FINANCE (1909-10) ACT, 1910.

(10 Ed. VII, c. 8.)

The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice, under section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that they propose, after the expiration of at least forty days from this date, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by section 86 (2) of the Finance (1909-10) Act, 1910, and of every other power enabling them in that behalf, to make regulations superseding the provisional regulations dated 21st May, 1910, with reference to the calculation of horse power for the purpose of the duty payable in respect of motor cars.
