PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by Section 6 of the Northampton Corporation Act, 1911, it is (amongst other things) provided that the Borough of Northampton shall be divided into twelve wards and the wards shall have such names or distinguishing numbers and boundaries as shall be determined by a scheme to be made by a Commissioner to be appointed for that purpose by His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department.

And whereas by Section 7 of the said Act it is (amongst other things) further provided that the Commissioner shall by his Scheme apportion such of the then existing Councillors as shall remain in office after the 1st day of November, 1912, among the new wards so as to provide (as far as practicable) for each Councillor continuing to represent as large a number as possible of his former constituents, provided that there shall not be assigned to any ward more than one Councillor whose term of office expires on the 1st day of November, 1913, nor more than one Councillor whose term of office expires on the 1st day of November, 1914.

And whereas by Section 9 of the said Act it is further provided that subject to the pro-

visions of the said Act sub-sections (8) to (15) of Section 30 (Proceedings for division of borough into wards or alteration of wards) of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, shall apply as if they were with any necessary alterations re-enacted in this Act.

And whereas by Section 11 of the said Northampton Corporation Act, 1911, it is further provided that the boundaries of the existing borough are thereby altered and extended so as to comprise and the borough shall accordingly comprise in addition to the existing borough so much of the parish of Weston Favell in the rural district of Northampton as will form part of Billing Road when widened as shown on the plan referred to in the Section of the said Act the marginal note of which is "Deposit of plan of extended borough" (thereinafter called "the added area").

And whereas by Section 14 of the said Act it is (amongst other things) further provided that subject to the provisions of the said Act and of the Municipal Corporations Acts the added area shall form and for all intents and purposes be part of the borough and of the parish of Abington and St. Edmund's Ward.

And whereas by Section 30, sub-section (10), of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, it is provided that the number of Councillors assigned to each ward shall be a number divisible by three; and in fixing their number the

Commissioner shall, as far as he deems it practicable, have regard as well to the number of persons rated in the ward as to the aggregate rating of the ward.

And whereas the Right Honourable Reginald McKenna, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, did by Warrant dated the 14th day of November, 1911, appoint Harold McKenna, Esquire, Barrister-at-Law, to be a Commissioner to prepare a Scheme for determining the boundaries of such wards and for apportioning the Councillors of the said Borough among such wards.

And whereas the said Commissioner has, in pursuance of the powers given him by virtue of the said appointment prepared the following Scheme, dated the 29th day of March, 1912, accordingly:—

BOROUGH OF NORTHAMPTON.

I, the said Harold McKenna, do hereby determine as hereinafter mentioned the Boundaries of the twelve Wards into which the Borough of Northampton is divided, which Wards are hereinafter named and numbered as follows, that is to say:—

1. Castle Ward.
2. Delapre Ward.
3. Kingsthorpe Ward.
4. North Ward.
5. Saint Crispin's Ward.
6. Saint Edmund's Ward.
7. Saint James' Ward.
8. Saint Michael's Ward.
9. South Ward.
10. Abington Ward.
11. Kingsley Ward.
12. Saint Lawrence's Ward.

And, unless the contrary appears, where, in the following descriptions of the Ward boundaries, a street is given as the boundary thereof, the boundary is to be taken as the centre of such street and where any street is described as joining another street, the point of junction is to be taken as the point at which lines drawn along the centres of the two streets and continued, would intersect each other.

No. 1. CASTLE WARD.

I do hereby determine that Castle Ward shall comprise so much of the Borough of Northampton as lies within the following boundary:—

Within an imaginary line commencing at a point in Spencer Bridge where it crosses the River Nene proceeding thence in an Easterly direction along the centres of Spencer Bridge Road and Grafton Street successively to Regent Square at the junction of Campbell Street, thence in a South-Easterly direction along the centres of Campbell Street, Campbell Square, Upper Mounts and Lower Mounts successively to the junction of Lower Mounts and Abington Street, thence in a Westerly direction along the Northern boundary of the South Ward as hereinafter defined to the boundary of Saint James' Ward in Saint James Road as hereinafter defined, thence in a North-Easterly direction along the Eastern boundary of Saint James' Ward to the point of commencement aforesaid.

No. 2. DELAPRE WARD.

I do hereby determine that Delapre Ward shall comprise so much of the Borough of

Northampton as lies within the following boundary:—

Within an imaginary line commencing at a point in the Borough Boundary at the junction of the River Nene and the Mill Race East of Nunn Mills and proceeding thence Southwards, Westwards and Northwards successively along the Southern boundary of the borough to the Southern boundary of Saint James' Ward as hereinafter defined, thence North-Eastwards along the Southern boundary of Saint James' Ward to its junction with the River Nene at the gasworks, thence Eastwards along the centre of the River Nene to the junction with the Mill Race, thence Eastwards and Northwards successively along the Mill Race South and East of Calvesholme to the River Nene, thence Eastwards along the centre of the River Nene to the point of commencement aforesaid.

No. 3. KINGSTHORPE WARD.

I do hereby determine that Kingsthorpe Ward shall comprise so much of the Borough of Northampton as lies within the following boundary:—

Within an imaginary line commencing at a point in the Western boundary of the borough in the River Nene opposite Norfolk Street, proceeding thence Northwards, North-Eastwards and Southwards successively along the boundary of the borough to the Northern boundary of the Kingsley Ward hereinafter defined thence in a South-Westerly direction along the Northern boundaries of the Kingsley Ward and Saint Lawrence's Ward as hereinafter defined, thence in a Southerly direction along the Western boundary of Saint Lawrence's Ward to a point at the junction of Kingsthorpe Road and Agnes Road; thence in a Westerly direction along the Northern boundary of the North Ward as hereinafter defined to the Western boundary of the borough at the point of commencement aforesaid.

No. 4. NORTH WARD.

I do hereby determine that North Ward shall comprise so much of the Borough of Northampton as lies within the following boundary:—

Within an imaginary line commencing at a point at Spencer Bridge, where it crosses the River Nene, proceeding thence in Easterly and Northerly directions successively along the boundaries of the Castle Ward and Saint Lawrence's Ward respectively as hereinbefore and hereinafter respectively defined, to a point at the junction of the centres of Kingsthorpe Road and Agnes Road, thence in a Westerly direction along the centre of Agnes Road and across Semilong Road to and along the centre of Norfolk Street and continuing in a straight line in the same direction to the Western boundary of the borough, thence in a Southerly direction along the boundary of the borough and the Eastern boundary of Saint James' Ward as hereinafter defined to the point of commencement aforesaid.

No. 5. SAINT CRISPIN'S WARD.

I do hereby determine that Saint Crispin's Ward shall comprise so much of the Borough of Northampton as lies within the following boundary:—

Within an imaginary line commencing at a point at the junction of Abington Square,

York Road and Abington Street, proceeding thence in a North-Easterly direction along the North-Western boundaries of the Saint Edmund's Ward and Saint Michael's Ward as hereinafter defined to the junction of Kettering Road and the South Promenade of the Northampton Race-Course, thence in North-Westerly and Westerly directions successively along the centre of the said Promenade to a point opposite the Western Boundary of the Militia Drill Ground and Stores, thence in a Southerly direction and crossing the said South Promenade to and along the said boundary of the Militia Drill Ground and Stores to Clare Street, thence across Clare Street and continuing in the same direction along the division walls separating the properties situated in Great Russell Street from those in Earl Street to a point in the centre of Upper Mounts, thence in a South-Easterly direction along the centres of Upper Mounts and Lower Mounts to the point of commencement aforesaid.

NO. 6. SAINT EDMUND'S WARD.

I do hereby determine that Saint Edmund's Ward shall comprise so much of the Borough of Northampton as lies within the following boundary:—

Within an imaginary line commencing at the junction of Abington Square, York Road and Abington Street, proceeding thence Southwards along the centre of York Road to Billing Road, thence Eastwards along the centre of Billing Road to the junction of Billing Road and Barry Road, thence Northwards along the centre of Barry Road to the Wellingborough Road, thence Westwards along the centre of Wellingborough Road and Abington Square successively to the point of commencement aforesaid.

NO. 7. SAINT JAMES' WARD.

I do hereby determine that Saint James' Ward shall comprise so much of the Borough of Northampton as lies within the following boundary:—

Within an imaginary line commencing at a point at Spencer Bridge, where it crosses the River Nene, proceeding thence in a Northerly direction along the centre of the River Nene to the boundary of the Borough, thence in Westerly, Southerly and Easterly and again Southerly directions successively along the Western boundary of the Borough to the junction of the Borough boundary with the boundary between the Parishes of Duston St. James and Far Cotton, thence in a North-Easterly and North-Westerly direction along the Eastern boundary of the Parish of Duston St. James to its junction with the Parish of Dallington St. James in St. James' Road thence in a Northerly direction along the Eastern boundary of the said Parish of Dallington St. James to the point of commencement aforesaid.

NO. 8. SAINT MICHAEL'S WARD.

I do hereby determine that Saint Michael's Ward shall comprise so much of the Borough of Northampton as lies within the following boundary:—

Within an imaginary line commencing at a point at the junction of Kettering Road and Kingsley Road, proceeding thence in South - Easterly, South - Westerly and

Southerly directions along the centre of Abington Grove, Abington Avenue and Stimpson Avenue to the Wellingborough Road, thence in a Westerly direction along the centre of the Wellingborough Road to a point in Abington Square at the junction of Wellingborough Road and the Kettering Road, thence in a North-Easterly direction along the centre of Kettering Road to the point of commencement aforesaid.

NO. 9. SOUTH WARD.

I do hereby determine that South Ward shall comprise so much of the Borough of Northampton as lies within the following boundary:—

Within an imaginary line commencing at the junction of Abington Square, York Road and Abington Street and proceeding thence in Southerly and Easterly directions successively along the boundaries of Saint Edmund's Ward and Abington Ward as hereinbefore and hereinafter defined respectively to the Borough Boundary opposite the Southern end of Wycliffe Road, thence in Southerly and Westerly directions successively along the Eastern and Southern boundaries of the Borough to a point in the River Nene at its junction with the Mill Race East of Nunn Mills, thence in Westerly, Southerly and North-Westerly directions successively along the Northern and Eastern boundaries of Delapre Ward and Saint James' Ward as hereinbefore defined to Saint James' Road, thence in an Easterly direction along the centre of Saint James' Road, West Bridge, Black Lion Hill, Marefair and Gold Street to the junction of Gold Street and the Drapery, thence in a Northerly direction to Mercers Row, thence in a North-Easterly direction along the centres of Mercers Row and Abington Street to the point of commencement aforesaid.

I do hereby determine that Abington Ward shall comprise so much of the Borough of Northampton as lies within the following boundary:—

Within an imaginary line commencing at the junction of Wellingborough Road with Stimpson Avenue and proceeding thence Northwards along the Eastern boundary of Saint Michael's Ward as hereinbefore defined to the junction of Abington Grove and Abington Avenue, thence Eastwards along the centres of Abington Avenue and Wellingborough Road to the boundary of the Borough, thence in a South-Westerly direction along the Eastern boundary of the Borough to a point in the Billing Road opposite the southern end of Wycliffe Road, thence Westwards along the centre of Billing Road to the junction of that road with Barry Road, thence Northwards and Westwards successively along the Eastern and Northern boundaries of the Saint Edmund's Ward as hereinbefore defined to the point of commencement aforesaid.

NO. 11. KINGSLEY WARD.

I do hereby determine that Kingsley Ward shall comprise so much of the Borough of Northampton as lies within the following boundary:—

Within an imaginary line commencing at a point at the junction of Kettering Road

and Kingsley Road, proceeding thence Northwards along the centre of Kingsley Road to the junction of that road with Saint George's Avenue, thence Westwards along the centre of Saint George's Avenue to the junction of Saint George's Avenue with Seaby's Footpath, thence Northwards along the centre of Seaby's Footpath to the Parliamentary boundary, thence Eastwards along the Parliamentary boundary to Gipsy Lane and thence continuing the line of the Parliamentary boundary in a straight line to the Borough boundary, thence North-Eastwards and Southwards successively along the Northern and Eastern boundaries of the Borough to the junction of Wellingborough Road, thence Westwards and North-Westwards successively along the Northern boundaries of Abington Ward and Saint Michael's Ward as hereinbefore defined to the point of commencement aforesaid.

No. 12. SAINT LAWRENCE'S WARD.

I do hereby determine that Saint Lawrence's Ward shall comprise so much of the Borough of Northampton as lies within the following boundary:—

Within an imaginary line commencing at the junction of Kettering Road and Kingsley Road proceeding thence in North-Westerly, Westerly and Northerly directions successively along the Western boundary of Kingsley Ward as hereinbefore defined to the point where the Parliamentary boundary crosses Seaby's Footpath thence in a South-Westerly direction along the Parliamentary boundary to the centre of Kingsthorpe Road, thence in a Southerly direction along the centre of Kingsthorpe Road to the junction of Kingsthorpe Road and St. Paul's Road thence in a Westerly direction along the centre of St. Paul's Road to a point opposite the Eastern Flank wall of the Easternmost house on the South side of that road thence in a Southerly direction to and along that flank wall to the end thereof, thence continuing in a Southerly direction in a straight line to a point on the Northern fence of St. Thomas's Roman Catholic Cathedral grounds 35 yards West of the Western side of Kingsthorpe Road, thence in a Westerly direction along that fence for a further distance of 35 yards, thence in a Southerly direction in a straight line to a point on the Northern side of Marriott Street 60 yards West of the Western side of Kingsthorpe Road thence in a South-Easterly direction across Marriott Street to the passage in the rear of the premises fronting upon Kingsthorpe Road, thence in a Southerly direction along the centre of that passage to and across Hester Street and continuing along the centre of the opposite passage to the back fence of the premises at the North side of Alliston's Gardens, thence in an Easterly direction along that fence to the passage in rear of the premises fronting upon Kingsthorpe Road, thence in a Southerly direction along the centre of that passage to and across Adelaide Street and continuing in the same direction along the centre of the opposite passage to the Northern Boundary fence of the Barracks, thence in a Westerly direction along that fence for a distance of 38 yards, thence in a Southerly direction in a straight line to the Southern boundary fence of the Barracks to

PUBLIC WORKS LOANS ACT, 1875.

Further Regulations as to Advances by the Public Works Loan Commissioners.

Notice is hereby given, in pursuance of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that the following further regulations are proposed to be made by the Public Works Loan Commissioners with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, under section 41 of the Public Works Loans Act, 1875, and that copies of the draft regulations may be obtained at the Office of the Public Works Loan Board, Old Jewry, E.C.

Draft Regulations.

(1) That in place of the 8th of the regulations made on the 1st April, 1876, and the 1st of the regulations made on the 2nd January, 1880, under the Public Works Loans Act, 1875, the following regulations shall be in force, viz.:—When the Loan Commissioners shall have determined upon any amount of money to be advanced by way of loan pursuant to section 9, of the Public Works Loans Act, 1875, the said Commissioners, or any two or more of them, shall forthwith certify such amount to the Commissioners for the Reduction of the National Debt for the time being, and at the foot of every such certificate the secretary shall state the name or names of the person or persons by whom such certificate is to be presented to the said Commissioners for the Reduction of the National Debt, and upon every such certificate being lodged at the office of the last-mentioned Commissioners for such number of days as may from time to time be agreed upon between the same Commissioners and the Loan Commissioners, the Comptroller General, or other proper officer of the said Commissioners, shall sign an order appended to such certificate for the payment of the sum mentioned therein to the person or persons named at the foot of the certificate, or to one of such persons, which order shall be addressed to the cashiers of the Governor and Company of the Bank of England; and the signatures of such person or persons, jointly or severally, shall be a sufficient discharge to the said Commissioners for the Reduction of the National Debt, and to the said Governor and Company respectively, provided the total amount directed to be paid by such certificate or certificates respectively shall not at any time exceed the amount for the time being standing to the credit of the account referred to in section 16 of the Act.

(2) The above regulation shall come into force on the 16th day of September, 1912, and as from such date the said 8th and 1st regulations shall be rescinded.

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

I. The limits of age for this situation are 21 and 24. Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of the Examination.

II. Candidates will be required to show what technical education and practical training they have undergone to qualify themselves for a situation of this nature. They must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that they have had at least two years' training in an Engineering Works or an Engineering School, or partly in a Works and partly in a School. Evidence on these points must be sent in at such times and in such manner as the Civil Service Commissioners may appoint.

III. The Examination will be in the following subjects:—

1. English Composition.
2. Mathematics.
3. Drawing.
4. French or German or Italian.
5. Applied Mechanics.
6. Electricity and Magnetism.
7. Structures.
8. Personal Qualities.

No candidate will be eligible who does not pass to the satisfaction of the Civil Service Commissioners in each of the subjects numbered 1, 2, 3, 5, 6, 7 and 8.

The Examination may be held in one part or in two parts, at the discretion of the Civil Service Commissioners. In the latter case the first part of the examination will be used to reduce the number of competitors to be admitted to the second part. Of those who pass and obtain the highest aggregate marks on the first part a certain number, to be determined by the Civil Service Commissioners, will be admitted to the second part of the examination. The successful list will consist of those candidates who pass and obtain the highest aggregate marks on the whole examination.

IV. Subject to the provisions of Clause II of these regulations the examinations are open to all natural-born or naturalised British subjects, being of the requisite age, health, and character, with the following restrictions:—

And whereas the Council of the Borough of Margate, being a Sanitary Authority within the meaning of the Regulations, and hereinafter referred to as "the Sanitary Authority," propose, with the approval of the Chief Officer of Customs of the Port of Ramsgate, to fix the place hereinafter referred to, and indicated by a circle drawn in red on the map or chart in the Schedule to this Order, as the place where any ship certified as aforesaid may be moored or anchored for the purpose of Article X of the Regulations, and such place being situate without their jurisdiction or district, have made application to Us for Our consent in the matter:

NOW THEREFORE, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Us by the said Acts and by the Regulations, and of every other power enabling Us in that behalf, We do hereby Declare, Order, and Direct as follows:—

Durham and Northumberland (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Scheduled District which is not in Zone I, Zone Ia, or Zone IV, or in a Prohibited Area, to a railway station situate within Zone IV; and an animal so moved may be moved from the railway station to any slaughter-house situate within Zone IV if accompanied by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the railway station is situate.

(2.) An animal may, subject as provided in Orders No. 5 and No. 7, also be moved from any premises situate within Zone IV or any other part of the said Scheduled District (except Zone I and the Prohibited Areas) to any slaughter-house in Zone IV or from premises in Zone IV to a slaughter-house in Zone Ia or Zone IIa, if accompanied by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the premises are situate from which the animal is to be moved.

Prohibition of Markets, etc., of Animals in Zone IV.

6. No market, fair, sale or exhibition of animals shall be held in Zone IV.

Short Title, etc.

application and after compliance with such requirements as are described and set forth in section 3 of the Act of 1907, otherwise declare, specify, and direct the said section, in its application to the contributory place and in relation to the exercise of the powers and to the discharge of the duties of the Local Authority under that section, shall have effect as if the words and figure following were added to and formed part of the section; that is to say—

“(6.) Nothing in this section shall apply to a public or circulating library which is not in any contributory place within the District.”

Article III. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-eighth day of August, 1912.
