

YSTRADGYNLAIS RURAL DISTRICT.

Statement of Effect of Order of the Local Government Board.

WHEREAS the Local Government Board, on the 26th day October, 1912, made an Order to the following effect, namely:—That on and after the day on which the said Order comes into operation, sections 15, 16, 17, 18, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25, 27, 28, 29, 30, 31, 32 and 33, comprised in Part II; sections 34, 35, 36, 37, 38, 44, 45, 46, 47, 48, 49, 50 and 51, comprised in Part III; sections 52, 53, 54, 55, 56, 57, 58, 59, 60, 61, 62, 63, 64, 65, 66 and 68, comprised in Part IV; and Part V of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907 (hereinafter referred to as the Act of 1907), shall be in force in the several contributory places within the said rural district of Ystradgynlais.

The parts and sections above referred to shall be in force subject to the following conditions

and adaptations, that is to say: -

That until further order, section 25 of Part II of the Act of 1907 shall have effect as if the following words were added thereto, namely: "The power of making or enforcing bye-laws under section 157 of the Public Health Act, 1875, as extended by section 23 of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1890, with

respect to the paving of yards and open spaces in connection with dwelling-houses shall cease to be exercisable";
