His Majesty's Minister at Athens has reported to His Majesty's Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, by telegraph, that the Greek Government have notified the laying of mines outside the Piræus. Vessels are allowed entrance and exit between the hours of 7 a.m. and 5 p.m. only, and must carry pilots.

Vessels arriving from the eastward and southward must take pilot off Fleva Island, and those from the westward off Cape Taohi, where pilots will be always in readiness.

And to command that the said Royal Concession and Declaration be recorded in His Majesty's said College of Arms.
