Several cases of cholera having been officially ascertained at Cagliari (Island of Sardinia), arrivals from the said port will be treated according to Government Circular of the 12th August, 1904, No. 12468, by which the regulations of the International Sanitary Conference of Paris (1903) were published with reference to the maritime sanitary service.
