### THE SUMMARY JURISDICTION (FORMS) RULE, 1912.

Jurisdiction Rules, 1886, and Forms 5 and 6 in Schedule A of the Summary Jurisdiction (Children Act) Rules, 1909, shall be amended by the omission of the words "and of his conveyance to the said prison" and the words "and of his conveyance to the said prison [or place of detention]" wherever they occur.

#### WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of Kent) Order, 1912.

Dated 12th August, 1912.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the Council of the administrative county of Kent, I hereby make the following order:—

#### *Title.*

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of Kent) Order, 1912."

#### BIRDS.

#### *Extension of Close Time throughout the County.*

II. The time during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall, except as regards the Common Wild Duck, be extended throughout the administrative county of Kent, so as to be between the last day of February and the 2nd day of September in each year.

#### *Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.*

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:—

(a) Throughout so much of the administrative county of Kent as is within the Metropolitan Police District, to the Hedge Accentor (Hedge Sparrow), Cirl Bunting, Corn Bunting, Reed Bunting, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Rough-legged Buzzard, Chiffchaff, Baillons Crake, Corn Crake (Land-rail), Spotted Crake, Tree Creeper, Crossbill, Pintail Duck, Tufted Duck, White-tailed Eagle, Pied Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher, Gadwall, Garganey, Harrier, Hawfinch, Common Heron, Hobby, Kestrel, Linnets, Magpie, House Martin, Sand Martin, Merlin, Nuthatch, Osprey, Meadow Pipit, Tree Pipit, Quail, Carolina (olivaceous) Rail, Water Rail, Raven, Lesser Redpole, Redstart, Robin, Great Grey Shrike, Lesser Grey Shrike, Red-backed Shrike, Siskin, Stonechat, Swallow, Swift, Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), Long-tailed Tit, Blue-headed Wagtail, Grey Wagtail, Pied Wagtail, White Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail, Blackcap Warbler, Dartford Warbler, Garden Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Reed Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Willow Warbler, Wood Warbler, Waxwing, Wheatear, Whinchat, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Common Wren, Golden-crested Wren, Wryneck. (Cuckoo's Mate or Snake Bird).

(b) Throughout so much of the administrative county of Kent as is not within the Metropolitan Police District, to the Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Rough-legged Buzzard, Turtle Dove, White-tailed Eagle, Peregrine Falcon, Pied Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher, Hen Harrier, Marsh Harrier, Montagu's Harrier, Hawfinch, Hobby, Kestrel, House Martin, Sand Martin, Moorhen, Osprey, Kentish Plover, Raven, Lesser Redpoll, Swallow, Swift, Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), Wryneck.

#### *Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.*

IV. *All Birds protected on Sundays in certain Parishes.*

V. **Eggs.**

*All Eggs Protected in Certain Areas.*

VI. The taking or destroying of Wild Birds' eggs is prohibited for a period of five years from the date of this Order within the following areas in the administrative county of Kent, which are coloured blue on a map deposited with the Clerk of the County Council, sealed with the Home Office seal, and dated the 12th August, 1912:—

1. So much of the Isle of Sheppey (including therein Elmley Island) as lies south of the road running from Queenborough, through Eastchurch, to Warden Point.

2. An Area bounded on the west by so much of the Sittingbourne and Sheerness Railway as lies between Kingsferry and the Sittingbourne Railway Station, and bounded on the south by the London Chatham and Dover Railway from Sittingbourne Railway Station to Whitstable Railway Station, and bounded on the east by the main road from Whitstable Station to the sea, and bounded on the north by the Swale and Whitstable Bay.

3. An Area bounded on the west by the Minster and Deal Branch of the South-Eastern Railway from Minster Railway Station to Deal Railway Station, and bounded on the south by the road from Deal Railway Station to Deal Pier, and bounded on the east by the sea, and bounded on the north by the South-Eastern Railway from Minster Station to Ramsgate Station.

4. An Area lying east and south of the main road from Walmer through Dover to Folkestone from the point where such road passes through the southern boundary of the Walmer Urban District to the point where such road enters the borough of Folkestone, such area being bounded on the east and south by the sea, and on the north by the Walmer Urban District, and on the south by the borough of Folkestone.

5. An Area lying south and west of the main road which runs from Appledore Railway Station through Snargate, Brenzett, and Old Romney, to New Romney Station, and thence to Littlestone-on-Sea, such Area being bounded on the north-west by the Royal Military Canal from Appledore Railway Station to the Sussex Boundary, and bounded on the south-west by the Sussex Boundary, and on the south and east by the sea.

*Certain Eggs protected outside the Metropolitan Police District.*

VII. The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated the 7th August, from His Majesty's Minister at Brussels, transmitting the following copy of a Ministerial Decree, as published in the "Moniteur Belge," imposing restrictions on goods coming from San-Juan (Porto Rico) on account of cases of plague which have broken out there:—

Arrête :

Art. 1er. Les dispositions qui font l'objet des articles 1 à 6 de l'arrêté royal du 26 septembre 1907 susvisé, sont rendues applicables aux provenances de l'île de Porto-Rico, à partir du 8 août 1912.

Art. 2. Les provenances arrivant par mer seront soumises, à la station sanitaire de l'Escaut et dans les ports d'Ostende, de Nieuport, de Zeebrugge, d'Anvers et de Gand, ainsi qu'à Selzaete, au régime stipulé par le titre I, chapitre II, section III, de la Convention adoptée le 3 décembre 1903 par la Conférence sanitaire internationale de Paris.

## NATIONAL INSURANCE ACT, 1911.—PART II (UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE).

The Special Exclusion (Drivers, &c.) Order, 1912, dated July 31st, 1912, made by the Board of Trade under Part II of the National Insurance Act, 1911 (1 and 2 Geo. 5, c. 55).

In pursuance of section 104 of the National Insurance Act, 1911, the Board of Trade hereby make the following Special Order:—

(1) The Board of Trade hereby exclude from

the occupations which are to be deemed employment in an insured trade for the purposes of Part II of the National Insurance Act, 1911 (Unemployment Insurance) the occupations followed by:—

(a) The drivers or attendants of any vehicle.

(b) Stablemen or other workmen employed in tending horses or to clean any vehicle.

(c) Wood-carvers.

(d) Workmen employed in the manufacture and fitting of upholstery for the purpose of the construction, alteration, repair or decoration of buildings, ships, boats or other craft, unless such manufacture and fitting is substantially the sole occupation of such workmen.

(e) Workmen employed in the manufacture of fittings of leather or celluloid for cycles or motor cycles.

(2) This Order may be cited as the Special Exclusion (Drivers, &c.) Order, 1912, and shall take effect as from the commencement of the Act.

## ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 8TH AUGUST 1912.)

## YORKSHIRE (WEST RIDING) AND PEAK DISTRICT (SHEEP-DIPPING) ORDER OF 1912.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

*Application of Order.*

1.—(1.) This Order applies to the Area described in the First Schedule hereto (hereinafter referred to as "the Dipping Area").

(2.) While this Order remains in operation the Dipping Area described in the First Sch-

dule hereto shall cease to form part of the Dipping Areas to which the provisions of the Sheep-Dipping (Scotland and North of England) Order of 1907 and the Sheep-Dipping (England) Order of 1908 apply, and accordingly those Orders shall not apply to any portion of the Dipping Area described in the First Schedule hereto or to the sheep therein, so long as they remain in the Dipping Area.

#### PART I.

#### MOVEMENT OF SHEEP OUT OF DIPPING AREA, AND EXPOSURE AT MARKETS, &C., WITHIN DIPPING AREA BETWEEN 31ST AUGUST AND 1ST OCTOBER.

##### *Restriction on Movement of Sheep out of Dipping Area.*

2.—(1.) Sheep shall not (except as hereinafter provided) be moved out of the Dipping Area between the thirty-first day of August and the first day of October in each year unless—

(i.) they are accompanied by a licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the sheep are when the licence is granted: or

(ii.) they are moved direct to a slaughter-house having previous to such movement been marked by the painting or stamping with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each sheep, thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long.

(2.) Sheep moved under this Article to a slaughter-house shall after their arrival thereat be there detained until they are slaughtered.

##### *Restriction on Exposure of Sheep at Markets, &c., within Dipping Area.*

3. Between the thirty-first day of August and the first day of October in any year, sheep shall not (except as hereinafter provided) be permitted to enter, or be exposed for sale or exhibition in, any market, fairground, saleyard, or place of exhibition in the Dipping Area unless they are accompanied by a licence (in this Order referred to as a "market licence") granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the sheep are when the licence is granted.

##### *Conditions affecting the grant of Movement and Market Licences.*

4.—(1.) A movement licence under Article 2 or a market licence may be granted by an Inspector upon production to him of

(a) one or more certificates, in the Form set forth in the Second Schedule hereto or to the like effect, showing that the sheep to be moved have been dipped by a thorough immersion in an efficient sheep-dip in the presence, and to the satisfaction, of an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in accordance with the requirements of this Order; and

(b) a declaration signed by the owner of the sheep, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, in the Form set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect, to the effect that the sheep to be moved are sheep referred to in the

certificate or certificates, and that since the dipping, or where two dippings are required by this Order, since the second dipping, the sheep have been kept as far as practicable separate while in the Dipping Area from other sheep not so dipped.

(2.) A movement licence under Article 2 or a market licence may also be granted by an Inspector upon production to him of

(a) a certificate by a duly qualified veterinary surgeon to the effect that he has within ten days before the licence is granted examined each of the sheep to be moved, and found it to be free from sheep-scab; and

(b) a declaration signed by the owner of the sheep, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, to the effect that since such examination the sheep have been kept separate from other sheep, and have not been exposed in any market, fairground, saleyard or exhibition.

A licence under this paragraph shall only be granted where, in the opinion of the Inspector granting it, compliance with paragraph (1.) is impracticable or inexpedient.

(3.) A movement licence under Article 2 or a market licence may also be granted by an Inspector upon production to him of an exemption from the annual compulsory dipping granted under Article 10 of this Order and relating to the sheep for which the licence is applied for.

(4.) A declaration shall be retained by the Inspector granting a licence thereon. A certificate shall also be so retained unless it refers to more sheep than are proposed to be moved, in which case a note shall be made thereon and initialled by the Inspector who grants the licence, stating the number of the sheep for which the licence is granted.

(5.) The licence shall be in force for eight days, inclusive of the day of issue, and shall be in the Form set forth in the Second Schedule hereto or to the like effect.

(6.) A copy of the licence shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Local Authority of the District in which is situate the place of destination specified in the licence, if such place is situate in another District.

(7.) A movement licence under Article 2 or a market licence shall not be granted except in accordance with this Article.

(8.) No certificate or declaration shall be required for the grant of a movement licence authorising movement of sheep from a market, fairground, saleyard, or place of exhibition in the Dipping Area.

##### *Dipping necessary to obtain Movement Licences under Article 2.*

5. For a movement licence under Article 2 the sheep to be moved must have been dipped twice on separate dates with an interval of not less than ten and not more than twenty-one days between the two dates, and the second dipping must have taken place within twenty-eight days before the licence is granted.

##### *Dipping necessary to obtain Market Licences.*

6.—(1.) For a market licence which relates to sheep on premises situate within the Dipping Area, they must have been dipped twice on separate dates with an interval of not less than ten and not more than twenty-one days between

the two dates, and the second dipping must have taken place within twenty-eight days before the licence is granted.

(2.) For a market licence which relates to sheep on premises situate outside the Dipping Area, they must have been dipped once within twenty-eight days before the licence is granted.

#### *Special Provisions as to Lambs.*

7. Where an Inspector of a Local Authority is satisfied that any lambs in his District are intended for immediate slaughter and that it is impracticable or inexpedient that the same should in accordance with this Order be dipped before movement for such purpose, or that the lambs are to be moved direct to a slaughterhouse, he may, subject to any directions by the Local Authority, by licence authorise the movement of the lambs to any market, fair-ground, saleyard, or other premises, whether in the Dipping Area, or not, subject to such conditions (if any) as are inserted in the licence, and thereupon the lambs may be moved in accordance with such licence and conditions, and be exposed for sale in the market, fair-ground, or saleyard free from any restrictions imposed by any Order of the Board; Provided that an Inspector of a Local Authority shall not issue any such licence for movement to premises in the District of another Local Authority unless the consent of such Local Authority, either generally or in the particular instance, has been previously obtained. This Article does not apply to lambs more than nine months old.

## PART II.

### ANNUAL COMPULSORY DIPPING.

#### *Returns by Owners of Sheep in Dipping Area on 1st September.*

8.—(1.) Every owner of sheep in the Dipping Area shall, on the first day of September in each year, or as soon after that date as may be practicable, send by post or deliver to the Clerk of the Local Authority a return showing the name or description of the farm or holding or other premises in the Dipping Area upon which the sheep are, the description of his sheep on such farm or holding or other premises, on the first day of September, and the number of such sheep so far as such number can reasonably be ascertained.

(2.) The owner of any sheep brought into the Dipping Area between the said date and the first day of October in each year, shall send or deliver a similar return relating to the sheep so brought into the Area.

(3.) Every return shall be made on a form approved by the Local Authority, who shall provide forms for this purpose to owners of sheep applying therefor.

#### *Dipping of all Sheep in Dipping Area between 31st August and 1st October.*

9.—(1.) The owner of any sheep in the Dipping Area between the thirty-first day of August and the first day of October in each year (hereinafter referred to as "the prescribed dipping period"), shall, subject to the next following Article, cause the same to be dipped twice between those dates, with an interval of not less than ten and not more than twenty-one days between the dippings by a thorough immersion in an efficient sheep-dip.

(2.) The dippings shall be carried out on such dates, at such dipping places, and in such manner as shall be required by a Notice signed by an Inspector of the Local Authority, and served by post, or otherwise, on the owner or person in charge of the sheep referred to in the Notice.

(3.) All sheep after having been dipped shall during the remainder of the prescribed dipping period be kept, as far as practicable, isolated from sheep which have not been so dipped.

#### *Exemptions from Annual Compulsory Dipping.*

10.—(1.) The provisions of this Order requiring the dipping of all sheep during the prescribed dipping period shall not apply to—

(i.) sheep moved out of the Dipping Area under and in accordance with the provisions of this Order, or slaughtered within the Area, during the prescribed dipping period; or

(ii.) sheep for which an exemption from the annual compulsory dipping has been obtained from the Local Authority of the District in which the sheep are, which exemption shall be granted only for sheep which since the first day of July in the current year shall have been dipped by a thorough immersion in an efficient sheep-dip in the presence, and to the satisfaction, of an Inspector of a Local Authority twice on separate dates with an interval of not less than ten and not more than twenty-one days between the dippings, and have since the second dipping been kept as far as practicable separate from sheep not so dipped. The sheep thus exempted shall until the first day of October be kept as far as practicable separate from sheep which have not been dipped in the manner prescribed by Part II of this Order. Every exemption shall be signed by the Clerk of the Local Authority and shall be subject to any conditions specified in the exemption. A copy of every exemption shall be sent to the Board.

(2.) In the case of sheep which, in the opinion of the Local Authority of the District where they are kept, it is impracticable or inexpedient to dip in accordance with the requirements of this Order, on account of any special circumstances, the prescribed dipping period may be extended by the Local Authority to the twenty-first day of October. In such case the sheep shall not, until they have been dipped as required by Part II of this Order, be moved out of the Dipping Area or be allowed to come in contact with sheep which have been so dipped.

#### *Powers of Entry and Examination.*

11. For the purpose of this Part of this Order an Inspector of the Local Authority may, subject to the direction of the Local Authority, enter any premises within the District and examine any sheep thereon, and such powers of entry and examination shall be in addition to any other like powers vested in the Inspector by the Act of 1894 or otherwise.

## PART III.

### GENERAL PROVISIONS.

#### *Appointment by Local Authorities of Persons to receive Returns, &c.*

12.—(1.) Each Local Authority shall appoint persons for their District or for separate parts of their District to receive



returns under this Order, and shall give adequate notice of appointments so made.

(2.) The Local Authority of a District in which a market, fair, sale, or exhibition is held shall take such steps as may be necessary to enforce thereat the provisions of this Order relating to market licences, and for that purpose may appoint one or more persons to receive the licences required by this Order to accompany sheep entering therein. The licences shall, upon entry of the sheep into the market, fairground, saleyard, or place of exhibition, be delivered to any person so appointed on demand by him. The person receiving licences shall deliver the licences to an Inspector of the Local Authority.

*Provisions as to Farms on borders of Dipping Area.*

13. Where any farm or holding is situate partly within and partly without the Dipping Area the provisions of this Order shall, notwithstanding anything contained in any other Order of the Board, apply to the farm or holding and the sheep thereon as if the whole farm or holding were in the Area.

*Certificates of Dipping.*

14. Where sheep are dipped in the presence, and to the satisfaction of an Inspector of a Local Authority, he shall give the owner or person in charge of the sheep a certificate in the Form set forth in the Second Schedule hereto or the like effect.

*Restriction on Movement of Sheep not Dipped as Required by Order.*

15.—(1.) Where any sheep shall not have been dipped as required by this Order an Inspector of the Local Authority may, without prejudice to any proceedings for the offence, serve the owner or person in charge of the sheep and the owner or person in charge of any sheep then in contact with the undipped sheep with a notice, in the Form set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect, requiring the dipping of the sheep described in the notice, and prohibiting their movement from the farm, holding, or other place where they are at the time the notice is served (except with a licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District) until all the sheep shall have been dipped by a thorough immersion in an efficient sheep-dip after the service of the notice in the presence and to the satisfaction of an Inspector of the Local Authority, or have been slaughtered, and thereupon it shall be unlawful to move the sheep in contravention of the notice.

(2.) The dipping required may, if the Inspector considers it desirable, be a double dipping on separate dates with an interval of not less than ten and not more than twenty-one days between the two dates.

*Licences after Completion of Movement.*

16. Where sheep are moved with a licence under this Order, the licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station in the same District by the person in charge of the sheep at the time of completing the said movement.

*General Provisions as to Movement.*

17. Sheep, while being moved under this Order, shall be kept as far as practicable separate from all other sheep, and, if moved with a licence, shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the place of destination specified in the licence, and not elsewhere.

*Provision for Movement through Dipping Area.*

18. For the purposes of this Order, sheep shall not be deemed to be moved out of the Dipping Area—

(i.) where they are moved through the Area by railway from a place outside the Area to another place outside the Area without unnecessary delay and without the sheep being untrucked within the Area; or

(ii.) where they are moved through the Area by road from a place outside the Area to another place outside the Area, provided that such movement is authorised by a licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District of the place where the sheep enter the Area; or

(iii.) where they are moved through the Area under and in accordance with any Order of the Board or any licence issued thereunder.

*Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.*

19.—(1.) Any person in charge of a sheep being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the licence, if any, authorising the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector, or other officer.

*Local Authority to enforce Order.*

20. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

*Offences.*

21.—(1.) If a sheep is not dipped as required by this Order, the owner and person in charge of the sheep at the expiration of the period within which its dipping is required by this Order shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If a sheep is permitted to enter, or is exposed for sale in, any market, fairground, saleyard, or place of exhibition, in contravention of this Order, the occupier of the premises, and the owner and person in charge of the sheep, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3.) If a sheep is not isolated as required by this Order, the owner of the sheep, and the person in charge thereof, and the occupier of the place where the sheep is detained, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(4.) If a sheep is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the sheep, and the person in charge thereof, and the person

causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the sheep, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the sheep is moved shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(5.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by clipping, or washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted or stamped on any sheep, as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the sheep, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(6.) If a person in charge of a sheep, where under this Order a licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(7.) If any person fails to deliver up or send a licence or return as required by this Order, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

#### *Interpretation.*

22. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires—

“Efficient sheep-dip” means a sheep-dip approved by the Board for sheep-scab, or purporting to be so approved:

“Inspector” includes Veterinary Inspector:

“The Board” means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries:

“The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

#### *Revocation of Order.*

23. The Order described in the Third Schedule hereto is hereby revoked.

#### *Commencement.*

24. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of September, nineteen hundred and twelve.

#### *Short Title.*

25. This Order may be cited as the YORKSHIRE (WEST RIDING) AND PEAK DISTRICT (SHEEP-DIPPING) ORDER OF 1912.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

*Withdrawal of Existing Orders.*

1. The provisions of the Lancashire and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Orders of 1912 (Nos. 9-13 inclusive) shall cease to operate, and instead of those provisions the following provisions shall take effect.

PART I.

*Prohibition of Movement into, out of, or within certain Prohibited Area.*

2. No animal shall be moved into or out of, or along, over or across a highway or thoroughfare within the Area described in the First Schedule to this Order (hereinafter referred to as the "Prohibited Area"), or be permitted by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon any such highway or thoroughfare, and no Movement Licence shall be granted under this Order by an Inspector of a Local Authority which would involve such movement.

*Prohibition of Movement out of certain Areas.*

3. No animal shall be moved out of any Area described in the Second Schedule to this Order.

PART II.

*Movement out of Oldham Zone for immediate slaughter only.*

4.—(1.) No animal shall be moved out of the Zone described in the Third Schedule to this Order (hereinafter referred to as the Oldham

Zone), except to a slaughterhouse, and then only if the animal is accompanied by a Movement Licence authorizing such movement, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the premises from which the animal is to be moved are situate, and is marked before the movement is commenced, by and at the expense of the owner, in the manner following:—

*Cattle.*—By the clipping of a broad arrow ↑ about six inches long on the left hind-quarter of each of the cattle and by the clipping of the hair off the end of the tail.

*Sheep.*—By the clipping of a broad arrow ↑ on the forehead of each of the sheep, and by the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on both sides of each of the sheep with the following composition, namely: Rosin, five parts; oil of turpentine, two parts; and blue or red ochre, one part; melted and used warm; or with some other adhesive composition of a blue or red colour.

*Swine.*—By the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on both sides of each of the swine with the composition above mentioned.

(2.) Every Licence shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted, the number and description of the animals authorized to be moved, and the name or description of the several premises to and from which the animals are authorized to be moved.

(3.) Where animals are moved with a Licence under this Order the Licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up to an officer of the Local Authority or be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station in the same District by the person in charge of the animals at the time of completing the movement.

(4.) A Movement Licence granted under this Article, except where it is otherwise expressly authorized by this Order, shall be in force for four days, inclusive of the day of issue.

(5.) Animals while being moved with a Licence under this Order shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all animals which are not being so moved, and shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the slaughterhouse specified in the Licence, where they shall be detained until they are slaughtered.

(6.) Movement of animals with a Licence under this Order is subject to any other Order of the Board, and also subject to any Regulation made by a Local Authority under any Order of the Board for prohibiting or regulating the movement of animals.

(7.) A Movement Licence granted under this Order shall not be available if granted by the owner of the animal to be moved, or by his agent, or by the consignee of the animal, or by the occupier of the farm or premises or slaughterhouse from or to which the animal is to be moved, or by any individual member of an Executive Committee or Sub-Committee of a Local Authority.

(8.) A copy of a Licence which authorizes movement to premises in a District other than the District for which the person granting the Licence acts as Inspector shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination is situate.

#### *Regulation of Markets, &c., in the Oldham Zone.*

5. No market, fair, sale or exhibition of animals shall be held in the Oldham Zone except in accordance with the following provisions:—

(i.) A market or sale may be held on any premises in the Oldham Zone if the Local Authority are satisfied that the market or sale will be restricted to animals intended for immediate slaughter and the market or sale is authorized by the Local Authority under this Order.

(ii.) The Local Authority shall cause a Veterinary Inspector to attend at every market or sale authorized under this Order and examine the animals exposed thereat.

#### PART III.

##### *Provisions as to Markets, &c., in Zone II.*

6.—(1.) No market, fair, or sale of animals shall be held in Zone II, as described in the Fourth Schedule hereto, except in accordance with the following provisions:—

(i.) A market, fair or sale may be held on any premises in Zone II if the market, fair or sale is authorized by the Local Authority under this Order.

(ii.) The Local Authority shall cause at least one Veterinary Inspector to attend at every market, fair or sale authorized under this Order, and examine the animals exposed thereat.

(2.) No exhibition of animals shall be held in Zone II.

#### PART IV.—GENERAL.

##### *Movement of Animals through Zones or Areas by Railway.*

7. For the purposes of this Order an animal shall not be deemed to be moved into or out of any Zone or Area herein referred to where it is moved through such Zone or Area by railway from a place outside such Zone or Area to another place outside such Zone or Area without unnecessary delay and without the animal being untrucked within such Zone or Area.

##### *Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.*

8.—(1.) Any person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read, and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer:

##### *Local Authority to enforce Order.*

9. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

##### *Offences.*

10.—(1.) If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the animal and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the animal is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If a person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted on any animal as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

##### *Interpretation.*

11. In this Order—

“The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

“The Board” means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.

“Animals” means cattle, sheep, goats, and swine.

“Slaughterhouse” means any premises where animals are habitually slaughtered, and includes a bacon factory.

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

##### *Commencement.*

12. This Order shall come into operation on the twelfth day of August, nineteen hundred and twelve.

1. The Leicestershire and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1912 and the Leicestershire and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Orders of 1912 (Nos. 4, 5, and 6), all of which are hereinafter referred to as "the existing Orders," are modified in manner hereinafter appearing.

*Contraction of Limits of Prohibited Area.*

2. The area described in the Schedule here-to shall be substituted for the Prohibited Area described in the Second Schedule to the Leicestershire and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1912 (No. 6), hereinafter referred to as Order (No. 6), and that Order and this Order shall be read and have effect accordingly.

*Withdrawal of Restrictions from Zone II.*

3.—(1.) The provisions of the existing Orders which refer or relate to Zone II shall cease to operate as regards that Zone.

(2.) Nothing in this Article shall apply to Zone I which shall cease to be treated as part of Zone II.

*Movement out of Zone I for immediate slaughter only.*

4.—(1.) No animal shall be moved out of Zone I unless it is moved direct—

(a) to a slaughterhouse; or

(b) to a market or sale within the county borough of Leicester which has been specially authorised by the Local Authority of that borough under this Article for the exposure thereof of animals intended for immediate slaughter only.

(2.) The animal must in each case be accompanied by a Movement Licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the premises from which the animal is to be moved are situate.

(3.) In the case of movement to a slaughterhouse, where the slaughterhouse is not in

Zone Ia, the animal shall be marked before the movement is commenced, by and at the expense of the owner, in the manner prescribed in Article 5 (1.) of the Leicestershire and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1912 (No. 4), hereinafter referred to as Order (No. 4).

4. If the Local Authority of the county borough of Leicester, for the purposes of this Article, specially authorise the holding of a market or sale in that borough of animals intended for immediate slaughter only, an animal exposed for sale at any such market or sale shall not be moved out of the market or saleyard unless it is accompanied by a Licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the said borough and only to a slaughter-house, which shall be specified in the licence. The animal shall be marked before the movement from the market or saleyard is commenced by and at the expense of the owner in the manner prescribed in Article 5 (1.) of Order (No. 4).

*Markets in Zone I.*

5. The existing restrictions applicable to markets, fairs, sales and exhibitions in Zone I shall remain in force.

*Alteration of Limits of Zone Ia.*

6. The Zone Ia described in the Schedule to this Order shall be substituted for the Zone Ia described in the First Schedule to Order (No. 6), and that Order and this Order shall be read and have effect accordingly.

*Movement out of Zone Ia for Immediate Slaughter Only.*

7. The prohibition of movement of animals contained in the Leicestershire and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1912 shall not apply to any movement of an animal out of Zone Ia to a slaughter-house not being situate in the Prohibited Area if the animal is accompanied by a Movement Licence authorising such movement, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the premises from which the animal is to be moved are situate, provided that, in any case in which the place of destination is outside Zone I, the animal is marked before the movement is commenced, by and at the expense of the owner, in the manner prescribed in Article 5 (1.) of Order (No. 4).

*Copies of Movement Licences to be sent to Local Authority of place of Destination.*

8. A copy of a Licence which authorises movement to premises in a District other than the District for which the person granting the Licence acts as Inspector shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination is situate.

*Commencement.*

9. This Order shall come into operation on the twelfth day of August, nineteen hundred and twelve.

*Short Title, &c.*

10. This Order may be cited as the LEICESTERSHIRE AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1912 (No. 7), and shall be read with the existing Orders.

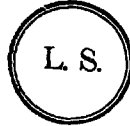

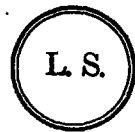

The Local Authority of any District specified in the Schedule to this Order may, in accordance with the provisions of this Order, make Regulations, with a view to the prevention of worrying of cattle (including sheep), for requiring that dogs or any class of dogs shall, during all or any of the hours between sunset and sunrise, be kept by the owners thereof under control in manner prescribed by the Regulations.

(2.) The Regulations may apply to the whole or any part of the District, and may exempt any class of dogs either generally or under prescribed conditions.

*Confirmation of Regulations.*

2.—(1.) Regulations made under this Order shall not take effect unless and until they have been submitted to and confirmed by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.

(2.) Unless the Board otherwise direct, the following provisions shall apply—

(i.) Notice of intention to apply for confirmation of any Regulations shall be given in one or more of the local news-

papers circulating within the District in two successive issues two weeks at least before the making of the application.

(ii.) For two weeks at least before an application, a copy of the Regulations proposed to be confirmed shall be kept at the office of the Local Authority of the District, and be open during office hours thereat to the inspection of ratepayers of the District without fee or reward.

(iii.) The Clerk of the Local Authority shall on the application of any such ratepayer furnish him with a copy of the proposed Regulations on payment of sixpence.

(3.) A copy of any Regulations made by a Local Authority under this Order, signed and certified by the Clerk of that Local Authority to be a true copy and to have been duly confirmed, shall be evidence, until the contrary is proved, in all legal proceedings, of the due making, confirmation, and existence of the Regulations without further or other proof.

*Seizure of Dogs where Regulations are Contravened.*

3. Any dog in respect of which an offence is being committed against a Regulation made under this Order may be seized and treated as a stray dog under the powers conferred by section three of the Dogs Act, 1906.

*Extension of Definition in Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.*

4. Dogs shall be animals for the purposes of the following sections of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894 (namely):—

Section forty-three (*Police*);

Section forty-four (*General administrative provisions*);

and also for the purposes of all other sections of the said Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those sections and this Order, including such sections as relate to offences and legal proceedings.

*Local Authority to enforce Order.*

5. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

*Local Authority to Enforce Order.*

4. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

*Offences.*

5. If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to

have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the animal is moved shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

*Commencement.*

6. This Order shall come into operation on the fourteenth day of August, nineteen hundred and twelve.

*Withdrawal of Existing Orders.*

1. The provisions of the Yorkshire (West Riding) (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Orders of 1912 (Nos. 5, 6, 7, 8 and 9) shall cease to operate, and instead of those provisions the following provisions shall take effect:—

*Continued Prohibition of Movement into, out of, or within certain Prohibited Area.*

2. No animal shall be moved into, or out of, or along, over, or across a highway or thoroughfare within the Area described in the First Schedule to this Order (hereinafter referred to as the "Prohibited Area"), or be permitted by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon any such highway or thoroughfare in the Prohibited Area.

*Prohibition of Movement out of certain Areas.*

3. No animal shall be moved out of any Area described in the Second Schedule to this Order.

*Regulation of Markets, etc., of Animals.*

4.—(1.) No market, fair, or sale of animals shall be held in the District described in the Third Schedule to this Order, except in accordance with the following provisions:—

(i.) A market, fair, or sale may be held on any premises in the said District if the market, fair, or sale is authorised by the Local Authority under this Order.

(ii.) The Local Authority shall cause at least one Veterinary Inspector to attend at every market, fair, or sale authorised under this Order, and examine the animals exposed thereat.

(2.) No exhibition of animals shall be held in the said District.

*Movement of Animals through Areas by Railway.*

5. For the purposes of this Order, an animal shall not be deemed to be moved into or out of an Area where it is moved through such Area by railway from a place outside such Area to another place outside such Area, without unnecessary delay and without the animals being untrucked within such Area.

*Local Authority to Enforce Order.*

6. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

*Offences.*

7. If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the animal is moved shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

*Interpretation.*

8. In this Order—

"The Act of 1894" means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

"Animals" means cattle, sheep, goats, and swine.

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

*Commencement.*

9. This Order shall come into operation on the fourteenth day of August, nineteen hundred and twelve.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order; and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

*Modification of Order.*

1. The Durham and Northumberland (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1912 (No. 9) (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order") is modified in manner hereinafter appearing.

PART I.

*Holding of Markets, &c.*

2.—(1.) A market or sale of animals may be held in any of the Prohibited Areas referred to in the principal Order (except those in the Chollerton District), or in Zone Ia or Zone Ib, subject to the conditions specified in paragraphs (3) and (5) of Article 2 of the principal Order, except that in the case of any such market or sale held in one of the aforesaid Prohibited Areas no licence shall be granted for the movement of an animal therefrom to a slaughterhouse situate outside the Area to which the principal Order applies.

(2.) A market, fair, or sale of animals may be held in Zone IIa or Zone IIb subject to the conditions specified in paragraphs (4) and (5) of Article 2 of the principal Order.

PART II.

*Movement by Licence out of Zone I for Slaughter and into Zone I for any Purpose.*

3.—(1.) An animal may be moved out of Zone I to a slaughterhouse, provided that such slaughterhouse is situate within the Area to which the principal Order applies, if the animal is accompanied by a Movement Licence authorizing such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the premises from which the animal is to be moved are situate, and provided also that the animal is marked before the movement is commenced by and at the expense of the owner, in the manner prescribed in Article 8 (3) of the principal Order.

(2.) Where an Inspector of the Local Authority of the county of Northumberland considers it necessary or expedient that an animal should be permitted to be moved into

Zone I for any purpose, the Inspector may authorize such movement by a Movement Licence, and where the premises from which the animal is to be moved are situate in Zone II any such Movement Licence shall be regarded as authorizing the movement of the animal out of Zone II.

PART III.

*Contraction of Limits of Prohibited Area.*

4. The Prohibited Area described in the Schedule hereto shall be substituted for the Prohibited Area No. 1a (in the Chollerton District) described in the Second Schedule to the principal Order, and Part II of the principal Order shall apply to that Area accordingly.

*Movement Into, Within, or Out of Certain Prohibited Areas in the Chollerton District.*

5. An animal may be moved into, or out of, or along, over, or across a highway or thoroughfare within either of the Prohibited Areas numbered 1b and 1c (in the Chollerton District) described in the Second Schedule to the principal Order, subject to and in accordance with the provisions as to movement into, within and out of Zone I contained in Part III of the principal Order as amended by Part II of this Order, and Part II of the principal Order shall in its application to those Areas be modified accordingly.

*Movement Into, Within, or Out of Prohibited Areas in the Morpeth and Alnwick Districts and Benwell (Newcastle-upon-Tyne) and Norwood (Gateshead) Prohibited Areas.*

6.—(1.) The prohibition on the movement of animals contained in Part II of the principal Order as amended by this Order shall not apply to the movement of an animal into or within any of the Prohibited Areas referred to in the principal Order, except those in the Chollerton District.

(2.) An animal may be moved out of any of the Prohibited Areas to which this Article applies to a slaughterhouse, provided that such slaughterhouse is situate within the Area to which the principal Order applies, if the animal is accompanied by a Movement Licence authorizing such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the premises from which the animal is to be moved are situate, and provided also that the animal is marked before the movement is commenced, by and at the expense of the owner, in the manner prescribed in Article 8 (3) of the principal Order.

PART IV.

*Withdrawal of Movement Restrictions from Zones IIa and IIb; Free Movement Into and Within Zones Ia and Ib; and Movement Out of Zones Ia and Ib for Slaughter Only.*

7.—(1.) Parts IV and V of the principal Order are hereby revoked.

(2.) The provisions of Article 8 of the principal Order shall apply to the movement of an animal out of Zone Ia or Zone Ib, except that the animal shall be required to be marked before the movement is commenced only in the case of movement to a slaughterhouse not

situate in Zone I or in any Prohibited Area into which movement is authorized by this Order.

(3.) Where any farm (except any detached part) is partly within Zone Ia or Zone Ib, and partly without Zone Ia or Zone Ib respectively, the whole shall be deemed to be within Zone Ia or Zone Ib, as the case may be.

*Commencement.*

8. This Order shall come into operation on the fifteenth day of August, nineteen hundred and twelve.

*Short Title.*

9. This Order may be cited as the DURHAM AND NORTHUMBERLAND (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1912 (No. 11), and shall be read with the principal Order.
