

dangerous and infectious diseases, and to enable the Medical Officer whenever any such disease is prevalent in the city or neighbourhood thereof to enter any common lodging-house and to inspect or examine and remove any person found therein, and to make such provisions as to the conditions on which such entry shall be obtained, and as to the powers of the Medical Officer with reference to dealing with any such person as the Bill may define or Parliament may prescribe.

To make various provisions for preventing the spread of infectious disease in the city, and to require the occupiers of buildings wherein any person suffering from infectious disease shall be or shall have been to furnish information to the Medical Officer, and to impose penalties for giving false information.

To require information to be given in notified cases of infectious disease of the laundry to which clothes may have been sent from the premises in which such infectious disease exists.

To make provisions with respect to persons suffering from pulmonary tuberculosis, and to provide that where any such person is certified to be in an infectious state such person may be removed to a suitable hospital or other place for the reception of sick and there detained, and to prescribe the circumstances in which and the conditions under which any such removal and detention may take place, and to empower the Corporation to make allowances to the family or dependants of any person so detained.

To confer powers upon the Medical Officer with respect to the removal of the bodies of persons having died from infectious disease.

Police Matters.

To make provisions with respect to the registration and licensing of persons carrying on the trade or business of Old Metal Broker, Marine Store Dealer, or Dealer in old Jewellery, and for the registration of the places at which such persons carry on any such trade or business, and to prevent by penalty or otherwise the carrying on of any such trade or business by an unlicensed person or upon unregistered premises.

To confer further powers upon the police of the city in reference to persons suspected of unlawful possession of goods, and for the apprehension of such persons and the entry upon and search of premises wherein any such goods may be suspected to be.

Motor Vehicles.

To confer upon the Corporation further powers for the regulation and control of motor vehicles using the streets and roads in the city and for recovering payments from the owners of motor vehicles in respect of such use, and to define the class or classes of vehicles to which such provisions shall apply, and to make different provisions for different classes of vehicle.

To require the owners of any such vehicles registered in the city to make annual payments to the Corporation in respect thereof in addition to any general licence duty or other fees, and to require the owners of any such vehicles as are registered elsewhere than in the city to make payments in respect of the user by such vehicles of roads and streets in the city.

To enable the Corporation to institute and

keep a special register of such vehicles for the purposes of the intended Act or for those purposes to make entries in addition to the existing registers, and to enact all necessary provisions as to procedure, publication, notices, and other machinery required for putting the intended provisions into operation.

To enable the Corporation to fix and prescribe a scale or scales of the payments to be made under the intended provisions, and in fixing and prescribing the same to have regard to the weight of such vehicles, whether loaded or unloaded, and the nature, form and construction of such vehicles, the purposes for which the same are used, the extent of user, and the materials of which, and the form or manner in which, such vehicles or the wheels thereof are constructed.

To require that all such vehicles so specially registered shall in the city carry a distinguishing mark or plate, and to prevent by penalty or otherwise the improper use of any such mark or plate, and to enable the Corporation to register a vehicle as entitled to such distinguishing mark or plate, whether such vehicle is otherwise registered in the city or not.

To enable the Corporation to enter on such register any vehicle wherever registered upon payment of such annual sums as the Corporation may prescribe or as the Bill may define, and to enable owners of vehicles registered elsewhere than in the city to compound for any payments to be made by them under the intended Act.

To provide for the recovery of any payments by them, particularly in reference to vehicles registered elsewhere than in the city, and to confer upon the police any necessary powers for obtaining information as to the ownership of any such vehicle.

Rates and Rating.

To extend the provisions of section 43 of the Bradford Corporation Act, 1903, or to make other provisions in lieu thereof so as to require the valuation lists to show in respect of any property for which any exemptions from rates can be claimed the valuation of such property for the purposes of each of the several rates leviable within the city.

To extend to all the parishes within the city the provisions of sections 46 and 47 of the Bradford Corporation Act, 1903.

To enable the Corporation to prescribe the time within which the rates payable by owners of small property shall be paid and to relieve the Corporation from any obligation to make allowance in respect of the payment of rates by the owner in any case where such rates shall not be paid within the time prescribed.

To make such provisions as may enable the Corporation to recover summarily as a civil debt any rates levied by, or in pursuance of any order or precept of, the Corporation, and to extend the period within which action for the recovery of such debt may be taken, for a period of twelve calendar months from the time when such debt shall accrue due.

To enable the Corporation to make such allowances upon or rebates from the amount of any rates paid by ratepayers in the districts of Tyersal and Thornbury, in the city, as may be equivalent to the amount by which the payments by such ratepayers for gas supplied to them in those districts by the Pudsey Gas Company exceeds the payments which they would have made for gas if their premises had
