Whitehall, September 24, 1912.

His Majesty the King has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal of the Second Class to David Wheal under the following circumstances:—

On the morning of the 15th of May, 1912, Wheal, who was a gate porter at St. Margaret's Station on the Great Eastern Railway, had been collecting tickets, and was waiting near the gates at the level-crossing for a train to pass. He knew that a train was approaching from the other direction and, after the last vehicle of the first train had passed, he saw an old lady, with her head bowed down, stepping in front of the oncoming train. He rushed forward and succeeded in forcing her back clear of the rails just as the locomotive was upon her. There is no doubt that she owes her life to Wheal's prompt action performed at great peril to himself.

His Majesty the King has been pleased to award the Edward Medal of the Second Class to Richard Brookes under the following circumstances:—

On the 8th of February, 1912, a workman named Thomas Rogers was repairing the spouting of a building at a height of 40 feet from the ground at the brewery of Messrs. Charrington and Co., Burton-on-Trent, when without warning the ladder on which he was standing broke, and he fell headforemost. Brookes, a fitter in the employment of Messrs. Charrington, rushed forward with outstretched arms and caught him as he fell, thereby saving Rogers' life at considerable risk to his own. His action was rendered more difficult and dangerous by his having to evade the portion of the ladder to which Rogers continued to cling as he fell.

His Majesty the King has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal of the Second Class to William Downing Wooley, Arthur Thomas Winborn, James Joseph Leach, and Llewellyn Howells under the following circumstances:—

On the 18th of May last an explosion of firedamp occurred at one of the pits which was in process of sinking at the Markham Colliery, Tredegar, and resulted in the death of five At the time of the explosion two men were down the shaft, which was then full of A rescue party was organised, afterdamp. consisting of the men above-mentioned, who descended the shaft, and after an hour's work reached the pump lodge room at a depth of 350 yards from the surface, where they found a man named Snashall, who was badly burned. After some difficulty they managed to get Snashall into the bucket, in which he was safely raised to the surface. All the rescuers were equipped with breathing apparatus, but Mr. Wooley had not previously worn it.

His Majesty the King has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal of the Second Class to Llewellyn Ince, Arthur Darby, and Shadrach Speke, and also to the widow of Shadrach Jackson under the following circumstances:—

On the 24th of July, 1912, a man named Heald descended into a melting furnace thirty feet high at the Darlaston Green Furnaces in order to adjust a piece of scrap iron under which some coke had to be placed. Heald descended into the furnace by a chain, and was almost immediately overcome by noxious gas which had collected there owing

to damp. A man standing at the top at once gave the alarm, and Shadrach Jackson and Ince came to his assistance. Jackson without hesitation slid down the chain, and a rope was thrown to him, which he tied round Heald, who was then pulled up, Jackson climbing up the chain after him. As Jackson, however, reached the door through which Heald was being pulled, he too was overcome by the gas and fell back to the bottom of the furnace. Ince then descended and placed a rope round Jackson's body, but unfortunately it slipped off before the man could be pulled out, though Ince, feeling that he was being overcome by the gas, climbed up the chain and escaped. On recovering Ince went down a second time, once more tied the rope round Jackson, but again failed to bring him to the surface, though he himself escaped by a ladder which had been brought. Arthur Darby then went down the ladder with a rope, which was attached to Jackson's belt, but unfortunately the belt gave way. On Darby coming out Speke went down, and, the rope having been more securely tied round Jackson's body, he was extricated, though unhappily it was found on reaching the surface that he was dead. All the men were fully aware of the great risk to which they repeatedly exposed themselves.

NATIONAL INSURANCE ACT, 1911.

Application having been made to the Insurance Commissioners for the determination of a question whether a certified midwife who is engaged by various patients, and is ordinarily in sole charge of the cases she attends, is required to be insured under Part I of the National Insurance Act, the Commissioners have given the following decision:—

"That a certified midwife who, in the circumstances set out in the application, performs her duties without the supervision of a qualified medical practitioner is not employed under a contract of service within the meaning of the National Insurance Act, and is not required to be insured thereunder."

NATIONAL INSURANCE ACT, 1911.

Application having been made to the Insurance Commissioners for the determination of a question whether persons, such as labourers and carpenters casually employed by a private owner of house property to execute repairs thereon, are required to be insured under Part I of the National Insurance Act, the Commissioners have given the following decision:—

"That the persons employed casually by the applicant to do repairs to cottages owned and let by him are not so employed for the purposes of the applicant's trade or business within the meaning of Schedule I, Part II (h) to the National Insurance Act, and are accordingly not required to be insured in respect of such employment."

NATIONAL INSURANCE ACT, 1911.

Application having been made to the Insurance Commissioners for the determination of a question whether a clerk, articled to a chartered accountant, and in respect of whom a premium has been paid, which is returned to the clerk by yearly instalments, is required to be insured under Part I of the National Insurance Act, the Commissioners have given the following decision:—

"That the employment of applicant, as articled clerk to a chartered accountant, is employment under a contract of apprenticeship with money payment within the meaning of Part I (a) of the First Schedule to the National Insurance Act, and that he is accordingly liable to be insured under the Act."

MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

COUNTY OF NORTHUMBERLAND.

Whereas by section 8 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1903"), it is enacted that the Local Government Board may by regulations made under section 6 of the Locomotives on Highways Act,

1896 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1896"), prohibit or restrict the driving of any motor cars, or of any special kind of motor cars, on any specified highway or part of a highway, which does not exceed sixteen feet in width, or on which ordinary motor car traffic would, in their opinion, be especially dangerous;

And whereas by the Heavy Motor Car Order, 1904, issued by the Local Government Board in pursuance of the Motor Car Acts, 1896 and 1903, the expression "heavy motor car" in that Order is defined as a motor car exceeding two tons in weight unladen;

Notice is hereby given, that the County Council of Northumberland have made application to the Local Government Board for a regulation to be made under section 6 of the Act of 1896 and section 8 of the Act of 1903, for prohibiting the driving of heavy motor cars (as defined by the Heavy Motor Car Order, 1904) upon the highway known as East Woodburn Road, in the Bellingham Rural District:

Notice is hereby further given, that objections to the making of any such regulation may be sent in writing to the Local Government Board at their office, Whitehall, London, S.W., on or before the fifteenth day of October, 1912.

A copy of any such objection should be sent at the same time by the objector to the County Council of Northumberland, Moot Hall, Newcastle-upon-Tyne.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 24TH SEPTEMBER 1912.)

LANCASHIRE (FOOT - AND - MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1912 (No. 6).

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Modification of Orders.

1. The Lancashire (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1912 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order") and the Lancashire (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Orders of 1912 (Nos. 2-5) are modified in manner hereinafter appearing.

Free Movement into and within Zone II.

- 2.—(1.) The provisions of Order (No. 3), which by Order (No. 4) were applied to Zone II, shall cease to apply to that Zone.
- (2.) The prohibition of movement of animals contained in the principal Order shall not apply to any movement of animals—
 - (a) within Zone II; or
 - (b) into Zone II from premises situate outside the Scheduled District.

Movement within Zone I or into Zone I for immediate slaughter.

- 3.—(1.) The provisions of Order (No. 3) shall apply to Zone I (except the Prohibited Areas).
- (2.) For the purpose of movement into Zone I for immediate slaughter, Zone II shall be treated as if it were not in the Scheduled District.

Continued Prohibition of Movement in certain Prohibited Areas in Zone I.

4. The prohibition of movement of animals contained in the principal Order shall apply without modification to the Areas described in the Schedule hereto (hereinafter referred to as Prohibited Areas).

Regulation of Markets, &c., in Zone II.

- 5. No market, fair, sale or exhibition of animals shall be held in Zone II except in accordance with the following provisions:—
 - (i.) A market or sale may be held on any premises in Zone II if the Local Authority are satisfied that the market or sale will be restricted to animals intended for immediate slaughter and the market or sale is authorised by the Local Authority under this Order.
 - (ii.) The Local Authority shall cause a Veterinary Inspector to attend at every market or sale authorised under this Order and examine the animals exposed thereat.

Movement of Animals through Zones or Prohibited Areas by Railway.

6.
