"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the thirtythird and thirty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-nine, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirtynine, and the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and fourteen, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the church and cure (hereinafter called 'the said benefice') of Terwick, in the county of Sussex and in the diocese of Chichester.

"Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Terwick is vested for an estate in fee simple in possession free from incumbrances in Charles Thomas Lane, of Dangstein, Petersfield, in the county of Sussex, Esquire, one of Your Majesty's Justices of the Peace.

"And whereas the said Charles Thomas Lane is desirous that the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Terwick now vested in him as aforesaid should be transferred to and be vested in him the said Charles Thomas Lane and Minna Lane his wife to hold as joint tenants for the term of their joint lives and after the decease of one of them should be transferred to and be vested in the survivor of them for the term of his or her natural life and after the death of such survivor should be transferred

to and be vested in the Bishop for the time being of the said diocese of Chichester.

"And whereas the said Charles Thomas Lane and Minna Lane are consenting jointly to accept the transfer to them of the said advowson or right of patronage for the term of their joint lives and severally to accept the transfer to the survivor of them for the term of his or her natural life of the said advowson or right of patronage.

"And whereas the Right Reverend Charles John, now Bishop of Chichester, is willing to accept the transfer to him and his successors Bishops of Chichester of the said advowson or right of patronage for such estate in fee simple expectant upon the death of the survivor of them the said Charles Thomas Lane and Minna Lane as aforesaid and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said Charles John, Bishop of Chichester, has executed this scheme as hereinafter mentioned.

"And whereas the transfer of the patronage of the said benefice of Terwick which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the parish or district in or in respect of which the right of patronage or advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the parish of Terwick.

"Now therefore with the consent as aforesaid of the said Charles Thomas Lane and Minna Lane (in testimony whereof they have severally signed and sealed this scheme) and with the consent of the said Charles John, Bishop of Chichester (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Terwick now vested in him the said Charles Thomas Lane as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Charles Thomas Lane and Minna Lane to hold as joint tenants for the term of their joint lives and as from the decease of one of them shall be transferred to the survivor of them for the term of his or her natural life and as from the decease of the survivor shall be transferred to and be vested in the said Charles John, Bishop of Chichester, and his successors in the same bishoprick for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

consent of the said John William, Bishop of the said diocese of Carlisle (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of All Souls, Netherton, now vested in him the said Edward Haigh Sugden, as such vicar or incumbent of the said vicarage of Dearham as aforesaid, shall be transferred from him, the said Edward Haigh Sugden, and from his successors vicars or incumbents of the said vicarage of Dearham to the said John William, Bishop of the said diocese of Carlisle, and his successors bishops of the same diocese: and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said John William, Bishop of the said diocese of Carlisle, and by his successors, bishops of the same diocese for ever.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Thomas, situate at Skirbeck Quarter, in the parish of Skirbeck, in the county of Lincoln and in the diocese of Lincoln.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Saint Thomas, situate at Skirbeck Quarter as aforesaid.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Edward Lee, Bishop of Lincoln (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said parish of Skirbeck, which is comprised within and is co-extensive with the limits of the civil parish of Skirbeck Quarter, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint Thomas, situate at Skirbeck Quarter, as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of St. Thomas, Skirbeck Quarter.'

"And with the like consent of the said Edward Lee, Bishop of Lincoln (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said church of Saint Thomas, situate at Skirbeck Quarter, as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us the said Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in Your Royal Wisdom, shall seem meet."

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter seventy; of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-seven; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the first day of August, in the year one thousand nine hundred and twelve, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter seventy, of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of All Saints, Highams Park, Hale End, situate within the new parish (sometime chapelry district) of Saint John, Walthamstow, in the county of Essex and in the diocese of Saint Albans.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said new parish of Saint John, Walthamstow, and of the new parish (sometime chapelry district) of Saint Peter, Walthamstow, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such new parishes.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said new parish of Saint John, Walthamstow, and of the said new parish of Saint Peter, Walthamstow, should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said church of All Saints, Highams Park, Hale End, situate as aforesaid.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Edgar, Bishop of Saint Albans, as such Bishop, with the consent of the Reverend Herbert Dudley Lampen, Clerk in Holy Orders, vicar or incumbent of the vicarage of the parish of Walthamstow, in the said county and diocese, and, as such vicar or incumbent, the patron of the vicarage of the

said new parish of Saint John, Walthamstow, and with the consent of Sir Thomas Courtenay Theydon Warner, Baronet, of Brettenham Park, Ipswich, in the county of Suffolk, a Companion of Your Majesty's Most Honourable Order of the Bath and a Member of the Commons House of Parliament, as the patron of the vicarage of the said new parish of Saint Peter, Walthamstow (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respec-tively signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said new parish of Saint John, Walthamstow, and of the said new parish of Saint Peter, Walthamstow, which are described in the schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one con-solidated chapelry for the said church of All Saints, Highams Park, Hale End, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named The Consolidated Chapelry of All Saints, Highams Park, Hale End.'

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal Wisdom shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of All Saints, Highams Park, Hale End, comprising:—All those contiguous portions of the new parish (sometime chapelry district) of Saint John, Walthamstow, and of the new parish (sometime chapelry district) of Saint Peter, Walthamstow, both in the county of Essex and in the diocese of Saint Albans, which, taken together, are bounded upon the north by the parish of Chingford, in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the west, upon the south, and upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said parish of Chingford from the said new parish of Saint John, Walthamstow, crosses the middle of Chingford Road, and extending thence southward along the middle of Chingford Road for a distance of forty-five claims or thereabouts to its junction with Wadham Road, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Wadham Road for a distance of fifty-two chains or thereabouts to its junction with Hale End Road, upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint John, Walthamstow, from the said new parish of Saint Peter, Walthamstow, and extending thence north-eastward along the lastmentioned boundary (thereby following the middle of Hale End Road) for a distance of twenty-three chains or thereabouts to the junction of Hale End Road with the road called Oak Hill, and extending thence northeastward along the middle of Oak Hill for a distance of eighteen chains or thereabouts to its junction with the footpath and roadway leading through The Sales, and extending thence first north-eastward and then north-westward

along the middle of the said footpath and

roadway for a distance of twenty-eight chains or thereabouts to the point where it crosses the middle of the stream called The Ching, and extending thence generally northward along the middle of such stream for a distance of fifty-nine chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Peter, Walthamstow, from the said parish of Chingford."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Saint Albans.

WHEREAS by section 26 of the Pluralities

Act. 1838 after resident Act, 1838, after reciting that "Whereas in some instances tithings, hamlets, chapelries, and other places or districts may be separated from the parishes or mother churches to which they belong, with great advantage, and places altogether extra-parochial may, in some instances, with advantage be annexed to parishes or districts to which they are contiguous, or be constituted separate parishes for ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That when with respect to his own diocese it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or when the Bishop of any diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop, that any such tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place or district within the diocese of such Archbishop, or the diocese of such Bishop, as the case may be, may be advantageously separated from any parish or mother church, and either be constituted a separate benefice by itself or be united to any other parish to which it may be more conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place, or district, parochial or extra-parochial, so as to form a separate parish or benefice, or that any extraparochial place may with advantage be annexed to any parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes; and the said Archbishop, or Bishop, shall draw up a scheme in writing (the scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted to the said Archbishop for his consideration) describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent charges, and other recelesiastical dues, rates and payments,

and in respect to patronage and rights to pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested; and, if the patron or patrons of the benefice or benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent in writing under his or their hands to such scheme, or to such modification thereof, as the said Archbishop may approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with any such scheme, or modification thereof, and shall certify the same and such consent as aforesaid, by his report to His Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to make an Order for carrying such scheme or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect."

And whereas Cosmo Gordon, Lord Archbishop of York, hath, pursuant to the enactment aforesaid, made a Report, dated the 20th day of January, 1912, to His Majesty in Council, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"That the net annual value of the said Rectory of Ryther is Three hundred and ninety pounds and that of the said Perpetual Curacy of Saxton with Towton is Two hundred and eighty-eight pounds.

"That the Patronage of the said Rectory of Ryther is vested in the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain and the Reverend William Charles Carter M.A. is the present Rector thereof.

"That the Patronage of the said Perpetual Curacy of Saxton with Towton is vested in Frederick Richard Thomas Trench Gascoigne a Lieutenant Colonel in Your Majesty's Army and the Reverend Cyril Alfred Drummond Ash B.A. is the present Perpetual Curate thereof.

"That the said Patrons and Incumbents are consenting parties to the separation and annexation hereinafter proposed.

"That it appears to the said Archbishop that under the provisions of the said Act of Parliament the said Hamlet and Township of Lead may be advantageously separated from the Parish of Ryther aforesaid to which it at present belongs and be united for Ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of Saxton with Towton.

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the before mentioned Act the Archbishop has prepared a Scheme in writing appended to this Report describing the mode in which it appears to him the alterations above proposed may be best effected and how the changes consequent thereupon in respect to Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction Glebe lands tithes rent charges and other Ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect of Patronage and Rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested and the said Archbishop being on full consideration and enquiry satisfied with such Scheme he doth by this report certify the same to Your Majesty in Council with the Consents in writing to the said Scheme of the Patron and Incumbents of the Parishes to be affected to the intent that Your Majesty in Council in case it shall be thought expedient and proper so to do may make an Order for carrying such Scheme into effect."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Archbishop and the Consents referred to in the said Report are as follows:—

"SCHEME.

"That the Hamlet and Township of Lead in the Parish of Ryther in the County and Diocese of York shall be separated from that Parish and be united to and form part of the Parish of Saxton with Towton in the same County and Diocese for Ecclesiastical purposes.

"That the Rector of the Parish of Ryther

shall cease to have Cure of Souls within the said Hamlet and Township of Lead and the Perpetual Curate of the Parish of Saxton with Towton shall have exclusive Charge and Cure of Souls within the limits of such Hamlet and Township.

"That the inhabitants of the said Hamlet and Township of Lead shall be exonerated from all liability to repair the Parish Church of Ryther or any other Church or Chapel now or hereafter to be erected within the Parish of Ryther but shall be liable as the other inhabitants of the Parish of Saxton with Towton for the repair of the Parish Church of Saxton with Towton.

"That the inhabitants of the said Hamlet and Township of Lead shall not henceforth be entitled to accommodation in the Church of Ryther but shall have the same rights as to pews and the performance of all offices and services of the Church at the said Parish Church of Saxton with Towton and otherwise in relation to the said Church as the other Inhabitants of the said Parish of Saxton with Towton.

"That the Inhabitants of the said Hamlet and Township of Lead shall have the same rights as to Burial as the other Inhabitants of the said Parish of Saxton with Towton.

"That the fees for all such offices and services performed for the Inhabitants of the said Hamlet and Township of Lead as aforesaid or arising within the limits of the same and usually payable to the Incumbent of a Benefice shall belong to and be received by the Incumbent of the Benefice of Saxton with Towton aforesaid.

"That the annual Tithe Commutation Rent Charge of one pound eighteen shillings and eight pence more particularly shewn in the following schedule, now payable to the Rector of Ryther arising out of lands situate within the limits of the said Hamlet and Township of Lead shall become payable and be paid to the said Perpetual Curate of the said Perpetual Curacy of Saxton with Towton.

WHEREAS by section 5 of the Poisons and Pharmacy Act, 1908, it is enacted

"(1) It shall not be lawful to sell any substance to which this section applies by retail, unless the box, bottle, vessel, wrapper, or cover in which the substance is contained is distinctly labelled with the name of the substance and the word 'Poisonous,' and with the name and address of the seller of the substance, and unless such other regulations as may be prescribed under this section by Order in Council are complied with; and, if any person sells any such substance otherwise than in accordance with the provisions of this section or of any Order in Council made thereunder, he shall, on conviction under the Summary Jurisdiction Acts, be liable for each offence to a fine not exceeding five pounds.

"(2) The substances to which this section applies are sulphuric acid, nitric acid, hydrochloric acid, soluble salts of oxalic acid, and such other substances as may for the time being be prescribed by Order in Council under this section."

And whereas it is expedient that all liquid preparations sold as carbolic, or carbolic acid, or carbolic substitutes, or carbolic disinfectant, containing not more than three per cent. of phenols, should be prescribed as substances to which the said section applies.

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to prescribe, and it is hereby prescribed, that as from the 1st day of May, 1913, all liquid preparations sold as carbolic, or carbolic acid, or carbolic substitutes, or carbolic disinfectant, containing not more than three per cent. of phenols, shall be substances to which section 5 of the said recited enactment applies.

HEREAS by an Order in Council, dated the 17th day of September, 1900, and expressed to be made in pursuance of the "Merchant Shipping Act, 1894," and of the "Mersey Channels Act, 1897," His Majesty, on the application of the Mersey Docks and Harbour Board, being the Harbour Trust or Body Corporate owning or exercising jurisdiction upon the waters of the River Mersey and the sea channels or approaches thereto, was pleased to make certain Rules, set forth in the Schedule to such Order, concerning the Lights or Signals to be carried, and concerning the steps for avoiding collision to be taken, by vessels navigating the River Mersey and the sea channels or approaches to the River Mersey between the Rock Lighthouse and the furthest point seawards to which such channels or approaches respectively, are, for the time being, buoyed on both sides.

And whereas the said Mersey Docks and Harbour Board have applied to His Majesty in Council to make, and have submitted for approval, certain new Rules concerning Lights and Signals to be carried, and the steps for avoiding collision to be taken, by vessels navigating the River Mersey and the sea channels or approaches thereto within certain specified limits, to be substituted for and in lieu of the Rules set forth in the Schedule to the said recited Order in Council of the 17th day of September, 1900, and in such new Rules there are embodied, subject to certain exceptions and additions therein mentioned, the "Regulations for preventing Collisions at Sea," made in pursuance of the "Merchant Shipping Act, 1894," and which may from time to time be in force.

And whereas the provisions of Section 1 of the "Rules Publication Act, 1893," have been complied with:

And whereas the new Rules so submitted as aforesaid appear to be reasonable and proper:

Now, therefore, His Majesty by virtue of the powers in Him vested by the "Merchant Shipping Act, 1894," and by the "Mersey Channels Act, 1897," and of any other powers Him thereunto enabling, and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to declare that the said Order in Council of the 17th day of September, 1900, shall, as from the 11th day of October, 1912, be revoked, and His Majesty is further pleased to make the Rules set forth in the schedule hereto, and to direct that the same shall continue in operation as from the said 11th day of October, 1912.

Rules concerning the Lights or Signals to be carried, and concerning the steps for avoid-

Note.—The numbers quoted in these Rules refer to the Articles in the General Regulations made on the 13th October, 1910.

- ing Collision to be taken, by Vessels navigating the River Mensex and the Sea Channels or approaches thereto, between the Rock Lighthouse and the furthest point seawards to which such Sea Channels or approaches respectively are for the time being buoyed on both sides.
- 1. Every vessel, of whatever description, used in navigation, when in any part of the River Mersey, or in the Sea Channels or approaches thereto as above defined shall, on and after the 11th day of October, 1912, observe and obey the "Regulations for preventing Collisions at Sea" made in pursuance of the "Merchant Shipping Act, 1894," hereinafter called "the General Regulations," which may from time to time be in force, with the exceptions and additions mentioned in the following Rules.
- 2. A vessel when lying at any Stage shall carry the lights prescribed by Articles 2 and 5 of the General Regulations and Rule 5 hereof.
- 3. A vessel being towed shall, in addition to the lights prescribed by Article 5 of the General Regulations, carry the white light at her stern prescribed by Rule 5 hereof, and if such vessel is a steam vessel with steam up she shall, although being towed, also carry the masthead light prescribed by Article 2 (a), and may carry the additional light allowed by Article 2 (e) of the General Regulations.
- 4.—(a) A steam vessel when towing another vessel or vessels or when attached for the purpose of towing or manœuvring such vessel or vessels, shall carry the compulsory lights prescribed by Article 3 of the General Regulations, and such steam vessel when towing or attached as aforesaid to a vessel of 450 feet or upwards in length shall carry the additional bright white light prescribed by the said Article 3.
- (b) Further, a steam vessel when towing or attached as aforesaid shall carry abaft the funnel or after-mast a small white light fixed and carried in a lantern so constructed, fitted and screened that it shall throw an unbroken light over an arc of the horizon of 12 points of the compass, viz., for 6 points from right aft on each side of the vessel, and such steam vessel if less than 160 feet in length shall not carry the stern light prescribed by Rule 5 hereof, but if she is 160 feet or upwards in length she may carry such stern light.

The length of a vessel shall be deemed to be the length appearing in her Certificate of Registry.

5. In lieu of Article 10 of the General Regulations, a vessel under way shall carry at her stern a white light. The light shall be fixed and carried in a lantern so constructed, fitted and screened that it shall throw an unbroken light over an arc of the horizon of 12 points of the compass, viz., for 6 points from right aft on each side of the vessel, so as to be visible at a distance of at least a mile. Such light shall be carried as nearly as practicable on the same level as the side lights.

Provided that a vessel within Article 7 of the General Regulations (viz., Steam Vessels of less than 40, and vessels under oars or sails of less than 20, tons gross tonnage respectively, and rowing boats), shall not be obliged to carry the light prescribed by this Rule, but if they do not carry such light they shall, when being overtaken by another vessel, shew from the stern a white light or a flare up light as required by Article 10 of the General Regulations.

6. In lieu of Article 11 of the General Regulations, a vessel when at anchor, except when lying at any Stage, shall carry in the forward part of the vessel, at a height of not less than 20, and not exceeding 40, feet above the hull, a White Light, in a lantern so constructed as to show a clear, uniform and unbroken light visible all round the horizon at a distance of at least a mile; and at or near the stern of the vessel and at such a height that it shall not be less than fifteen feet lower than the forward Light, another such Light.

Provided that a vessel within Article 7 of the General Regulations (viz., Steam Vessels of less than 40, and vessels under oars or sails of less than 20, tons gross tonnage respectively, and rowing boats) when at anchor shall not be obliged to carry the lights prescribed by this Rule, but if they do not carry them each of such vessels shall carry in a place where it can best be seen, and at a height above the gunwale of not less than nine feet, a White Light in a lantern so constructed as to show a clear, uniform and unbroken light visible all round the horizon at a distance of at least a mile.

- 7. A steam vessel when at anchor, except when lying at any Stage, shall, between sunrise and sunset, carry in the forward part of the vessel, at a height of not less than 20, and not exceeding 40, feet above the hull, a black ball not less than two feet in diameter, and at or near the stern of the vessel, and at such a height that it shall not be less than 15 feet lower than the forward ball, another such ball: Provided that in the case of a steam vessel within Article 7 of the General Regulations, one such black ball only may be carried at a height above the gunwale of not less than 9 feet.
- 8. A vessel, having on board any explosive, except ships' ammunition, shall, when at anchor, carry a Red Light, in a globular lantern not less than 10 inches in diameter, six feet above the forward White Light prescribed by Rule 6 hereof.

Provided that a vessel entitled to carry and carrying the White Light prescribed by the proviso to Rule 6, shall carry the Red Light above described, not less than three feet above such White Light.

- 9. A vessel anchored to mark the position of a wreck or other obstruction, shall carry, in all weathers from sunset to sunrise, two bright White Lights, in lanterns so constructed as to shew a clear, uniform and unbroken light visible all round the horizon at a distance of at least a mile, which Lights shall be placed horizontally on a cross yard on the foremast at a height not exceeding twenty feet above the hull and not exceeding twenty feet apart, and the said vessel shall carry, in all weathers between sunrise and sunset, two Black Balls placed as hereinbefore ordered with regard to the Lights aforementioned.
- 10. A vessel of 350 feet or upwards in length when at anchor shall, during fog, mist, falling snow or heavy rain storms, whether by day or night,
 - (1) ring in the forward part of the vessel the Bell prescribed by Article 15 (d) of the General Regulations.

(2) sound at or near the stern of such vessel a loud-toned Gong or a loud-toned Triangle or other loud-toned article that cannot be mistaken for a Bell, Whistle, Siren or Foghorn.

The Bell shall be rung, and the Gong, Triangle. or other article sounded, respectively, for a period of about five seconds at intervals of not more than one minute.

The length of a vessel shall be deemed to be the length appearing in her Certificate of Registry.

11. Every Steam Vessel under way shall, when it is safe and practicable, keep to that side of the fairway or mid-channel which lies on the starboard side of such vessel.

DREDGERS.

- 12. The word "Dredger" shall mean any Vessel fitted with plant or apparatus for dredging or excavating or fitted with plant or apparatus for eroding or dispersing sand and other material.
- 13. A Dredger, when at work or in position for working, shall carry the following Lights and Signals, viz.:

LIGHTS BETWEEN SUNSET AND SUNRISE.

- (i) (a) Forward.—In the forward part of the Dredger, at a height of not less than 20, and not exceeding 40, feet above the hull, a White Light, in a lantern so constructed as to show a clear, uniform and unbroken light visible all round the horizon at a distance of at least a mile.
 - (b) AMIDSHIPS.—Three such White Lights placed in triangular form not less than 8 feet apart, the base of the triangle to be at least 10 feet higher than the forward Light, and to be also higher than and clear of the framework, funnels, or any other erections upon the Dredger.
 - (c) AFT.—One such White Light, at or near the stern of the Dredger, and at such a height that it shall be not less than 15 feet lower than the forward Light.
- (ii) A Dredger when not making any way through the water shall not carry side or stern Lights, but when making way shall carry the usual red and green side Lights and the stern Light prescribed by Rule 5 hereof.

SIGNALS BETWEEN SUNRISE AND SUNSET.

AMIDSHIPS.—Three red balls of not less than 2 feet in diameter placed in triangular form not less than 8 feet apart, the base of the triangle to be higher than and clear of the framework, funnels, or any other erections upon the Dredger.

- 14. The Lights and Signals required to be carried by Rule 13 are to be taken by other vessels as signals that the vessel showing them is not under command, and cannot therefore get out of the way.
- 15. A Dredger, when not at work nor in position for working, shall carry the ordinary lights and signals required to be carried by vessels for avoiding collisions, as provided by these Rules and by the Rules and Regulations now and from time to time in force under the "Merchant Shipping Act, 1894," and the "Mersey Channels Act, 1897."

Modification of Orders.

1. The Newcastle-upon-Tyne and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1912 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order") and the Newcastle-upon-Tyne and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Orders of 1912 (Nos. 2-5) are modified in manner hereinafter appearing.

Free Movement into and within Zone II.

- 2.—(1.) The provisions of the Newcastle-upon-Tyne and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1912 (No. 5)—hereinafter referred to as "Order (No. 5)"—applicable to the Zone described in the First Schedule thereto (hereinafter referred to as Zone II) shall cease to apply to that Zone.
- (2.) The prohibition of movement of animals contained in the principal Order shall not apply to any movement of animals-

 - (a) within Zone II; or.(b) into Zone II from premises situate outside the Scheduled District.

Regulation of Markets, &c., in Zone II.

- 3. No market, fair, sale or exhibition of animals shall be held in Zone II except in accordance with the following provisions:-
 - (i) A market or sale may be held on any premises in Zone II if the Local Authority

are satisfied that the market or sale will be restricted to animals intended for immediate slaughter and the market or sale is authorised by the Local Authority under this Order.

(ii) The Local Authority shall cause at least one Veterinary Inspector to attend at every market or sale authorised under this Order and examine the animals exposed thereat.

Movement within Zone I; Movement into Zone I for Immediate Slaughter.

- 4.—(1.) The provisions of Order (No. 5) shall, except as hereinafter provided, apply to the Zone I described in the Schedule hereto (except the Prohibited Areas in such Zone described in such Schedule).
- (2.) For the purpose of movement into Zone I (except the Prohibited Areas) for immediate slaughter, Zone II shall be treated as if it were not in the Scheduled District.

Continued Prohibition of Movement in certain Prohibited Areas in Zone I.

5. The prohibition of movement of animals contained in the principal Order shall apply to the before-mentioned Prohibited Areas, except as hereinafter provided.

Saving as to Newcastle-upon-Tyne and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1912 (No. 6).

6. Nothing in this Order shall affect the operation of the Newcastle-upon-Tyne and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1912 (No. 6) relating to the holding of markets and sales of animals for immediate slaughter in the county boroughs of Gateshead, Newcastleupon-Tyne, and Sunderland, or the movement of animals therefrom to a slaughter-house in the Scheduled District.

Provisions as to Farms on borders of Zones.

7. If any farm (except any detached part) is partly within and partly without a Zone, the whole shall be deemed to be within the Zone, and where the farm extends to two Zones the whole shall be deemed to be in the inner Zone.

Movement of Animals through Zones or Prohibited Areas by Railway.

8. For the purposes of this Order, an animal shall not be deemed to be moved into or out of a Zone or Prohibited Area where it is moved through such Zone or Area by railway from a place outside such Zone or Area to another place outside such Zone or Area, without unnecessary delay and without the animal being untrucked within such Zone or Area.

Commencement.

9. This Order shall come into operation on the nineteenth day of October, nineteen hundred and twelve.

Short Title, etc.

10. This Order may be cited as the New-CASTLE-UPON-TYNE AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-Mouth Disease) Order of 1912 (No. 7), and shall be read with the Orders referred to in Articles 1 and 6.

Isle of Man To Wit.

WHEREAS, by section 6 of "The Cattle Diseases Prevention Act, 1866," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the

Governor, from time to time, by and with the advice and consent of any two members of the Council, to prohibit the importation or introduction into this Isle of hay, straw, fodder, dung, offal, litter, manure, or other articles in their opinion likely to propagate or introduce infection:

And whereas the infectious disease commonly called the Foot-and-Mouth Disease prevails amongst animals in certain places beyond this Isle, and it is deemed advisable to prohibit the importation of peat-moss litter, or any other substance used in substitution for straw for bedding animals, with a view to preventing the introduction of the said disease amongst animals in this Isle.

Now I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of two members of the Council, and in exercise of all the powers in that behalf given by the Cattle Diseases Prevention Acts, do hereby Order as follows:—

1. From and after the date hereof, no Peat-Moss Litter, or any other substance used in substitution of Straw for bedding animals, shall be imported or introduced into this Island.

2. The expression "animals" means horses, asses, and mules; cattle, sheep, goats, and all other ruminating animals: and swine.

3. This Order may be cited as "The Peat-Moss Litter (Landing) Order of 1912."
