WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the twentieth day of June, in the year one thousand nine hundred and twelve, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following representation as to the assign-

ment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint John the Baptist, Tonyrefail, situate in the parish of Llantrisant, in the county of Glamorgan and in the diocese of Llandaff.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Saint John the Baptist, Tonyrefail, situate as aforesaid.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Joshua Pritchard, Bishop of Llandaff (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said parish of Llantrisant, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint John the Baptist, Tonyrefail, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Tonyrefail.'

"And with the like consent of the said Joshua Pritchard, Bishop of Llandaff (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said church of Saint John the Baptist, Tonyrefail, situate as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us the said Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in Your Royal Wisdom, shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Tonyrefail, being:—All that part of the parish of Llantrisant, in the county of Glamorgan, and in the diocese of Llandaff, which is bounded upon the north partly by the new parish of Cymmer and Porth, and partly by the new parish of Dinas and Pen-y-graig, upon the north-west by the new parish of Saint Andrew, Llwynypia, upon the west by the parish of Llandyfodwg, upon part of the south partly by the parish of Coychurch and partly by a detached portion of the parish of Llanilid, all in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the remaining part of the south and upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said detached portion of the parish of Llanilid from the said parish of Llantrisant at a point in the middle of the River Ely due west of Garth-Graban cross roads where the road leading from Tontraethwg Ford towards Lan-

Elay is joined by the road leading past the houses called Garth Hall and Garth-Graban, and extending thence in a straight line due east for a distance of one chain and a half or thereabouts to the said cross roads, and extending thence first north-eastward then southeastward and then again north-eastward along the middle of the last-mentioned road for a distance of one mile or thereabouts to its junction at Groes Heol Waun Pint with the road leading past the house called Ty'r-Heol to Tonyrefail and extending thence first northwestward and then north-eastward along the middle of the last-mentioned road for a distance of sixty-five chains or thereabouts to its junction near the said house called Ty'r-Heol with the road leading towards Treferig House and Castellau-uchaf, and extending thence first north-eastward, then eastward, and then southeastward along the middle of the last-mentioned road for a distance of thirty-four chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries the Treferig branch line of the Taff Vale Railway across such road, and extending thence first north-westward, then northward, and then again north-westward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of seventy-five chains or thereabouts to its terminus at the Glyn Colliery, and extending thence in a straight line due north (thereby passing to the east of the house called Rhiw-garn-fach) for a distance of fifty chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said parish of Llantrisant from the said new parish of Cymmer and Porth."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Llandaff.

The following Statute made by the Governing Body of Saint John's College, Oxford, on the 29th day of May, 1912 (and sealed on the 27th day of June, 1912), has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877 ":-

Ex parte the President and Fellows of Saint John's College, in the University of Oxford.

A STATUTE made to amend certain Statutes framed by the Commissioners appointed under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877 (40 and 41 Victoria c. 48), in relation to Saint John's College, in the University of Oxford, duly passed at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of the said College, specially summoned for this purpose on the twenty-ninth day of May, 1912, by the votes of not less than two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting and submitted to His Majesty the King in Council.

Whereas in Statute V, clause 1, of the Statutes of the said College it is enacted:—
"The number of Scholarships within the College shall be not less than twenty-eight, of which six shall be Open and twenty-two appropriated as hereinafter mentioned to the several schools hereinafter named. One of the Open Scholarships shall always be called the Holmes Scholarship." And in clause 2 of the same Statute:—"So soon as the amount of the Corporate Revenues will permit, the President and Fellows may, if they think fit, establish not more than six additional Open Scholarships."

And whereas it appears to us, the President and Fellows of the said College, that it is desirable that the said Statutes shall be altered and amended in manner hereinafter appearing.

Now we the President and Fellows of the said College in exercise of the powers vested in us under and by virtue of the 54th section of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, do by this present instrument under our Seal alter and amend the Statutes of the said College as hereinbefore set out in manner following, that is to say :-

In Statute V, clause 1, by substituting for the word "twenty-eight" the word "thirtyfour," and by substituting for the word "six the word "twelve."

In clause 2 of the same Statute by substituting for the word "six" the word "eight," and by adding at the end of the clause the following paragraph: "Whenever one of these scholarships shall fall vacant an election to such scholarship. election to such scholarship shall be held within a year of the day of its so falling vacant, unless it be suspended by the President and Fellows under the powers herein contained."

And by inserting after Statute VI the follow-

ing new Statute:

" Statute VIa.

" Exhibitions.

"1. A separate fund shall be established to be called the Exhibition Fund.

"2. Into this fund shall be paid:—

"(i.) Such a yearly sum not less than £600 nor more than £1,200 from the Corporate Revenues of the College as the President and Fellows may at any stated General Meeting from time to time determine, but whenever more than twelve Open Scholarships are filled up the sum annually payable into the Exhibition Fund out of the Corporate Revenues of the College shall be diminished by the amount of the annual value of such additional Scholarships, provided that the sum thus deducted shall never be more than half the total amount payable into the Exhibition Fund under this clause out of the Corporate Revenues of the College.

"(ii.) (a) The emoluments of any vacant Scholarship or of any Scholarship which has been determined under the provisions of Statute V, 13, 14, until a new election has been made to such vacant or determined

Scholarship.

"(b) The emoluments of any Scholarship which shall not have been awarded after examination owing to the want of a candidate of sufficient merit, until a new election has been made to the said Scholarship

"(c) The emoluments of any Scholarship which any Scholar may have wholly or in

part relinquished.

" (d) The emoluments of any vacant Exhibition created under the provisions of this Statute.

" 3. The annual income of this Fund (otherwise than as provided by clause (2) (i.) of this Statute) shall be applied (i.) in the creation from time to time of Entrance Exhibitions, to be awarded after examination by the President and Fellows to persons who are in need of assistance at the University without limit of age, such Exhibitions to be held under the same conditions as the Open Scholarships of the College, but for such periods as the President and Fellows may prescribe; or (ii.) in assisting such Undergraduate members of the College as the President and Fellows may deem to be in need of assistance at the University; or (iii.) as to so much thereof as may not be required for these purposes, in such manner as the President and Fellows may deem best for promoting study and improvement among the Undergraduate members of the College.'

A STATUTE to alter the Statutes framed by the Commissioners appointed under the "Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1877" in relation to Clare College in the University of Cambridge such amending Statute being duly made at a general Meeting of the Governing Body of the said College specially summoned for the purpose and held on the 25th day of May 1912 and passed at the said General Meeting by the votes of ten of the twelve persons present and voting and now submitted for the approval of His Majesty the King in Council.

We the Master and Fellows of the said College in exercise of the powers given to us by the 54th section of the said Act do hereby alter the Statutes framed by the said Commissioners in manner following, that is to say:—

By omitting in Statute 18 the first paragraph, namely, the words "The Master shall occupy that portion of the western side of the College which lies to the north of the Archway, and also the room therewith connected which is above the Library" and by substituting for these words the following words, namely:—

"The College shall provide a suitable residence for the Master."

## NATIONAL INSURANCE ACT, 1911.

PART II.

#### UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE.

Whereas on the 24th day of June, 1912, the Board of Trade gave notice, pursuant to section 113 (1) of the National Insurance Act, 1911, that they proposed to make a Special Order under section 104 of the National Insurance Act, excluding the following employments from the occupations which are to be deemed employment in an insured trade for the purposes of Part II of the Act (Unemployment Insurance):—

- (1) The drivers or attendants of any vehicle.
- (2) Stablemen or other workmen employed in tending horses or to clean any vehicle.

- (3) Woodcarvers.
- (4) Workmen employed in the manufacture and fitting of upholstery for the purpose of the construction, alteration, repair or decoration of buildings, ships, boats or other craft.
- (5) Workmen employed in the manufacture of fittings of leather or celluloid for cycles or motor cycles;

And whereas certain objections have been made with respect to the Special Exclusion Order so proposed;

And whereas the Board of Trade have duly considered these objections, and do not propose to amend or withdraw the draft Order;

Notice is hereby given, that the Board of Trade have directed an inquiry to be held with regard to the draft Order, and that they have appointed Mr. A. A. Hudson, K.C., of 5, Paper Buildings, Temple, London, E.C., to hold the inquiry and to report to them thereon.

The inquiry will be held in public in the Council Chamber at 8, Richmond Terrace, Westminster, London, S.W., commencing on the 24th July at 11 a.m. Any objector, and any other person who in the opinion of the person holding the inquiry is affected by the draft Order, may appear at the inquiry either in person or by Counsel, Solicitor or other Agent.

## MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

COUNTY OF DEVON.

Whereas by section 8 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1903"), it is enacted that the Local Government Board may by regulations made under section 6 of the Locomotives on Highways Act, 1896 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1896"), prohibit or restrict the driving of any motor cars, or of any special kind of motor cars, on any specified highway or part of a highway, which does not exceed sixteen feet in width, or on which ordinary motor traffic would, in their opinion, be especially dangerous:

DURHAM AND NORTHUMBERLAND (FOOT - AND - MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1912 (No. 5).

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power

enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

#### PART I.

### Application of Order.

1. This Order applies to the Scheduled District described in the First Schedule hereto, and hereinafter referred to as "the Scheduled District."

Division of Scheduled District into Six Zones.

2.—(1.) The Scheduled District shall for the purposes of this Order be divided into the six Zones described in the Second Schedule to this Order (hereinafter referred to respectively as Zone I, Zone Ia, Zone III, Zone III, and Zone IIIa) to which the provisions hereinafter set forth shall apply.

(2.) If any farm (except any detached part) is partly within and partly without a Zone, the whole shall be deemed to be within the Zone, and where the farm extends to two Zones the whole shall be deemed to be in the inner Zone.

#### PART II.

Prohibition of Movement in certain Prohibited Areas.

3. No animal shall be moved out of, or along, over or across a highway or thorough-fare within, any Area described in the Third Schedule to this Order (hereinafter referred to as a "Prohibited Area"), to be permitted by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon any such highway or thoroughfare, and no Movement Licence shall be granted under this Order by an Inspector of a Local Authority which would involve such movement.

### PART III.

PROVISIONS AS TO ZONES I AND IA.

Movement out of Zones I and Ia, and Movement into or within such Zones.

- 4.—(1.) No animal shall be moved out of Zone 1 or Zone Ia.
- (2.) No animal shall be moved into, or be moved along, over, or across a highway or thoroughfare within Zone I or Zone Ia except in accordance with the following provisions of this Order.
- (3.) No animal shall be allowed by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon a highway or thoroughfare in Zone I or Zone Ia.

Movement into or within Zones I and Ia for Immediate Slaughter.

5.—(1.) An animal may, subject as herein provided, be moved by railway or by vessel without a licence from premises not within any District, which is for the time being a Scheduled District for the purposes of an Order of the Board relating to Foot-and-Mouth Disease to a railway station or landing place situate within Zone I or Zone Ia; and an animal so moved may be moved from the railway station or landing place to any slaughter-house situate within the same Zone if accompanied by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the railway station or landing place is situate.

(2) An animal may, subject as hereinafter

provided, also be moved from any premises situate within the Scheduled District to any slaughter-house in Zone I or Zone Ia, if accompanied by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the first-mentioned premises are situate.

Prohibition of Markets, etc., of Animals in Zones I and Ia.

6.—No market, fair, sale or exhibition of animals shall be held in Zone I or Zone Ia.

#### PART IV.

Provisions as to Zones II and IIA.

Movement out of, into, or within Zones II and IIa.

- 7.—(1) No animal shall be moved out of Zone II or Zone IIa except to a slaughter-house in Zone I or Zone Ia, and then only in accordance with Parts III and IV of this Order.
- (2) No animal shall be moved into, or be moved along, over or across any highway or thoroughfare within, Zone II or Zone IIa except in accordance with the following provisions of this Order.
- (3) No animal shall be allowed by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon a highway or thoroughfare in Zone II or in Zone IIa.
- (4) An animal may, subject as herein provided, be moved by railway or by vessel without a licence from premises not within any District which is for the time being a Scheduled District for the purposes of an Order of the Board relating to Foot-and-Mouth Disease to a railway station or landing place situate within Zone II or Zone IIa; and an animal so moved may be moved from the railway station or landing place to any slaughter-house situate within Zones I, Ia, II, or IIa, if accompanied by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the railway station or landing place is situate.
- (5) Where an Inspector of the Local Authority considers it necessary or expedient—
  - (i) that an animal in his District should be permitted to be moved to a slaughterhouse in Zone II or Zone IIa from premises situate outside the Scheduled District or within Zones III or IIIa, or be permitted to be moved within Zone II or within Zone IIa for slaughtering, breeding, feeding or dipping purposes; or
  - (ii) that an animal in his District should be permitted to be moved within Zone II or within Zone IIa as often as occasion may require, either between different parts of the same farm, or between different farms in the same Zone;

the Inspector may authorise such movement by a Movement Licence.

Prohibition of Markets, etc., of Animals in Zones II and IIa.

8. No market, fair, sale or exhibition of animals shall be held in Zone II or Zone IIa.

## PART V.

PROVISIONS AS TO ZONES III AND IIIA.

Movement out of Zones III and IIIa.

9. No animal shall be moved out of Zone III or Zone IIIa except for the purpose of movement to a slaughter-house in the Scheduled District, and then only if accompanied by a Movement Licence granted under the previous provisions of this Order authorising such movement.

Regulation of Markets, etc., in Zones III and IIIa.

- 10. No market, fair, sale or exhibition of animals shall be held in Zone III or Zone IIIa except in accordance with the following provisions:—
  - (i) A market or sale may be held on any premises in Zone III or Zone IIIa if the Local Authority are satisfied that the market or sale will be restricted to animals intended for immediate slaughter and the market or sale is authorised by the Local Authority under this Order.

(ii) The Local Authority shall cause a Veterinary Inspector to attend at every market or sale authorised under this Order, and examine the animals exposed thereat.

(iii) An animal exposed for sale at any such market or sale shall not be moved out of the market or saleyard unless it is accompanied by a licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the market or saleyard is situate and only to a slaughter-house in the Scheduled District which shall be specified in the licence.

#### PART VI.

## GENERAL.

Provisions as to Movement Licences.

11.—(1.) Where the movement authorised by a Movement Licence granted under this Order is movement to a slaughter-house from premises in the Scheduled District other than a railway station or landing place, or is movement from a market or sale authorised under this Order, an animal shall not be moved with the Licence unless before the movement is commenced it is marked by and at the expense of the owner in manner following:

Cattle.—By the clipping of a broad arrow about six inches long on the left hind-quarter of each of the cattle and by the clipping of the hair off the end of the tail.

Sheep.—By the clipping of a broad arrow on the forehead of each of the sheep, and by the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on both sides of each of the sheep with the following composition, namely: Rosin, five parts; oil of turpentine, two parts; and blue or red ochre, one part; melted and used warm; or with some other adhesive composition of a blue or red colour.

Swine.—By the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on both sides of each of the swine with the composi-

tion above mentioned.

(2.) Where the movement authorised by a Movement Licence is movement as often as

occasion may require, either between different parts of the same farm, or between different farms, the Licence shall be marked with the words "Occupation Licence," and shall be in force until it is revoked by an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board by a Notice served on the occupier of the farm on which the animals then are.

- (3.) Every Licence shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted, the number and description of the animals authorised to be moved, and the name or description of the several premises to and from which the animals are authorised to be moved.
- (4.) Where animals are moved with a Licence under this Order, unless the Licence is an Occupation Licence, the Licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up to an officer of the Local Authority or be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station in the same District by the person in charge of the animals at the time of completing the movement.

(5.) A Movement Licence granted under this Order, except where it is otherwise expressly authorised by this Order, shall be in force for four days, inclusive of the day of issue, and shall be in the form set forth in the Fourth Schedule to this Order or to the like

effect.

- (6.) A Movement Licence granted under this Order shall not be available if granted by the owner of the animal to be moved, or by his agent, or by the consignee of the animal, or by the occupier of the farm or premises or slaughter-house from or to which the animal is to be moved, or by any individual member of an Executive Committee or Sub-Committee of a Local Authority.
- (7.) A copy of a Licence which authorises movement to premises in a District other than the District for which the person granting the Licence acts as Inspector shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination is situate.

## General Provisions as to Movement.

12. Animals while being moved with a Licence under this Order shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all animals which are not being so moved, and shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the place of destination specified in the Licence, and where the place of destination is a slaughter-house they shall be there detained until they are slaughtered.

Exception of certain Animals from Provisions as to Movement.

- Nothing in this Order shall be construed as authorising—
  - (i.) movement of an animal which is affected with foot-and-mouth disease, or which has during the preceding twenty-eight days been in any way exposed to the infection of such disease; or
  - (ii.) movement into or out of a foot-andmouth disease infected place; or

(iii.) movement of an animal the movement of which is prohibited by notice of an and twelve.

Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board.

Saving for Orders and Regulations.

14. Movement of animals with a Licence under this Order is subject to any other Order of the Board, and also subject to any Regulation made by a Local Authority under any Order of the Board for prohibiting or regulating the movement of animals.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

15.—(1.) Any person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read, and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or

other officer.

#### Offences.

- 16.—(1.) If a person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (2.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted on any animal as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

#### Revocation.

17. The Northumberland (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1912, and the Durham and Northumberland (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Orders of 1912 (Nos. 2 and 4), are hereby revoked.

#### Interpretation.

18. In this Order-

"The Act of 1894" means the Diseases of

Animals Act, 1894.

'The Board' means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.

"Animals" mean cattle, sheep, goats, and swine.

"Slaughter-house" means any premises where animals are habitually slaughtered, and includes a bacon factory.

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

#### Commencement.

19. This Order shall come into operation on the eighteenth day of July, nineteen hundred and twelve.

#### PART I.

## Application of Order.

1. This Order shall apply to the Scheduled Districts described in the Lancashire and District (Foot-and Mouth Disease) Orders of 1912 (Nos. 2 and 4) and the Yorkshire (West Riding) (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1912 (No. 4), which Districts shall form one Scheduled District for the purposes of this Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Scheduled District").

## Division of Scheduled District into Three Zones.

2.—(1.) The Scheduled District shall for the purposes of this Order be divided into the three Zones d scribed in the First Schedule to this Order (hereinafter referred to respectively as Zone I, Zone Ia and Zone II), to which the provisions hereinafter set forth shall apply.

(2.) If any farm (except any detached part) is partly within and partly without a Zone, the whole shall be deemed to be within the Zone, and where the farm extends to two Zones, the whole shall be deemed to be in the inner Zone.

## PART II.

Prohibition of Movement in certain Prohibited Areas.

3. No animal shall be moved out of, or along, over or across a highway or throughfare within, any Area described in the Second Schedule to this Order (hereinafter referred to as a "Prohibited Area"), or be permitted by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon any such highway or thoroughfare, and no Movement Licence shall be granted under this Order by an Inspector of a Local Authority which would involve such movement.

### PART III.

PROVISIONS AS TO ZONES I AND IA.

Morement out of Zones I and Ia, and Movement into or within such Zones.

- 4.—(1.) No animal shall be moved out of Zone I or Zone Ia.
- (2.) No animal shall be landed in or be moved into, or be moved along, over, or across a highway or thoroughfare within, Zone I or Zone Ia except in accordance with the following provisions of this Order.
  - (3.) No animal shall be allowed by the owner

or person in charge thereof to stray upon a highway or thoroughfare in Zone I or Zone Ia.

Movement into Zones I and Ia for Immediate Slaughter.

5.—(1.) An animal may, subject as hereinafter provided, be moved by railway or by vessel without a licence from premises not situate within any District which is for the time being a Scheduled District for the purposes of an Order of the Board relating to Foot-and-Mouth Disease or from premises situate in Zone II to a railway station or landing place situate within Zone I or Zone Ia; and an animal so moved may be moved from the railway station or landing place to any slaughter house situate within the same Zone if accompanied by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the railway station or landing place is situate.

(2.) An animal may, subject as hereinafter provided, be moved by road from any premises not situate within any District which is for the time being a Scheduled District for the purposes of an Order of the Board relating to Foot-and-Mouth Disease or from premises situate within Zone II to any slaughter-house in Zone I or Zone Ia if accompanied during the movement in Zone I or in Zone Ia, as the case may be, by a Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the premises from which the animal is to be moved are

situate.

## Movement within Zones I and Ia for Certain Purposes.

- 6. Where an Inspector of the Local Authority considers it necessary or expedient—
  - (i.) that an animal in his District should be permitted to be moved within Zone I or Zone Ia for slaughtering, breeding, feeding, or dipping purposes; or
  - (ii.) that an animal in his District should be permitted to be moved within Zone I orwithin Zone Ia as often as occasion may require, either between different parts of the same farm, or between different farms in the same Zone;

the Inspector may authorise such movement by a Movement Licence.

Prohibition of Markets, etc., of Animals in Zones I and Ia.

7. No market, fair, sale, or exhibition of animals shall be held in Zone I or Zone Ia.

## PART IV.

PROVISIONS AS TO ZONE II.

Movement out of Zone II.

8. No animal shall be moved out of Zone II except to a slaughter-house in Zone I or Zone Ia, and then only in accordance with. Part III of this Order.

#### Regulation of Markets, etc., in Zone II.

- 9. No market, fair, sale or exhibition of animals shall be held in Zone II except in accordance with the following provisions:—
  - (i) A market or sale may be held on any premises in Zone II if the Local Authority are satisfied that the market or sale will berestricted to animals intended for immediate-

slaughter and the market or sale is authorised by the Local Authority under this Order.

(ii.) The Local Authority shall cause a Veterinary Inspector to attend at every market or sale authorised under this Order, and examine the animals exposed thereat.

#### PART V.

### GENERAL.

Provisions as to Movement Licences.

10.—(1.) Where the movement authorised by a Movement Licence granted under this Order is movement to a slaughter-house in Zone I or Zone Ia from premises in any of the Zones described in the First Schedule hereto (other than a railway station or landing place), an animal shall not be moved with the Licence unless before the movement is commenced it is marked by and at the expense of the owner in manner following:

Cattle.—By the clipping of a broad arrow about six inches long on the left hind-quarter of each of the cattle and by the clipping of the hair off the end of the tail.

Sheep.—By the clipping of a broad arrow 
\( \) on the forehead of each of the sheep, and 
by the painting or stamping of the letter M, 
about six inches long, on both sides of each 
of the sheep with the following composition, 
namely: Rosin, five parts; oil of turpentine, 
two parts; and blue or red ochre, one part; 
melted and used warm; or with some other 
adhesive composition of a blue or red colour.

Swine.—By the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on both sides of each of the swine with the composi-

tion above mentioned.

(2.) Where the movement authorised by a Movement Licence is movement as often as occasion may require, either between different parts of the same farm, or between different farms, the Licence shall be marked with the words "Occupation Licence," and shall be in force until it is revoked by an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board by a Notice served on the occupier of the farm on which the animals then are.

(3.) Every Licence shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted, the number and description of the animals authorised to be moved, and the name or description of the several premises to and from which the animals are authorised to be

moved.

(4.) Where animals are moved with a Licence under this Order, unless the Licence is an Occupation Licence, the Licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up to an Officer of the Local Authority or be delivered up, at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station in the same District by the person in charge of the animals at the time of completing the movement.

(5.) A Movement Licence granted under this Order, except where it is otherwise expressly authorised by this Order, shall be in force for four days, inclusive of the day of issue, and shall be in the form set forth in the Second Schedule to the Lancashire and District (Footand-Mouth Disease) Order of 1912 (No. 8), or to

the occupier of the farm or premises or slaughterhouse from or to which the animal is to be moved, or by any individual member of an Executive Committee or Sub-Committee of a Local Authority.

(7.) A copy of a Licence which authorises movement to premises in a District other than the District for which the person granting the Licence acts as Inspector shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination is situate.

Genera Provisions as to Movement.

11. Animals while being moved with a Licence under this Order shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all animals which are not being so moved, and shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the place of destination specified in the Licence, and where the place of destination is a slaughter-house they shall be there detained until they are slaughtered.

Exception of certain Animals from Provisions as to Movement.

- 12. Nothing in this Order shall be construed as authorising—
  - (i.) movement of an anminal which is affected with foot and mouth disease, or which has during the preceding twenty-eight days been in any way exposed to the infection of such disease; or

(ii.) movement into or out of a foot and-

mouth disease infected place; or

(iii.) movement of an animal the movement of which is prohibited by notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board.

Saving for Orders and Regulations.

13. Movement of animals with a Licence under this Order is subject to any other Order of the Board, and also subject to any Regulation made by a Local Authority under any Order of the Board for prohibiting or regulating the movement of animals.

Provision as to Foreign Animals Wharf.

14. Nothing in this Order shall affect the landing of animals at a Foreign Animals Wharf, or the movement of animals within any such wharf.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

15.—(1.) Any person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read, and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

### Offences.

16.—(1.) If a person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and

address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act

(2.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted on any animal as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to the contract of the contrac ing to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

#### Revocation.

17. THE LANCASHIRE AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDERS OF 1912 (Nos. 2, 4, 5, 6, 7 and 8), and the Yorkshire (West Riding) (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1912 (No. 4), are hereby revoked.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

## PART I.

## Application of Order.

1. This Order shall apply to the Scheduled District described in the Surrey and London (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1912 (hereinafter referred to as "the Scheduled District").

Division of Scheduled District into Two Zones.

2.—(1.) The Scheduled District shall for the purposes of this Order be divided into the two Zones described in the First Schedule to this Order (hereinafter referred to respectively as Zone I and Zone II), to which the provisions hereinafter set forth shall apply.

(2.) If any farm (except any detached part) is partly within and partly without a Zone, the whole shall be deemed to be within the Zone, and where the farm extends to two Zones, the whole shall be deemed to be in the inner Zone.

## PART II.

Prohibition of Movement in certain Prohibited
Area.

3. No animal shall be moved out of, or along, over, or across a highway or thoroughfare within, the Area described in the Second Schedule to this Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Prohibited Area"), or be permitted by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon any such highway or thoroughfare, and no Movement Licence shall be granted under this Order by an Inspector of a Local Authority which would involve such movement.

#### PART III.

PROVISIONS AS TO ZONE I.

Movement out of Zone I and Movement into or within such Zone.

- 4.—(1.) No animal shall be moved out of Zone I.
- (2.) No animal shall be moved into, or be moved along, over, or across a highway or thoroughfare within Zone I except in accordance with the following provisions of this Order.
- (3.) No animal shall be allowed by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon a highway or thoroughfare in Zone I.

Movement into Zone I for Immediate Slaughter.

5.—(1.) An animal may, subject as herein provided, be moved by railway without a licence

- from premises not within any District which is for the time being a Scheduled District for the purposes of an Order of the Board relating to Foot-and-Mouth Disease, or from premises situate in Zone II, to a railway station situate within Zone I; and an animal so moved may be moved from the railway station to any slaughter-house situate within Zone I if accompanied by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the railway station is situate.

An animal may, subject as hereinafter provided, be moved by road from any premises not situate within any District which is for the time being a Scheduled District for the purposes of an Order of the Board relating to Footand-Mouth Disease, or from premises in Zone II to any slaughter-house in Zone I if accompanied during the movement in Zone I by a Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the premises from which the animal is to be moved is situate.

Movement within Zone I for certain purposes.

- 6. Where an Inspector of the Local Authority considers it necessary or expedient....
  - (i) that an animal in his District should be permitted to be moved within Zone I for slaughtering, breeding, feeding or dipping purposes; or
  - (ii) that an animal in his District should be permitted to be moved within Zone I as often as occasion may require, either between different parts of the same farm, or between different farms in the said Zone;

the Inspector may authorise such movement by a Movement Licence.

Prohibition of Markets, etc., of Animals in Zone I.

7. No market, fair, sale or exhibition of animals shall be held in Zone I.

#### PART IV.

PROVISIONS AS TO ZONE II.

Movement out of Zone II.

8. No animal shall be moved out of Zone II except for the purpose of movement to a slaughter-house in Zone I, and then only if accompanied by a Movement Licence granted under the previous provisions of this Order authorising such movement.

Regulation of Markets, etc., in Zone II.

- 9. No market, fair, sale or exhibition of animals shall be held in Zone II., except in accordance with the following provisions:—
  - (i) A market or sale may be held on any premises in Zone II if the Local Authority are satisfied that the market or sale will be restricted to animals intended for immediate slaughter and the market or sale is authorised by the Local Authority under this Order.
  - (ii) The Local Authority shall cause a Veterinary Inspector to attend at every market or sale authorised under this Order and examine the animals exposed thereat.

#### PART V.

#### GENERAL.

### Provisions as to Movement Licences.

Where the movement authorised by a Movement Licence granted under this Order is movement to a slaughter-house in Zone I. from premises (other than a railway station or landing place) in Zone I. or Zone II., an animal shall not be moved with the Licence unless before the movement is commenced it is marked by and at the expense of the owner in manner following:

Cattle.—By the clipping of a broad arrow \( \) about six inches long on the left hindquarter of each of the cattle and by the clipping of the hair off the end of the tail.

Sheep.—By the clipping of a broad arrow \( \) on the forehead of each of the sheep, and by the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on both sides of each of the sheep with the following composition, namely: Rosin, five parts; oil of turpentine, two parts; and blue or red ochre, one part; melted and used warm; or with some other adhesive composition of a blue or red colour.

Swine.—By the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on both sides of each of the swine with the composition above mentioned.

- (2.) Where the movement authorised by a Movement Licence is movement as often as occasion may require, either between different parts of the same farm, or between different farms, the Licence shall be marked with the words "Occupation Licence," and shall be in force until it is revoked by an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board by a notice served on the occupier of the farm on which the animals then are.
- (3.) Every Licence shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted, the number and description of the animals authorised to be moved, and the name or description of the several premises to and from which the animals are authorised to be moved.
- (4.) Where animals are moved with a Licence under this Order, unless the Licence is an Occupation Licence, the Licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up to an officer of the Local Authority or be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station in the same District by the person in charge of the animals at the time of completing the movement.
- (5.) A Movement Licence granted under this Order, except where it is otherwise expressly authorised by this Order, shall be in force for four days, inclusive of the day of issue, and shall be in the form set forth in the Second Schedule to Surrey and London (Foot and Mouth Disease) Order of 1912 (No. 3) or to the like effect.
- (6.) A Movement Licence granted under this Order shall not be available if granted by the owner of the animal to be moved, or by his agent, or by the consignee of the animal, or by the occupier of the farm or premises or slaughter-house from or to which the animal is to be moved, or by any individual member of an Executive Committee or Sub-Committee of a Local Authority.

(7.) A copy of a Licence which authorises movement to premises in a District other than the District for which the person granting the Licence acts as Inspector shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination is situate.

THE SALE OF MILK REGULATIONS, 1912.

Dated June 29, 1912.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, in exercise of the powers conferred on them by No. 28628.

section 4 of the Sale of Food and Drugs Act, 1899, do hereby make the following Regulations:—

## Skimmed or Separated Milk.

1. Where a sample of skimmed or separated milk (not being condensed milk) contains less than 8.7 per cent. of milk-solids other than milk-fat, it shall be presumed for the purposes of the Sale of Food and Drugs Acts, 1875 to 1907, until the contrary is proved, that the milk is not genuine, by reason of either the addition thereto of water, or the abstraction therefrom of milk-solids other than milk-fat.

Revocation of Existing Regulation.

2. Regulation 3 of the Sale of Milk Regulations, 1901, is hereby revoked, but not so as to affect the validity of any certificate of analysis given before the commencement of these Regulations or any legal proceedings in respect of any sample to which any such certificate relates.

#### Commencement.

3. These Regulations shall come into operation on the First day of September, One thousand nine hundred and twelve.

#### Extent

4. These Regulations shall extend to England and Wales.

#### Short Title.

5. These Regulations may be cited as the Sale of Milk Regulations, 1912.

## BY THE LIEUTENANT-GOVERNOR. A PROCLAMATION.

Isle of Man

To Wit.

WHEREAS by section 6 of the "Cattle Diseases Prevention Act, 1866," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, from time to time, by and with the advice and consent of any two members of the Council, to prohibit the importation or introduction into this Isle of hay, straw, fodder, dung, offal, litter, manure, or other articles in their opinion likely to propagate or introduce infection:

And whereas the infectious disease commonly called the Foot-and-Mouth Disease prevails amongst animals in certain places beyond this Isle, and it is deemed advisable to prohibit the importation of hay or straw with a view to preventing the introduction of the said disease amongst animals in this Isle:

Now I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of two members of the Council, and in the exercise of all powers in that behalf given by the Cattle Diseases Prevention Acts, do hereby order as follows:—

- 1. Except as hereinafter expressly provided, no hay or straw shall be imported or introduced into this Island.
  - 2. This order shall not apply to
  - (a) Hay or straw which at the time of importation is being used for packing merchandise; or
  - (b) Manufactured straw not intended for use as fodder or litter for animals.
- 3. The expression "animals" means horses, asses, and mules; cattle, sheep, goats, and all other ruminating animals; and swine.
- 4. This Order may be cited as the Hay and Straw (Landing) Order of 1912.
