throughout the County Borough of Walsall, so far as concerns all Wild Birds except Woodcock, so as to be between the 1st day of March and the 12th day of August in any year.

The close time for Woodcock is hereby extended so as to be between the 1st lay of February and the 12th day of August in any year.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880,

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the County Borough of Walsall to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:—

Hedge Accentor (Hedge Sparrow), Bunting (all species), Chiffchaff, Tree Creeper, Dipper or Water Ouzel, Golden Eagle, Sea Eagle, Peregrine Falcon, Pied Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher, Hobby, Kite, House Martin, Sand Martin, Merlin, Nuthatch, Osprey, Ring Ouzel, Redstart, Robin, Great Grey Shrike, Lesser Grey Shrike, Red-backed Shrike, Woodchat Shrike, Stonechat, Swallow, Swift, Wagtail (all species), Aquatic Warbler, Blackcap Warbler, Dartford Warbler, Graschopper Warbler, Marsh Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Marsh Warbler, Reed Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Willow Warbler, Wood Warbler, Wheatear, Whinchat, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Common Wren, Fire-crested Wren, Golden-crested Wren, Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snakebird).

The House Sparrow deprived of protection.

IV. The County Borough of Walsall is hereby exempted from the operation of the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, so far as the House Sparrow is concerned.

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the year.

V. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880 (as extended by Clause II of this Order), does not apply, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County Borough of Walsall:—

Hedge Accentor (Hedge Sparrow), Bittern (all species), Bunting (all species), Chiffchaff, Tree Creeper, Dipper or Water Ouzel, Golden Eagle, Sea Eagle, Peregrine Falcon, Pied Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher, Goldfinch, Grebe (all species), Hobby, Hoopoe, Kingfisher, Kite, House Martin, Sand Martin, Merlin, Nightingale, Nightjar (Goat Sucker, Night Hawk or Fern Owl), Nuthatch, Osprey, Ring Ouzel, Owl (all species), Redstart, Robin, Shrike (all species), Stonechat, Swallow, Swift, Wagtail (all species), Aquatic Warbler, Blackcap Warbler, Dartford Warbler, Garden Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Marsh Warbler, Reed Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Willow Warbler, Wood Warbler, Wheatear, Whinchat, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker, Common Wren, Firecrested Wren, Golden-crested Wren, Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snakebird).

Sunday Protection.

VI. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880 (as extended by Clause II of this Order), does not apply, the killing or taking of Wild Birds on Sundays is prohibited throughout the County Borough of Walsall.

Eggs.

Certain Eggs protected throughout the County
Borough.

VII. The taking or destroying of the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds, also the eggs of the Birds added by Clause III of this Order to the Schedule to the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as amended by the Act of 1881, is prohibited within the County Borough of Walsall:—

American Quail or Colin, Auk, Avocet, Beeester, Bittern, Common Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Cornish Chough, Corn Crake (Land Rail), Spotted Crake, Cuckoo, Curlew or Whaup, Dotterel, Dunlin (Ox Bird, Ploverspage, Purre or Sea-lark), Eiderduck, Fulmar, Gannet or Solan Goose, Godwit, Goldfinch, Grebe, Greenshank, Guillemot (Marrot, Murre, Scout or Willock), Gull or Seamew (except Black-backed Gull), Hoopoe, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Kittiwake or Tarrock, Lark, Loon or Diver, Mallard, Merganser, Nightingale, Nightjar (Night Hawk, Fern Owl, Goat Sucker), Oriole, Owl, Oyster Catcher, Petrel, Phalarope, Plover (except Lapwing, Peewit or Green Plover), Pochard or Dunbird, Puffin (Coulterneb or Sea Parrot), Water Rail, Razorbill, Redshank, Reeve or Ruff, Roller, Sanderling, Sandpiper (Summer Snipe), Shearwater, Sheldrake, Shoveller, Skua or Bonxie, Smew, Snipe, Spoonbill, Stint, Stone Curlew or Thick-knee, Stonehatch (Ringed Plover), Teal, Tern or Sea Swallow, Tystey, Whimbrel, Widgeon, Wild Duck, Woodcock, Woodpecker.

The taking or destroying of the eggs of the Lapwing, Peewit, or Green Plover is prohibited after April 7th in each year.
