MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

Regulations under Section 9 (1).

BOROUGH OF BANBURY.

To the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Banbury;-

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (herein-after referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that, within any limits or place referred to in Regulations made by Us, the Local Government Board, with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at

a speed exceeding ten miles per hour;
And whereas the Town Council of the Borough of Banbury having made application to Us to make a Regulation in pursuance of the said sub-section putting the above-mentioned provisions of that sub-section in force within the limits comprising certain roads or parts of roads situate within the Borough of Banbury (herein-after referred to as "the Borough"), We directed a Local Inquiry to be held into the matter by one of Our Inspectors, and the Inquiry was held accordingly, and Report has been made to Us thereon:

NOW THEREFORE, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, We do, by Order, \mathbf{make} the following Regulations:

ARTICLE I.—The provisions of sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Act with respect to the driving of a motor car at a speed not exceeding ten miles per hour shall apply and have effect within the limits comprising the roads or parts of roads within the Borough which are specified in the Schedule hereto.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen.

Parsons Street and Market Place;

So much of High Street as extends from a point in the road 50 yards south-west of the "White Lion" Hotel to a point in the road 50 yards east of the "Red Lion" Hotel; and

So much of Warwick Road as extends from its junction with Southam Road to a point 50 feet west of its junction with Boxhedge Road.
