TRADE BOARDS ACT, 1909.

In accordance with Regulations made under section 18 of the above Act, by the Board of Trade, and dated 27th April, 1910, the Trade Board established under the above Act for those branches of the ready-made and whole-sale bespoke tailoring trade in Great Britain which are engaged in making garments to be worn by male persons, have given notice, as required by section 4 (3) of the above Act, that they have fixed the following minimum time rates of wages, to come into force on 19th August, 1912:—

MINIMUM TIME RATES FOR FEMALE WORKERS.

- (1) For female workers other than homeworkers, 3¹/₄d. an hour.
 - (2) For female homeworkers, 31d. an hour.

The minimum or lowest time rate for learners under 14 years of age shall be 3s. a week, and on reaching the age of 14 they shall be entitled to the amounts shown in column 1 above as if they had commenced at 14.

The learners' rates are weekly rates based on a week of 50 hours, but they shall be subject to a proportionate deduction or increase according as the number of hours actually spent by the learner in the factory or workshop in any week is less or more than 50.

The advances to be given to learners shall be paid on the first pay days in January and July, the learner being entitled to her first advance on the first of such pay days following her entry into the trade, provided that she has been in the trade at least three months.

The above rates shall apply to all female
