#### WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of Somerset) Order, 1912.

Dated 2nd December, 1912.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the Council of the Administrative County of Somerset, I hereby make the following Order:—

#### Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of Somerset) Order, 1912."

#### BIRDS.

#### Close Time Extended.

II. The time during which the killing or taking of the Sheldrake or Burrow Duck is prohibited within the Administrative County of Somerset, shall be extended so as to be between the last day of February and the 1st day of September in any year.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the Administrative County of Somerset to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:—Buzzard, Chiffchaff, Peregrine Falcon, Pied Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher, Hen Harrier, Marsh Harrier, Montagu's Harrier, Hobby, Kestrel, House Martin, Sand Martin, Merlin, Osprey, Ring Ousel, Water Ousel or Dipper, Meadow Pipit, Rock Pipit, Tree Pipit, Great Grey Shrike, Red-backed Shrike, Swallow, Swift, Blue Tit, Cole Tit, Great Tit, Longtailed Tit, Marsh Tit, Blue-headed Wagtail, Grey Wagtail, Pied Wagtail, White Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail, Blackcap Warbler, Garden

Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Reed Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Willow Warbler, Wheatear, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Common Wren, Fire-crested Wren, Golden-crested Wren, Wood Wren or Wood Warbler, Wryneck.

Certain Birds Protected during the whole of the Year.

IV. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, does not extend, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited within the Administrative County of Somerset:—Bittern, Little Bittern, Common Buzzard, Rough-legged Buzzard, Chough, Crossbill, Dotterel, Peregrine Falcon, Bar-tailed Godwit, Black-tailed Godwit, Goldfinch, Dusky Grebe, Great Crested Grebe, Little Grebe, Hobby, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Kite, Merlin, Nightjar (Fern Owl, Goatsucker, Night Hawk), Osprey, Ring Ousel, Brown Owl, Long-eared Owl, Short-eared Owl, White Owl or Barn Owl, Oystercatcher, Raven, Redshank, Spotted or Dusky Redshank, Redstart, Black Redstart, Siskin, Spoonbill, Black Tern, Common Tern, Lesser Tern, Blue-headed Wagtail, Grey Wagtail, Pied Wagtail, White Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker, Common Wren, Fire-crested Wren, Goldencrested Wren.

All Birds Protected during the whole of the Year in certain Areas.

V. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880 (as extended by Clause II of this Order), does not extend, the killing or taking of all Wild Birds is prohibited:—

(a) On the beach, shore, or foreshore in the parishes of East Quantoxhead, West Quantoxhead, Dunster, and Carhampton, and on so much of the beach, shore, or foreshore in the parish of Old Cleeve as lies to the west of a line drawn due north from a rock known as "Grey Rock" at Blue Anchor Point (the total length of the protected area being six miles and a half):

(b) In an area comprising Brean Down, in the parish of Brean, and such parts of that parish and the parishes of Weston-super-Mare and Uphill as are comprised within the following boundary line: A line commencing at a point at low-water mark fifty yards to the north of the mouth of the River Axe, proceeding in a south-easterly direction in a straight line to and including Black Rock, thence to a point fifty yards to the north-east of the ferry landing place in the parish of Uphill, thence across the river, proceeding in a north-westerly direction to Black Point, thence along the southern base of Brean Down to Howe Rock, and from Howe Rock along low-water mark to the point of commencement.

#### Eccs.

All Eggs Protected in certain Areas.

VI. The taking or destroying of the Egg or Eggs of any species of Wild Bird is prohibited:—

(a) On the foreshore, beach, shore, or cliffs within the distance of fifty yards measured inland throughout from the top edge

of the cliffs, and from the inland edge of the shore or beach where there is no cliff, between Sparkhayes Lane, in the parish of Luccombe, in the county of Somerset, on the west, and Shurton Bars, in the parish of Stogursey, in the said county, on the east.

(b) In the area comprising Brean Down and the parts of the parishes of Brean, Weston-super-Mare, and Uphill, described in Clause V of this Order.

## Map of Areas.

VII. The areas described in Clause V of this Order within which the killing and taking of all Wild Birds is prohibited during the whole of the year are outlined in blue, and the areas described in Clause VI of this Order within which the taking or destroying of the Egg or Eggs of any species of Wild Bird is prohibited are outlined in red on a map, sealed with the Home Office seal, dated the 2nd December, 1912, and deposited in the office of the Clerk of the County Council at Weston-super-Mare.

## Duration of Order.

VIII. This Order shall not remain in force after the expiration of five years from the date thereof.

#### Repeal of former Order.

IX. The Order of the 22nd March, 1909, is hereby repealed.

#### H. 14783.

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from His Majesty's Minister at the Hague, reporting that an Official Notice to the following effect has appeared in the Staatscourant, viz.:-

From November 22, 1912, the importation and carriage in transit of rags, used wearing apparel, and unwashed underclothing and bedding from any of the ports of Turkey in Europe is forbidden.

This prohibition includes baggage brought by travellers in so far as unwashed underclothing and bedding are concerned; it does not, how-ever, extend to the import and carriage in transit of goods which have arrived from the above-named places, but in regard to which it appears sufficiently clearly that they have some other place of origin, and that they are packed and have been transported in such manner that

they cannot have been in contact with infected objects.

Moreover, the prohibition as regards carriage in transit is not to extend to goods packed in such a manner that they cannot undergo any kind of manufacture or treatment on the way.

#### H. 14863.

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from His Majesty's Minister at Bucharest, enclosing the following Summary of a Decree issued by the Roumanian Ministry on the 12th November:—

- (1.) Entry from Constantinople is closed except via Sulina and Constantza. Passage across the Danube for both passengers and goods is closed except by the ports of Calarasi, Guirgevo, Turnu Magurelle, Corabia and Turnu Severin.
- (2.) Arrivals from Constantinople are subjected to the provisions of the Paris Sanitary Convention (1903).
- (3.) Passengers from Constantinople must undergo 5 days' observation at their homes.
- (4.) The arrival from Constantinople of workmen in bodies is prohibited.
- (5.) The importation from Constantinople of fresh meat, vegetables and fruit is prohibited.

His Majesty's Minister states that a subsequent decree, dated November 15th, extends the operation of these measures to arrivals from all parts of Turkey.

#### H. 15002.

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from His Majesty's Consul-General at Trieste, transmitting the following translation of a Circular, dated the 21st November, issued by the Imperial and Royal Marine Board at Trieste:—

With reference to the outbreak of cholera in the Eastern region of European Turkey, and considering the danger of its rapid extension, and it not being possible to control the spreading of the disease on the frontiers on account of the present war in the Balkans, the Imperial and Royal Marine Board dispose as follows:

- (1.) Arrivals from the ports of Anatolia situated on the litoral extending from the city of Bedereghi to Smyrna inclusive, will be treated according to Government Circular of August the 12th, 1904, No. 12468, by which the dispositions taken by the International Sanitary Conference of Paris (1903) were published in so far as these refer to the Maritime Sanitary Service.
- (2.) Arrivals from the ports of Anatolia not included in No. 1, from the ports of European Turkey in the Aegean and the Black Sea, also those from the Bulgarian ports, will be subjected on their arrivals in one of the Austrian ports on the literal to a severe medical examination from the result of which the sanitary treatment will depend.
- (3.) The Government Circulars of April the 24th, 1912, No. 10956, of June the 11th, 1912, No. 15149, of September the 12th, 1912, No. 23609, of September the 3rd, 1912, No. 23116, and of November the 12th, 1912, No. 29094, remain in force for the towns of Mersina, Alexandretta, Latakia, and Beyruth, also the literal from the Bosphorus to Dedeagatch has been declared infected with cholera, the regulations of the International Sanitary Conference of Paris (1903) being applied to same.

#### MERSEY CONSERVANCY ACT, 1842

Mersey Conservancy, 66, Victoria Street, London, S.W., 3rd December, 1912.

I hereby give notice, pursuant to the 9th section of the Act 5 and 6 Victoria, cap. 110, intituled "An Act for better preserving the Navigation of the River Mersey," that I have received a notice from the Mersey Docks and Harbour Board of their intention to carry out works, with the consent of the Lords of the Admiralty and with the approval of the Commissioners for the Conservancy of the River Mersey, under the powers of and as provided by the Mersey Docks and Harbour Act, 1857, the Mersey Dock Acts Consolidation Act, 1858, and the Mersey Docks and

Harbour Board Act, 1912, in or adjoining the Crosby Channel, being a sea channel within the Port of Liverpool, to improve and better maintain and preserve the navigation of the Port for the safety and convenience of ships frequenting the same.

The Mersey Docks and Harbour Board hereby give notice of their intention to construct the undermentioned work or works in the Estuary of the River Mersey under their powers contained in the Mersey Docks and Harbour Act, 1857, the Mersey Dock Acts Consolidation Act, 1858, and the Mersey Docks and Harbour Board Act, 1912, with the consent of the Lords of the Admiralty, and the approval of the Commissioners for the Conservancy of the River Mersey, viz.:—

Work No. 1.—A Training Bank on the western side of Crosby Channel in the Estuary of the River Mersey or Liverpool Bay, commencing at or near the easterly end of the Rock Channel, at a point situate 1,000 yards or thereabouts measured in a north-westerly direction from the Rock Lighthouse, and terminating at a point situate 2,660 yards or thereabouts measured in a westerly direction from the beach mark on the foreshore of the urban district of Little Crosby, known as the Crosby Beach Mark.

Work No. 2.—A Training Bank on the eastern side of Crosby and Formby Channels in the Estuary of the River Mersey or Liverpool Bay, commencing at a point situate 1,230 yards or thereabouts measured in a west north-westerly direction from the north outer measured mile mark on the foreshore of the urban district of Great Crosby, and terminating at a point 1,600 yards or thereabouts measured in a north north-westerly direction from the beach mark on the foreshore of the urban district of Little Crosby, known as the Crosby Beach Mark.

Note.—Each of the Works No. 1 and No. 2 will have its highest part or crest throughout its length at or about the level of mean low water mark, and will be formed of clay protected by stone or slag on the slope of the side nearest to the channel, that is, the eastern side in the case of Work No. 1, and the western side in the case of Work No. 2.

Work No. 3.—A stone revetment to the height of mean low water level or thereabouts in extension west-north-westerly of the Taylor's Bank Revetment, on the south-western face of Taylor's Bank, in Crosby Channel, in the Estuary of the River Mersey or Liverpool Bay, commencing in the existing revetment at a point 4,570 yards or thereabouts measured in a north-westerly direction from the beach mark on the foreshore of the urban district of Little Crosby, known as the Crosby Beach Mark, and

terminating at a point 5,940 yards or thereabouts measured in a north-westerly direction from the said Crosby Beach Mark.

The object of the works is the better direction and control of the ebb and flow of the tidal and other waters of the River Mersey and the Estuary thereof, thereby to deepen, widen and straighten the sea channels within the Port of Liverpool, for the purpose of improving, better maintaining and preserving the navigation of the Port for the safety and convenience of ships frequenting the same.

The works will, with the consent and approval aforesaid, be commenced on or after

two months from this date.

Plans and sections of the proposed works have been deposited at the Mersey Conservancy Office, 66, Victoria Street, London, S.W., and with the Hydrographer to the Admiralty, at the Admiralty, London, S.W.

## MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

#### COUNTY OF BUCKINGHAM.

Whereas by sub-section 1 of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is enacted that within any limits or place referred to in regulations made by the Local Government Board with a view to the safety of the public, on the appli-

cation of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour:

So much of the Aylesbury Road as extends for a distance of 150 yards from its junction with the Thame Road aforesaid; and

So much of the road through the town of Princes Risborough (including Duke Street, High Street, and Bell Street) as extends from the junction of the Thame Road and Aylesbury Road to a point in the Wycombe Road 20 yards south-west of its junction with Bell Lane.

Notice is hereby further given, that objections to the making of any such regulation may be sent in writing to the Local Government Board, at their offices at Whitehall, London, on or before the twenty-third day of December, 1912.

#### ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 1ST DECEMBER 1912.)

KENT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1912.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Movement into, out of, or within Scheduled District.

- 1.—(1.) No cattle, sheep, goats or swine shall be landed in or moved into or out of the District described in the Schedule to this Order, hereinafter referred to as the Scheduled District, or be moved along, over, or across, or be allowed by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon, a highway or thoroughfare within the Scheduled District; provided that nothing in this Order shall be deemed to apply to the movement of animals into or out of the Scheduled District where they are moved through such District by railway from a place outside such District to another place outside such District without unnecessary delay and without the animals being untrucked within such District.
- (2.) If any farm (except any detached part) is partly within and partly without the Scheduled District, the whole shall be deemed to be within the Scheduled District.

#### Power to Restrict Movement of Persons in Certain Cases.

- 2.—(1.) An Inspector of the Local Authority acting under their direction may serve a Notice on the occupier of any field, shed, or other place in the Scheduled District, prohibiting the entry of any person into any such field, shed, or other place, and thereupon, notwithstanding the existence of any footpath or right of way, no person shall enter the field, shed, or other place to which the Notice relates while any cattle, sheep, goats or swine are therein, otherwise than in accordance with the following regulations, that is to say:
  - (i.) The owner of the field, shed, or other place, or of the animals therein, or the agent or servants of such owner, may enter such

- field, shed, or other place so far as may be necessary for the feeding or tending of the animals.
- (ii.) Any other person may enter such field, shed, or other place with a licence of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.
- (2.) Copies of such Notice shall be affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner as he shall think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions hereby imposed.
- (3.) A copy of every such Notice shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector to the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, 4, Whitehall Place, London, S.W.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

3. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

#### Offences.

- 4.—(1.)
