ment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint John the Baptist, Tonyrefail, situate in the parish of Llantrisant, in the county of Glamorgan and in the diocese of Llandaff.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Saint John the Baptist, Tonyrefail, situate as aforesaid.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Joshua Pritchard, Bishop of Llandaff (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said parish of Llantrisant, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint John the Baptist, Tonyrefail, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Tonyrefail.'

"And with the like consent of the said Joshua Pritchard, Bishop of Llandaff (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said church of Saint John the Baptist, Tonyrefail, situate as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us the said Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in Your Royal Wisdom, shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Tonyrefail, being:—All that part of the parish of Llantrisant, in the county of Glamorgan, and in the diocese of Llandaff, which is bounded upon the north partly by the new parish of Cymmer and Porth, and partly by the new parish of Dinas and Pen-y-graig, upon the north-west by the new parish of Saint Andrew, Llwynypia, upon the west by the parish of Llandyfodwg, upon part of the south partly by the parish of Coychurch and partly by a detached portion of the parish of Llanilid, all in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the remaining part of the south and upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said detached portion of the parish of Llanilid from the said parish of Llantrisant at a point in the middle of the River Ely due west of Garth-Graban cross roads where the road leading from Tontraethwg Ford towards Lan-

Elay is joined by the road leading past the houses called Garth Hall and Garth-Graban, and extending thence in a straight line due east for a distance of one chain and a half or thereabouts to the said cross roads, and extending thence first north-eastward then southeastward and then again north-eastward along the middle of the last-mentioned road for a distance of one mile or thereabouts to its junction at Groes Heol Waun Pint with the road leading past the house called Ty'r-Heol to Tonyrefail and extending thence first northwestward and then north-eastward along the middle of the last-mentioned road for a distance of sixty-five chains or thereabouts to its junction near the said house called Ty'r-Heol with the road leading towards Treferig House and Castellau-uchaf, and extending thence first north-eastward, then eastward, and then southeastward along the middle of the last-mentioned road for a distance of thirty-four chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries the Treferig branch line of the Taff Vale Railway across such road, and extending thence first north-westward, then northward, and then again north-westward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of seventy-five chains or thereabouts to its terminus at the Glyn Colliery, and extending thence in a straight line due north (thereby passing to the east of the house called Rhiw-garn-fach) for a distance of fifty chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said parish of Llantrisant from the said new parish of Cymmer and Porth."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Llandaff.

The following Amendments to the Statutes of Lincoln College, Oxford, made by the Governing Body on the 6th May, 1912, have been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877":—

The following Amendments were approved on the 6th May, 1912, by the Rector and Fellows of Lincoln College, Oxford, at a meeting specially summoned for the purpose, and were carried by the requisite two-thirds majority:—

A. In statt. cap. II, § 10, to substitute for the words "within seven years" the words
