under this Article the owner of the swine, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, shall sign, and deliver or send by post to the Inspector a declaration in the Form E set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, which shall be retained by the Inspector.

(4.) The swine shall, before the movement is commenced, be marked by and at the expense of the owner by the painting with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each of the swine thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long.

(5.) Swine may also be moved from any premises to which this Order applies to any other premises if accompanied by a licence in the Form A set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 authorising such movement, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination specified in the licence is situate, but no such licence shall be expressed to be granted for movement for breeding purposes.

(6.) Before a licence (Form A) is granted by an Inspector under this Article, the owner of the swine, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, shall sign and deliver or send by post to the Inspector, a declaration in the Form B set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, countersigned as hereinafter provided.

(7.) The declaration (Form B) shall not be effective until it is countersigned by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the county borough of Northampton or the county of Northampton, as the case may be, who, before countersigning the declaration, shall, so far as is practicable, satisfy himself as to the correctness of the statements contained therein.

(8.) The declaration (Form B) shall be retained by the Inspector granting the licence thereon.

(9.) Swine moved with a licence (Form A) under this Article shall not, for a period of twenty-eight days after arrival at the place of destination specified in the licence, be moved from such place of destination, except as hereinafter provided.

(10.) Where swine are moved with a licence (Form A) to a market, fairground or saleyard, specified in the licence, the swine shall be moved from such premises only if accompanied by a licence in the Form C set forth in the First

Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the market, fairground or saleyard is situate and only to a slaughterhouse specified in the licence, or to the premises from which the swine were moved to the market, fairground or saleyard.

(11.) Swine required by this Article to be detained for a period of twenty-eight days may be moved before the expiration of that period to a slaughterhouse in the same Scheduled Area if such movement is authorised by a licence in the Form C above mentioned granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the swine are detained, and the swine are accompanied by the licence.

(12.) Swine while detained under this Article shall be kept separate from all other swine.

(13.) Swine moved under this Article shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay, and where they are moved to a slaughterhouse they shall be there detained until they are slaughtered.

(14.) Licences granted under this Article shall be in force for not more than eight days inclusive of the day of issue.

(15.) No licence under the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 shall be required for the movement into a Scheduled Area for the purposes of that Order of swine which are being moved under and in accordance with a licence granted under this Article.

Cleansing and Disinfection of Vehicles used for Conveyance of Swine.

4.—(1.) Any float, cart or van which has been used for the conveyance of swine under the preceding Article, shall immediately after each occasion of such use be cleansed and disinfected by and at the expense of the person using the same for such purpose as follows:

(i.) The floor of the float, cart or van and all other parts thereof with which the swine, or their droppings, have come in contact shall be scraped and swept, and the scrapings and sweepings, and all dung, sawdust, litter, and other matter shall be effectually removed therefrom; then

(ii.) The same parts of the float, cart or van shall be thoroughly washed or scrubbed or scoured with water; then

(iii.) The same parts of the float, cart or van shall be disinfected in one of the modes prescribed by the Diseases of Animals (Disinfection) Order of 1906.

(2.) The scrapings and sweepings, and the dung, sawdust, litter, and other matter removed under this Article shall forthwith be well mixed with quicklime, and be effectually removed from contact with swine.

Movement of Swine to Premises to which this Order applies.

5.—(1.) Swine may be moved to any premises to which this Order applies if accompanied by a licence in the Form A set forth in

the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 authorising such movement, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which such premises are situate, under this Order or under the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, as the case may be. The licence shall be in force for not more than eight days inclusive of the day of issue.

(2.) Before a licence is granted by an Inspector under this Article, the owner of the swine, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, shall sign, and deliver or send by post to the Inspector, a declaration in the Form B set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, countersigned as hereinafter provided.

(3.) The declaration shall not be effective until it is countersigned by a police officer of the district where the swine are, who, before countersigning the declaration, shall, so far as is practicable, satisfy himself as to the correctness of the statements contained therein.

(4.) The declaration shall be retained by the Inspector granting the licence thereon.

(5.) The swine moved under this Article shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay.

(6.) Swine while detained on premises to which this Order applies need not be kept separate from other swine.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

6.—(1.) Any person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Copies of Movement Licences to be sent to Local Authority of Place of Destination.

7. A copy of a licence which authorises movement of swine to premises in a District other than the District for which the person granting the licence acts as Inspector shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination specified in the licence is situate.

Licences after Completion of Movement.

8.—(1.) Where swine are moved with a licence under this Order to any market, fair-ground or saleyard, the licence shall be delivered up in exchange for the licence for movement of the swine from such premises.

(2.) Where swine are moved with a licence under this Order to any premises other than a market, fair-ground or saleyard, the licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up at, or sent by post to,

the nearest Police Station in the same District by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing the movement.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

9. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

10.—(1.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If a pig is not marked as required by this Order, the owner, consignee, or other person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3.) If anything is done or omitted to be done in contravention of this Order in respect of the cleansing and disinfection of any float, cart or van used for the conveyance of swine, the person using the same for such purpose, or other person for the time being in charge of the float, cart or van shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(4.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted on any pig as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(5.) If a person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

11. In this Order—

“The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894:

“The Board” means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries:

“Swine-Fever Infected Place” means a place for the time being declared to be a Swine-Fever Infected Place under any Order of the Board:

"Slaughter-house" includes bacon-factory:

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Act of 1894.

Commencement.

12. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-fifth day of June, nineteen hundred and twelve.

banking companies, of insurance companies, of railway, canal, gas and water companies, and in general of all other joint stock companies, co-operations, associations, and other undertakings, of whatever nature or description, whether British, Colonial, or foreign; annuities; produce of every description, both home and foreign; materials of any kind, whether raw or manufactured and whether home or foreign; and on any other property, funds, and effects, of whatever kind or description, real or personal, or without security; the making of purchases, investments, sales, or any other dealings in any of the above named articles or securities; the granting and issuing of drafts, letters of credit, and circular notes, and all other documents of credit, and to make the same, or any of them, assignable free from equities; the issuing on commission and underwriting of stocks, funds, shares, debentures, debenture stock, bonds, obligations, securities, and investments of all kinds; the negotiating of loans and advances; the receiving money and valuables on deposit or for safe custody or otherwise; the collecting and transmitting moneys and securities, and the managing of property; and transacting all kinds of business which from time to time can be lawfully transacted by bankers.
