THE GOVERNMENT ANNUITIES ACTS, 1864 AND 1882.

27 & 28 Vic., c. 43. 45 & 46 Vic., c. 51.

The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that the following tables of the premiums to be charged under contracts for the grant of Government Annuities have been duly approved under the provisions of the above mentioned Acts, and will come into operation on the day of their publication in the London Gazette.

The Tables previously in force for contracts for the grant of Immediate and Deferred Annuities stand revoked from the same day, without prejudice to any Annuity granted in

accordance therewith. The grant of Deferred Annuities through the Savings Bank will be discontinued as from the same day.
