#### WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (County Borough of Walsall) Order, 1912.

Dated 17th September, 1912.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the Council of the County Borough of Walsall, I hereby make the following Order:—

#### Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (County Borough of Walsall) Order, 1912."

#### 。 BIRDS.

#### Close Time Extended.

II. The time during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall be extended throughout the County Borough of Walsall, so far as concerns all Wild Birds except Woodcock, so as to be between the 1st day of March and the 12th day of August in any year.

The close time for Woodcock is hereby extended so as to be between the 1st lay of February and the 12th day of August in any year.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880,

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the County Borough of Walsall to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:—

Hedge Accentor (Hedge Sparrow), Bunting (all species), Chiffchaff, Tree Creeper, Dipper or Water Ouzel, Golden Eagle, Sea Eagle, Peregrine Falcon, Pied Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher, Hobby, Kite, House Martin, Sand Martin, Merlin, Nuthatch, Osprey, Ring Ouzel, Redstart, Robin, Great Grey Shrike, Lesser Grey Shrike, Red-backed Shrike, Woodchat Shrike, Stonechat, Swallow, Swift, Wagtail (all species), Aquatic Warbler, Blackcap Warbler, Dartford Warbler, Garden Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Marsh Warbler, Reed Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Willow Warbler, Wood Warbler, Wheatear, Whinchat, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Common Wren, Fire-crested Wren, Golden-crested Wren, Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snakebird).

#### The House Sparrow deprived of protection.

IV. The County Borough of Walsall is hereby exempted from the operation of the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, so far as the House Sparrow is concerned.

## Certain Birds protected during the whole of the year.

V. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880 (as extended by Clause II of this Order), does not apply, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County Borough of Walsall:—

Hedge Accentor (Hedge Sparrow), Bittern (all species), Bunting (all species), Chiffchaff, Tree Creeper, Dipper or Water Ouzel, Golden Eagle, Sea Eagle, Peregrine Falcon, Pied Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher, Goldfinch, Grebe (all species), Hobby, Hoopoe, Kingfisher, Kite, House Martin, Sand Martin, Merlin, Nightingale, Nightjar (Goat Sucker, Night Hawk or Fern Owl), Nuthatch, Osprey, Ring Ouzel, Owl (all species), Redstart, Robin, Shrike (all species), Stonechat, Swallow, Swift, Wagtail (all species), Aquatic Warbler, Blackcap Warbler, Dartford Warbler, Garden Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Marsh Warbler, Reed Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Willow Warbler, Wood Warbler, Wheatear, Whinchat, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker, Common Wren, Firecrested Wren, Golden-crested Wren, Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snakebird).

#### Sunday Protection.

VI. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880 (as extended by Clause II of this Order), does not apply, the killing or taking of Wild Birds on Sundays is prohibited throughout the County Borough of Walsall.

#### Eccs.

#### Certain Eggs protected throughout the County Borough.

VII. The taking or destroying of the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds, also the eggs of the Birds added by Clause III of this Order to the Schedule to the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as amended by the Act of 1881, is prohibited within the County Borough of Walsall:—

American Quail or Colin, Auk, Avocet, Beeeater, Bittern, Common Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Cornish Chough, Corn Crake (Land Rail), Spotted Crake, Cuckoo, Curlew or Whaup, Dotterel, Dunlin (Ox Bird, Ploverspage, Purre or Sea-lark), Eider-Goose, duck, Fulmar, Gannet or Solan Godwit, -- Goldfinch, Grebe, Greenshank, Guillemot (Marrot, Murre, Scout or Willock), Gull or Seamew (except Black-backed Gull), Hoopoe, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Kittiwake or Tarrock, Lark, Loon or Diver, Mallard, Mer-ganser, Nightingale, Nightjar (Night Hawk, Fern Owl, Goat Sucker), Oriole, Owl, Oyster Catcher, Petrel, Phalarope, Plover (except Lapwing, Peewit or Green Plover), Pochard or Dunbird, Puffin (Coulterneb or Sea Parrot), Water Rail, Razorbill, Redshank, Reeve or Ruff, Roller, Sanderling, Sandpiper (Summer Snipe), Shearwater, Sheldrake, Shoveller, Skua or Bonxie, Smew, Snipe, Spoonbill, Stint, Stone Curlew or Thick-knee, Stonehatch (Ringed Plover), Teal, Tern or Sea Swallow, Tystey, Whimbrel, Widgeon, Wild Duck, Woodcock, Woodpecker.

The taking or destroying of the eggs of the Lapwing, Peewit, or Green Plover is prohibited after April 7th in each year.

#### TRADE BOARDS ACT, 1909.

#### Order of the Board of Trade under Section 5 (2).

Whereas by section 4 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, it is, amongst other things, provided as follows:—

(1.) Trade Boards shall, subject to the provisions of this section, fix minimum rates of wages for timework for their trades (in this Act referred to as minimum time-rates), and may also fix general minimum rates of wages for piecework for their trades (in this Act referred to as general minimum piece-rates), and those rates of wages (whether time or piecerates) may be fixed so as to apply universally to the trade, or so as to apply to any special process in the work of the trade or to any special class of workers in the trade, or to any special area.

If a Trade Board report to the Board of Trade that it is impracticable in any case to fix a minimum time-rate in accordance with this section, the Board of Trade may so far as respects that case relieve the Trade Board of their duty.

(2.) Before fixing any minimum time-rate or general minimum piece-rate, the Trade Board shall give notice of the rate which they propose to fix and consider any objections to the rate which may be lodged with them within three months.

(3.) The Trade Board shall give notice of any minimum time-rate or general minimum piece-rate fixed by them.

And whereas by section 5 of the said Act it is amongst other things provided:

(1.) Until a minimum time-rate or general minimum piece-rate fixed by a Trade Board has been made obligatory by order of the Board of Trade under this section, the operation of the rate shall be limited as in this Act provided.

(2.) Upon the expiration of six months from the date on which a Trade Board have given notice of any minimum time-rate or general minimum piece-rate fixed by them, the Board of Trade shall make an order (in this Act referred to as an obligatory order) making that minimum rate obligatory order) making that minimum rate obligatory in cases in which it is applicable on all persons employing labour and on all persons employed, unless they are of opinion that the circumstances are such as to make it premature or otherwise undesirable to make an obligatory order, and in that case they shall make an order suspending the obligatory operation of the rate (in this Act referred to as an order of suspension).

And whereas on the 14th day of March, 1912, the Trade Board established under the said Act for that branch of the Lace Trade which is engaged in Machine-made Lace and Net Finishing, other than the finishing of the product of Plain Net machines, gave notice that they had fixed general minimum piecerates for the Finishing of Machine-made Lace and Net which are the product of Warp machines, for the processes more specifically set forth in the notice thereof, and the rates fixed are set out in the Schedule hereto:

And whereas the said rates have been in limited operation since the 14th day of March, 1912:

Now therefore the Board of Trade, in pursuance of the powers in them vested, as before recited, do by this order make the said General Minimum Piece-rates fixed by the said Trade Board and set out in the said Schedule hereto, obligatory in cases in which they are applicable on all persons employing labour and on all persons employed in the said trade.

Cases of cholera having been officially ascertained at Damascus, arrivals from the port of Beirut (Syria) will be treated according to Government Circular of the 12th August, 1904, No. 12468, by which the regulations of the International Sanitary Conference of Paris (1903) were published with reference to the Maritime Sanitary Service.

Plague and cholera in endemic form existing in Further India, all arrivals from the ports situated along the littoral from the eastern limit of British India to the limit of China (Singapur included) will be treated according to Government Circular of the 12th August, 1904, No. 12468, by which the Regulations of the International Conference of Paris (1903) were published with reference to the Maritime Sanitary Service.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

#### Movement into, out of, or within Scheduled District.

1.—(1.) No cattle, sheep, goats or swine shall be landed in or moved into or out of the District described in the Schedule to this Order, hereinafter referred to as the Scheduled District, or be moved along, over, or across, or be allowed by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon a highway or thoroughfare within the Scheduled District; provided that nothing in this Order shall be deemed to apply to the movement of animals into or out of the Scheduled District where they are moved through such District by railway from a place outside such District to another place outside such District without unnecessary delay and without the animals being untrucked within such District.

(2.) If any farm (except any detached part) is partly within and partly without the Scheduled District, the whole shall be deemed to be within the Scheduled District.

#### Power to Restrict Movement of Persons in Certain Cases.

2.—(1.) An Inspector of the Local Authority, acting under their direction, may serve a Notice on the occupier of any field, shed, or other place in the Scheduled District, prohibiting the entry of any person into any such field, shed, or other place, and thereupon, notwithstanding the existence of any footpath or right of way, no person shall enter the field, shed, or other place to which the Notice relates while any cattle, sheep, goats, or swine are therein, otherwise than in accordance with the following regulations, that is to say:—

(i.) The owner of the field, shed, or other place, or of the animals therein, or the agent or servants of such owner, may enter such field, shed, or other place so far as may be necessary for the feeding or tending of the animals.

(ii.) Any other person may enter such field, shed, or other place with a Licence of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.

(2.) Copies of such Notice shall be affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner as he shall think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions hereby imposed.

(3.) A copy of every such Notice shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector to the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, 4, Whitehall Place, London, S.W.

#### Local Authority to Enforce Order.

3. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

#### Offences.

4.—(1.) If an animal is landed in contravention of this Order, the owner and the charterer and the master of the vessel from which it is landed, and the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing or permitting the landing, and the person landing the same, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been landed in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2.) If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the animal is moved shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(3.) If any person enters any field, shed, or other place in contravention of this Order, or of a Notice served thereunder, such person shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.
