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Milan, April 15.

OUR Governor the Marquis de Leganez, and the Count de Louvigny, Maître de Camp General, went on the 9th instant to Parma, and from thence to Alexandria, and having taken a Review of the Troops quartered in and about those Places, they returned hither on the 12th. His Excellency has since given out Orders for the Troops to be in a readiness to march into the Field by the end of this Month; The Place of their General Rendezvous is not yet appointed; but in the mean time 'tis generally believed that they will march towards Piedmont; and that the Siege of Casal, which has of late been much talk'd of, will be deferred till another time. The German Troops that have had their Winter-quarters in the Dutchies of Mantua, Parma, and Montferrat, do prepare likewise to take the Field, and expect Recruits from Germany to compleat them. This Week arrived here Signior Eugene Durazzo, Envoy from Genoa, and yesterday he had his publick Audience of our Governor; He comes to adjust the matter about the Contributions demanded by the Germans of that Republick.

Venice, April 18. Two days ago arrived here a Felucca, dispatched by Signior Mocenigo, Captain of the Gulf, with an account of his arrival in Ifria with four Gallies from the Levant, and that he had with him Signior Francesco Donna, who was Governor of the Fortress of Carabusa in the Kingdom of Candia, at the time it was betrayed to the Turks; He was then made a Prisoner, and now lately Ranomed. These Gallies touched at Napoli di Malvasia, and there heard, that the Turks had lost two Ships, bound with 600 Soldiers from Candia to Constantinople, who were cast away near the Isle of St. Theodore. On Tuesday last were Mustered at the Lido 450 new raised Dragoons, who were afterwards Ship'd, in order to pass to the Levant with the Convoy that lies ready to Sail with the first fair Wind. The Doge Morosini continues his Resolution of setting out about the middle of the next Month.

Turin, April 24. On the 19th came hither 500 Spanish Horse from the Milanese, and on the 20th they continued their march towards Vigon, to relieve the Germans who have been quartered there all this Winter. The Marquis de Leganez is expected here the beginning of the next Week. The Inhabitants of the Valley of Pragelas have already paid 10000 Livres to the Vaudois, being the first payment of their Contributions according to Agreement; The next Week the Valley of Roiras is to find in their first payment likewise; And the Inhabitants of the Valley of Cozane have also sent Deputies to Treat about their Contributions. We have advice that the Governor of Pignerol has caused the Count de Phenil, a Piedmontois by Birth, who has been several years in the French Service, to be seized and put under close Confinement, upon

Suspicion of his holding Correspondence with the Ministers of this Court. His Royal Highness has had again 3 Fits of his Ague.

Vienna, April 25. The Imperial Forces in Hungary will now quickly begin to move towards the General Rendezvous, which is ordered to be between Buda and Eszék. 'Tis not yet declared who is to have the Chief Command of the Emperors Army on that side. The Advices from the Frontiers say, That the Ottoman Army is to Rendezvous at Sopha about the end of the next month, and that the Grand Visier is expected there against that time from Adrianople. The Sieur Desferre, Commissary of War, went the last Week to Ratisbona to receive 4000 Bavarians into the Emperors Service, part of which are designed to Recruit the German Troops in Italy, and the rest will be sent by V Vater to Hungary.

Brussels, May 2. General Trenchard has been with the Landgrave of Hesse Cassel to let him know, that Prince Lewis of Hanover has settled every thing with the States of Brabant and Flanders, entirely to his Satisfaction, as well as to Consist with him upon other Matters relating to the Campaign; and having performed this Commission, he passed through this place yesterday in his return, to give Prince Lewis an account of it. The Imperial and Confederate Troops that are to act on the Upper Rhine are every where preparing to leave their Quarters, and to march to the General Rendezvous, where they are ordered to be about the 20th of this Month; And Materials are provided for the laying a Bridge over the Rhine, though the place is not yet appointed. The French Troops assembled about Neffels in the Palatinate, and expect the Dauphin to Command them.

Cologne, May 5. The French Troops that were Garrisoned at Trier are marched from thence; the greatest part towards the Palatinate, and the rest towards Flanders. The Elector Palatine has been lately very much indisposed, but is now on his Recovery.

Paris, May 4. The French King has put off his Journey to Marli till to morrow; 'Tis said he will set out for the Campaign on the 16th or 18th of this month. The Regiment of Guards is to begin its march on the 10th. The Marechal de Noailles is gone to Command on the Frontiers of Catalonia; And the Marechal de Lorge will put from hence to morrow for Germany, but the Marechal de Luxembourg is still here. The Letters from Thoulon of the 25th past, tell us, That they were still at Work in refitting the Count d'Esprez Squadron, and that some of the Ships were come to the Isles of Hierre. We hear that the want there is of Corn in several Parts of the Kingdom, has occasioned divers Tumults, and particularly in Dauphine, where, to pacifie the People, the Commissaries were obliged to distribute among them the Corn that was laid up for the use of the Troops.

Brussels, May 6. We have advice that the Enemy have made out a Camp at Perwez between Tournay and Conde, about 3 or 4 Leagues from Aeth, and that their Troops are marching thither from the Neighbourhood of Mons. Some of the Enemies Forces encamped on Sunday last near Hailbecke, and were joyned there by the Garrison that marched out of Courmay. About 4 or 5 days ago the Governor of Aeth sent out a Party of 80 Foot, who passed the Scelde, and advanced near to Tournay, where they took divers Horses, and other Poory. Orders are given to make out a Camp for the Confederate Forces near Hanne, between Alost and Dendermonde, about 6 or 7 Leagues from Audenarde; And every thing is preparing on our side for the speedy opening of the Campaign.
