Notice is hereby given, pursuant to the provisions of section 113 of the National Insurance Act, 1911, and of the Ninth Schedule to the said Act, that the Joint Committee of the several bodies of Commissioners appointed for the purposes of Part I of the said Act, and the Insurance Commissioners, the Scottish Insurance Commissioners, the Irish Insurance Commissioners, and the Welsh Insurance Commissioners constituted under the said Act, acting jointly, have amended the draft of the Special Order proposed to be made by them under section 47 of the said Act, specifying certain employments as being
