

Ecclesiastical Benefice, the patronage of which is vested in the Governors.

Repeal of Existing Statutes.

37. The foregoing Statutes shall take the place of the Statutes which were approved by Her Majesty Queen Victoria in Council in the year 1872, and subsequent amendments thereof, but shall not operate to revive any of the Statutes and Regulations relating to Charterhouse School, and existing at the time of the passing of the "Public Schools Act, 1868," which, from and after the approval of the Statutes of 1872 by Her Majesty in Council, were repealed.*

Saving Clause.

38. Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, all Senior Scholars in the School at the date of the approval of these Statutes by His Majesty the King in Council shall during their continuance in the School be entitled to the same benefits and advantages as heretofore; and Statutes 6, 7 and 8 shall apply to all Scholars heretofore styled Junior Scholars in the School at the date of such approval.
