so as to be between the 14th day of March and

the 16th day of August in any year.

The close time for the Mallard (Wild Duck) shall be varied so as to be between the last day of February and the 8th day of August in any year.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

III. The provisions of the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the County Borough of West Ham to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:—

Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Hen Harrier, Marsh Harrier, Montagu's Harrier, Hobby, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Magpie, House Martin, Sand Martin, Merlin, Osprey, Owl (all species), Great Grey Shrike, Lesser Grey Shrike, Redbacked Shrike, Swallow, Swift, Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snake Bird).

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

IV. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, does not apply, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County Borough of West Ham:—

Common Bunting, Snow Bunting, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Chaffinch, Chiffchaff, Coot, Corn Crake (Land Rail), Tree Creeper, Cuckoo, Flycatchers, Goldfinch, Hawfinch, Lark, Linnet, Magpie, House Martin, Sand Martin, Nightingale, Nightjar (Fern Owl, Goatsucker, Night Hawk), Nuthatch, Osprey, Redstart, Great Grey Shrike, Lesser Grey Shrike, Red-backed Shrike, Stonechat, Swallow, Swift, Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), Long-tailed Tit, Grey Wagtail, Pied Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail, Blackcap Warbler, Garden Warbler, Reed Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Willow Warbler, Wood Warbler, Wheatear, Whinchat, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Wren, Golden-crested Wren, Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snake Bird).

Certain Eggs protected throughout the County Borough.

V. The taking or destroying of the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County Borough of West Ham:—

Black-headed Bunting, Yellow Bunting, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Chiffchaff, Coot, Corn Crake (Land Rail), Cuckoo, Pied Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher, Goldfinch, Hawfinch, Hobby, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Sky Lark, Wood Lark, Linnet, Magpie, House Martin, Sand Martin, Merlin, Nightingale, Nightjar (Fern Owl, Goatsucker, Night Hawk), Nuthatch, Osprey, Barn Owl, Long-eared Owl, Wood or Tawny Owl, Redstart, Great Grey Shrike, Lesser Grey Shrike, Red-backed Shrike, Starling, Stonechat, Swallow, Swift, Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), Long-tailed Tit, Grey Wagtail, Pied Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail, Blackcap Warbler, Garden Warbler, Reed Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Willow Warbler, Wood Warbler, Wheatear,

Whinchat, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Wren, Golden-crested Wren, Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snake Bird).
