The following Addresses were presented to The King, on Their Majesties' visit to Winchester, on Monday, the 15th July:---

WINCHESTER CORPORATION ADDRESS.

To Their Most Excellent Majesties King George and Queen Mary.

May it please your Majesties,

We, The Mayor, Aldermen, and Citizens of the City of Winchester, desire to approach your Majesties with the expression of our unfailing allegiance to the Throne on this Your first public visit to our Ancient and loyal City since Your Majesty's Accession.

We are deeply sensible of the great honour conferred upon our City by Your Majesties' graciousness in being present here to-day to attend the Service of Thanksgiving to Almighty God for the completion of the restoration of our glorious and historic Cathedral, which has had so close a connection with some of Your Majesty's predecessors on the Throne. Within its hallowed walls lies the dust of Kings, Alfred's Ancestor's and his successors: thirtyfive of his line made Winchester their Capital, twenty lie buried within its area, with Canuto and his son, Rufus and Prince Richard the sons of the Conqueror.

Our City has been the scene of many events of interest and importance in the history of the English people, and though it is no longer a Royal Residence, and with the march of history has yielded its position as the Capital of England, it would still humbly claim to be allowed to welcome your Majesties with heartfelt devotion and loyalty.

We fervently pray that with God's blessing your Majesties may ever enjoy the united love and affection of your faithful subjects.

To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious Answer-

I thank you sincerely on behalf of the Queen and Myself for your loyal Address of Welcome. It is a great pleasure to Us to visit your famous City, the ancient capital of this Country, and I am glad to remember its close associations with so many of my Ancestors. Few cities can claim to have played so notable a part in the early history of this Realm, and your citizens may feel just pride in the memories of the past brought constantly before them by the many old buildings which are still happily preserved to adorn your beautiful City.

We rejoice with you that the magnificent Cathedral which has stood for many centuries as a monument of the piety and art of our forefathers, has by a triumph of engineering knowledge been saved from imminent risk of ruin. We give thanks to God that the devout faith which inspired the raising of this great fabric so many years ago has been manifested again in the patient and skilful labours of those who worked to renew the foundations and in the liberality of the many persons who contributed to the heavy cost.

After attending the service of thanksgiving for the completion of the restoration of the Cathedral, Their Majesties proceeded to Winchester College, where the following Address of Welcome was read by the Senior Scholar:----

WINCHESTER COLLEGE ADDRESS.

Salve ad portas nostras, O Rex et Imperator, tuque, gratiosissima Regina, salve.

English Version.

At our gates we bid you welcome, our King and Emperor, and you, Most Gracious Queen, do we bid welcome !

Happy and fortunate for us all be the day on which you enter this retreat of the muses and very heart of Wykeham's House, which has enjoyed for five hundred years the singular favour of our Kings, and now joyfully pays you its due of honour, gratitude, and loyalty.

Of the many Kings our benefactors, Henry the Sixth took this Heuse as his model when founding Eton College, Queen Elizabeth twice entered this place, as did later King Charles the First and King Charles the Second; and especially your Majesty's own great-great-grandfather, King George the Third, visited it with most loving care. Your Majesty is the fifth after him to encourage higher studies and to reward our efforts in writing and in speech by the gift of gold and silver medals. Unto your Majesty are we bound by still closer ties of love, for in this place you stand where stood your grandfather and your father before you. Nay, were we silent, thrice might you have heard, as it were, the very voice of Wykeham. For coming from Wykeham's royal tower to see Wykeham's Cathedral, happily now restored, you here gaze on a third building of Wykeham, who has left us a triple reminder of a Christian's triple duty, that so long as his building stood we Wykehamist brethren should ever "love the brotherhood, fear God, honour the King."

These, our founder's lessons, dutifully and religiously followed for five hundred years, have impelled an almost infinite number of his sons, in Church and in State, with sword and with pen, to bear a man's part in serving their country, their King and their God.

And so in approving the zeal of Wykehamists your Majesty has followed the glorious example of your Majesty's father, Edward the Peacemaker. He chose one of our company to govern a happily reunited Africa: your Majesty entrusts, amid general praise, that heavy burden, the foreign affairs of the Realm, to one of Wykeham's sons. Now that your Majesties have come to us after the happy conclusion of your recert Indian tour, rich in the praise not of this country only but of the whole Empire,

"Now my voice—if that anything worth hearing

I can speak—shall be heard exclaiming 'O day Beautiful, ever worthy to be praised for Caesar's returning.'"

Finally we pray Almighty God that the years to come of your Majesties' reign may be many and may fully answer to so fair a beginning.

To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious Answer—

The Queen and I have received your Address of Welcome with great pleasure, and we thank you heartily for your congratulations on the happy completion of our visit to Our Indian Empire and for your good wishes for the years to come.

Winchester, which is among the oldest and most famous of our great Public Schools, may well pride itself on the achievements of those who have been trained within its walls, and whose names engraved thereon have attained lasting fame. You do well to remind Us, too, of those distinguished Wykehamists who now serve the State in positions of great responsibility in this country and in Our Dominions.

It is with very special interest that We stand for the first time among these ancient and historic buildings, which the passage of five centuries has not altered save by adding a greater charm to their stately beauty, and upon the very spot where many British Sovereigns have been greeted in the time-honoured manner Ad Portas. We rejoice to see that, on the foundations laid so long ago by William of Wykeham, a corporate life flourishes in full vigour, and that above all you preserve and cherish the fine tradition embodied in his famous motto "Manners Makyth Man."

It is your privilege to enter into a noble heritage. We trust that the rich memories of the past may help you to reach that high standard of public service put before you by so many who have belonged to this ancient foundation, and that you may make good use of the. time you spend at Winchester to equip yourselves for the responsibilities and duties of your later years.

The minimum or lowest time rate for learners under 14 years of age shall be 3s. a week, and on reaching the age of 14 they shall be entitled to the amounts shown in column 1 above as if they had commenced at 14.

The learners' rates are weekly rates based on a week of 50 hours, but they shall be subject to a proportionate deduction or increase according as the number of hours actually spent by the learner in the factory or workshop in any week is less or more than 50.

Movement into, out of, or within Scheduled District.

1.--(1.) No cattle, sheep, goats or swine shall be landed in or moved into or out of the District described in the Schedule to this Order, hereinafter referred \mathbf{the} to as Scheduled District, or be moved along, over, or across, or be allowed by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon a highway or thoroughfare within the Scheduled District; provided that nothing in this Order shall be deemed to apply to the movement of animals into or out of the Scheduled District where they are moved through such District by railway from a place outside such District to another place outside such District without unnecessary delay and without the animals being untrucked within such District.

(2.) If any farm (except any detached part) is partly within and partly without the Scheduled District, the whole shall be deemed to be within the Scheduled District.

Restriction of Movement of Persons in Certain Cases.

2.—(1.) An Inspector of the Local Authority acting under their direction may serve a Notice on the occupier of any field, shed, or other place in the Scheduled District, prohibiting the entry of any person into any such field, shed or other place, and thereupon, notwithstanding the existence of any footpath or right of way, no person shall enter the field, shed, or other place to which the Notice relates while any cattle, sheep, goats or swine are therein, otherwise than in accordance with the following regulations, that is to say:—

(i.) The owner of the field, shed, or other place, or of the animals therein, or the agent or servants of such owner, may enter such field, shed, or other place so far as may be necessary for the feeding or tending of the animals.

(ii.) Any other person may enter such field, shed, or other place with a licence of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.

(2.) Copies of such Notice shall be affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner as he shall think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions hereby imposed.

(3.) A copy of every such Notice shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector to the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, 4, Whitehall Place, London, S.W.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

3. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

4.—(1.) If an animal is landed in contravention of this Order the owner and the charterer and the master of the vessel from which it is landed, and the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing or permitting the landing, and the person landing the same, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been landed in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2.) If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the animal is moved shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(3.) If any person enters any field, shed, or other place in contravention of this Order, or of a Notice served thereunder, such person shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.
