The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Application of Order.

1.—(1.) This Order shall apply to the Area described in the Schedule hereto, which is hereinafter referred to as the Scheduled Area.

(2.) Where any farm or holding is situate partly within and partly without the Scheduled Area the provisions of this Order shall, notwithstanding anything contained in any other Order of the Board, apply to the farm or holding and the sheep thereon as if the whole farm or holding were in the Area.

Restriction on Movement of Sheep out of Scheduled Area throughout the Year.

2.—(1.) Sheep shall not be moved out of the Scheduled Area unless they are accompanied by a Licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority.

(2.) Unless the Inspector is satisfied

(a) that the sheep are intended for immediate slaughter and that it is impracticable or inexpedient that the sheep should in accordance with the provisions of this Order be dipped before movement for such purpose; or

(b) that the sheep are to be moved direct to a slaughterhouse;

a Licence for movement under this Article shall, subject as hereinafter provided, be granted only for sheep in respect of which the Inspector is satisfied that they have within twenty-eight days before the Licence is granted been dipped twice, with an interval of not less than ten and not more than twenty-one days between the dippings, by a thorough immersion in a sheep dip approved by the Board for sheep-scab or purporting to be so approved, and have since the first dipping been kept separate from other sheep not so dipped.

(3.) A Licence under this Article shall have effect as a declaration under Article 15 of the

Sheep-Dipping (Scotland and North of England) Order of 1907, in respect of the sheep to which the Licence applies.

(4.) Where the Local Authority are satisfied that a farm or holding in the Scheduled Area (not being a farm or holding which comprises common or uninclosed land) has been free from sheep-scab for a period of three years or longer, and that sheep on such farm or holding are not exposed to the risk of infection by contact with sheep on other premises, the Local Authority may, on application by the occupier of such farm or holding, and on production of such evidence as may be required, exempt sheep on such farm or holding from one of the two dippings prescribed by this Order as necessary to obtain a Licence for movement out of the Scheduled Area of sheep on such farm or holding. The Local Authority shall not grant an exemption in any case where it might increase the risk of the spread of sheep-scab.

(5.) Every exemption shall be signed by the Clerk of the Local Authority, and a copy shall be sent to the Board by the Local Authority.

(6.) An exemption may at any time be terminated by an Inspector of the Board by a notice signed by him and served on the occupier of the farm or holding to which the exemption relates, but not so as to affect the legality of anything done under the exemption before service of such notice of termination.

(7.) The applicant for a Licence under this Order in respect of sheep on exempted premises must produce to the Inspector the exemption, and a declaration by the occupier of the premises or his duly authorised agent to the effect (a) that the sheep to be moved are not affected with, or suspected of, sheep-scab, (b) that no sheep on the exempted premises has been affected with sheep-scab since the exemption was granted, and (c) that to the best of his knowledge and belief the sheep to which the declaration relates have not been exposed to the infection of sheep-scab.

(8.) Nothing in this Article shall affect the operation of the Pennine Range Sheep-Dipping Order of 1912, except that no Licence authorising movement out of the Scheduled Area to which that Order applies shall be required in respect of sheep which are being moved under and in accordance with a Licence under this Article which authorises their movement to a place outside that Scheduled Area and which are accompanied by the Licence.

General Provisions as to Movement.

3. Sheep, while being moved with a Licence under this Order, shall be kept as far as practicable separate from all sheep in the Scheduled Area which are not being moved with such a Licence.

Provision for Movement through Scheduled Area.

4. For the purposes of this Order, sheep shall not be deemed to be moved out of the Scheduled Area where they are moved through

the Area from a place outside the Area to another place outside the Area, provided that such movement is authorised by a Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority for the county of Cumberland.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

5.—(1.) Any person in charge of a sheep being moved, where under this Order a Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, authorising the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

6. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

7.—(1.) If a sheep is moved in contravention of this Order, or of a Licence granted thereunder, the owner of the sheep, and the person in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the sheep, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the sheep is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If a person in charge of a sheep being moved, where under this Order a Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

8. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires—

“Inspector” includes Veterinary Inspector:

“The Board” means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries:

“The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Commencement.

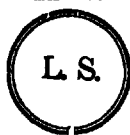

By the said Order it was provided that where a section to which reference is made in the first column of the First Schedule hereto is a section comprised in Part V, or is one of the sections above described as comprised in Part II, Part III, or Part IV, and declared to be in force, the section shall be in force in the District of the borough, and shall have effect, unless and until the Local Government Board, by Order, otherwise declare and direct as if the words and figures set forth in the second column of the said Schedule opposite to the reference to that section in the first column thereof were added to and formed part of the section.

It was also provided that, on and after the date of the confirmation of any bye-laws made by the Corporation of Nelson under the Public Health Acts, 1875 to 1907, with respect to the height of chimneys of buildings, the local Act cited in the first column of Part I of the Second Schedule hereto should, to the extent specified in the second column thereof, be no longer in force in the borough, and that on and after the 27th day of February, 1913, the local Act cited in the first column of Part II of the Second Schedule hereto should, to the extent specified in the second column thereof, be no longer in force in the borough; and that where an enactment in a local Act other than an enactment specified in Part I or Part II of the Second Schedule hereto contains provisions which alter, amend, apply or otherwise relate to an enactment so specified, those provisions to the extent to which they are inconsistent with any section or Part of the said Act of 1907 to which the said Order applies, should not be in force in the borough on and after the day upon which that enactment ceases to be in force in the borough.
