GEORGE THE FIFTH, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India, To Our Right Trusty and Right Entirely Beloved Cousin and Counsellor Henry, Duke of Norfolk, Knight of Our Most Noble Order of the Garter, Knight Grand Cross of Our Royal Victorian Order, Earl Marshal and Hereditary Marshal of England,

Greeting!

Whereas the Master, Wardens, Assistants and Elder Brethren of the Guild, Fraternity or Brotherhood of the Most Glorious and Undivided Trinity and of St. Clement, in the parish of Deptford Strond, in the county of Kent, commonly called the Corporation of Trinity House of Deptford Strond, have represented unto Us that the Elder Brethren of the said Corporation have long been accustomed to use the style and title of "Captain," and have humbly prayed that We may be graciously

pleased to grant and confirm unto the said Elder Brethren the style and title of "Captain" and precedence after Captains in Our Navy:

Now know ye that in the exercise of Our Royal Prerogative We do hereby declare Our Royal Will and Pleasure that in all times hereafter the Elder Brethren of the said Corporation of Trinity House shall be styled "Captain," and shall on all social and ceremonial occasions have place and precedence next and immediately after the place and precedence which may be accorded to Captains in Our Navy.

Our Will and Pleasure therefore is that you Henry, Duke of Norfolk, to whom the cognizance of matters of this nature doth properly belong, do see this Our Order kept and observed, and that you do cause the same to be recorded in Our College of Arms to the end that Our Officers of Arms and all others upon occasion may take full notice and have knowledge thereof.

Given at Our Court at Saint James's the eighteenth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and twelve, in the third year of Our Reign.

GLAMORGAN (GOWER DISTRICT) (MOVEMENT OF SHEEP) ORDER OF 1912.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

# Application of Order.

1.—(1.) This Order shall apply to the area described in the First Schedule hereto, which

- is hereinafter referred to as "the Scheduled Area," and shall also apply to any premises in the neighbourhood of the Scheduled Area to which the Order may be applied by a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Board or of the Local Authority and served upon the occupier of the premises described in such Notice.
- (2.) This Order shall cease to apply to any premises upon service on the occupier thereof of a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Board.
- (3.) A copy of every Notice served under this Article shall forthwith be sent to the Board by the Inspector signing the same.

#### Restriction of Movement of Sheep.

- 2.—(1.) Notwithstanding anything contained in any other Order of the Board or in any Notice served thereunder, sheep shall not (except as hereinafter provided) be moved out of the Scheduled Area, or from any premises to which this Order is applied by Notice under the preceding Article, unless—
  - (i.) they are accompanied by a licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination specified in the licence is situate; or
  - (ii.) they are moved direct to a slaughterhouse having previous to such movement been marked by the painting or stamping with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each sheep, thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long.
- (2.) A licence for movement under this Article shall be granted only
  - (i.) if the Inspector is satisfied that the sheep have been dipped by a thorough immersion in an efficient sheep-dip in the presence, and to the satisfaction, of an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District within twenty-eight days before the date on which the application for a licence is made and that since such dipping the sheep have been kept separate from sheep not so dipped, and upon production of a declaration in the Form A set forth in the Second Schedule to this Order or to the like effect signed by the owner of the sheep or his agent authorised for this purpose; or
    - (ii.) upon production to the Inspector of
      (a) a certificate by a duly qualified
      veterinary surgeon to the effect that he
      has within ten days before the application
      for a licence is made examined each of the

sheep to be moved, and found it to be free from sheep-scab; and

(b) a declaration signed by the owner of the sheep, or his agent authorised for this purpose, to the effect that since such examination the sheep have been kept separate from other sheep, and have not been exposed in any market, fairground, saleyard or exhibition; or

(iii.) upon the conditions, to be inserted in the licence, that the sheep shall be moved to the place of destination specified in the licence and not be moved therefrom or be allowed to come in contact with any other sheep until they shall have been dipped by a thorough immersion in an efficient sheep-dip in the presence, and to the satisfaction, of an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District.

- A licence under paragraph (ii.) or (iii.) shall only be granted where, in the opinion of the Inspector granting it, compliance with paragraph (i.) is impracticable or inexpedient.
- (3.) A declaration shall be retained by the Inspector granting a licence thereon.
- (4.) The licence shall be in force for eight days, inclusive of the day of issue, and shall be in the Form B set forth in the Second Schedule to this Order or to the like effect.
- (5.) Sheep moved under this Article to a slaughter-house shall after their arrival thereat be there detained until they are slaughtered.

# Provisions as to farms on borders of Scheduled Area.

3. Where any farm or holding is situate partly within and partly without the Scheduled Area the provisions of this Order shall apply to the farm or holding and the sheep thereon as if the whole farm or holding were in the Area.

### Licences after Completion of Movement.

4. Where sheep are moved with a licence under this Order, the licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station in the same District by the person in charge of the sheep at the time of completing the said movement.

#### General Provisions as to Movement.

5. Sheep, while being moved under this Order, shall as far as practicable be kept separate from all other sheep, and, if moved with a licence, shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the place of destination specified in the licence, and not elsewhere.

# Provision for Movement through Scheduled Area.

- 6. For the purposes of this Order, sheep shall not be deemed to be moved out of the Scheduled Area in any case where they are moved through such Area by road from a place outside such Area to another place outside such Area, provided such movement is authorised by a licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District of the place where the sheep enter the Area.

#### Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

7.—(1.) Any person in charge of a sheep being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the licence, if any authorising the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

#### Local Authority to enforce Order.

8. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

#### Offences.

- 9.—(1.) If a sheep is moved in contravention of this Order, or of a licence granted thereunder, the owner of the sheep, and the person in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the sheep, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the sheep is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (2.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by clipping, or washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted or stamped on any sheep, as required by this Order. the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the sheep, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (3.) If a person in charge of a sheep being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (4.) If a sheep is not isolated as required by this Order, or by a licence thereunder, the owner of the sheep, and the person in charge thereof, and the occupier of the place where the sheep is detained, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

#### Interpretation.

10. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires—

"Efficient sheep-dip" means a sheep-dip approved by the Board for sheep-scab, or purporting to be so approved:
"Inspector" includes Veterinary Inspector:

# THE PUBLIC HEALTH ACTS AMEND-MENT ACT, 1907.

QUARRY BANK URBAN DISTRICT.

of the Local Government Board, dated the 13th day of December, 1912, it is declared that on and after the 24th day of January, 1913, sections 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25, 27, 28, 29, 30, 31, 32, and 33, comprised in Part II; Part III; and sections 52, 53, 54, 55, 56, 57, 58, 59, 60, 61, 62, 63, 64, 65, 66, and 67, comprised in Part IV of the above Act, shall be in force in the above district, subject to the conditions and adaptations specified in the following Schedule:—

#### SCHEDULE.

Part II.

Section Twentyfive. "The power of making or enforcing bye-laws under section one hundred and fifty-seven of the Public Health Act, 1875, as extended by section twenty-three of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1890, with respect to the paving of yards and open

spaces in connexion with dwelling - houses, shall cease to be exerciseable."

Section Twentyseven. "(7) Nothing in this section shall apply to any temporary building erected or set up for use by the Territorial Force."

Section Thirtyeight. "Nothing in this section shall prejudicially affect any power or right exerciseable by or attaching to an owner or occupier of premises by virtue of section twenty-two of the Public Health Act, 1875, or of section eighteen of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1890."

Part IV. Section Fiftynine.

"(6) Nothing in this section shall apply to a public or circulating library which is not within the district."
