ORDER OF 1912 (No. 14).**

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

*Amendment of Orders in respect of a
Prohibited Area.*

1. The Durham and Northumberland (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Orders of 1912 (Nos. 9, 10, 11, 12 and 13) shall apply to the Prohibited Area described in the Schedule hereto as if it were the Prohibited Area No. 1a (in the Chollerton District), described in those Orders.

Short Title.

2. This Order may be cited as the DURHAM AND NORTHUMBERLAND (FOOT - AND - MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1912 (No. 14), and shall

be read with the Orders referred to in Article 1.

SCHEDULE.

Prohibited Area No. 1a.

An Area in the administrative county of Northumberland, comprising the parishes of Hallington, Ryal, Kearsley, Ingoe, Fenwick, Little Bavington, that part of the parish of Chollerton which lies to the east of Watling Street and Dry Burn, that part of the parish of Bingfield which lies to the east of Watling Street, that part of the parish of Cocklaw which lies to the east of Watling Street and to the north of the road leading from Bewclay to Matfen, that part of the parish of Great Whittington which lies to the north of the road leading from Bewclay to Matfen (*via Rose's Bower and Great Whittington*), that part of the parish of West Matfen which lies to the north of the river Pont, and such parts of the parishes of Thockrington and Great Bavington as lie to the south of the road leading from Colt Crag Reservoir to Kirkharle (*via Thockrington village, New Onstead and Great Bavington village*).
