NOTICE is hereby given, in pursuance of the University of London Act, 1898, that the following Amendment of the Statutes for the Management of the University of London, University College, has been made by the Senate of the University of London, and that copies of the amended Statute can be obtained on application to "The Secretary to the Senate, University of London, South Kensington, S.W."

TO REPEAL Statute 24 of the said Statutes, and to substitute therefor the following:-

24. The Board shall consist of the Provost and of the following persons whilst holding office in the College:

(1) The Professors who held office immediately before the day appointed for incorporation of the College in the University, i.e., January 1st, 1907.

(2) All persons subsequently appointed to hold office as Professors in the College.

(3) The Librarian.
(4) All such persons appointed as Readers or Lecturers or Assistant Professors, or granted the title of Assistant Professor, as the Senate, having regard to the importance of their work in the College, shall, after receiving a report from the Professorial Board, nominate to be members of that Board.
