THE SPECIAL EXCLUSION (DREDGER-MEN, &c.) ORDER, 1913. Dated January 31st, 1913, made by the Board of Trade under Part II of the National Insurance Act, 1911. (1 & 2 Geo. 5, c. 55.)

In pursuance of section 104 of the National Insurance Act, 1911, the Board of Trade hereby make the following Special Order:—

(1) The Board of Trade hereby exclude from the occupations which are to be deemed employment in an insured trade for the purposes of Part II of the National Insurance Act, 1911 (Unemployment Insurance), the occupation followed by-

Members of the Crews of Dredgers, Hoppers, or other vessels engaged in

(a) excavating materials by dredging or conveying materials so excavated, or

(b) conveying away materials, whether excavated or not,

in or in connection with the construction, reconstruction or alteration of Harbours, Docks or Channels.

- (2) For the purpose of this Order the expression "Harbour" shall have the same meaning as that assigned to it in the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894.
- (3) This Order may be cited as the Special Exclusion (Dredgermen, &c.) Order, 1913, and shall come in force on the date hereof.

GENERAL ORDER OF THE LOCAL

GOVERNMENT BOARD.

REGULATIONS AS TO CASUAL PAUPERS.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the several Poor Law Unions for the time being in England and Wales other than the Poor Law Unions comprised within the Administrative County of London;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by General Orders dated the 18th day of December, 1882 (hereinafter referred to as "the Order of 1882"), the 11th day of June, 1892, and the 4th day of May, 1897, We, the Local Government Board, prescribed Regulations with reference to casual paupers;

And whereas there have been constituted in certain areas Committees for the better admin-

istration of relief to casual paupers;

And whereas it is expedient that further provision should be made as hereinafter mentioned:

NOW THEREFORE, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order as follows (that is to say):—

ARTICLE I.—This Order shall apply and have effect throughout every Poor Law Union in England and Wales other than a Poor Law Union comprised within the Administrative County of London.

ARTICLE II.—Where for the purpose of the better administration of relief to casual paupers in any area a Board of Guardians, or

two or more Boards of Guardians jointly, shall have either appointed or made arrangements with a Committee constituted for that purpose to administer relief in accordance with a scheme approved by Us, the said Board of Guardians or each of the said Boards of Guardians may defray such reasonable expenditure as may be necessary for the purposus of the said scheme, including the reasonable travelling expenses of not more than two members of the Board of Guardians, or of one member and of the clerk of the Board of Guardians in attending meetings of the said Committee: Provided that no member of a Board of Guardians shall be paid any travelling expenses to any meeting of the said Committee when such meeting shall be held within the Poor Law Union for which he acts.

ARTICLE III.—In this Order the expression "casual pauper" has the same meaning as in the Order of 1882, and the expressions "Board of Guardians" and "Poor Law Union" have, in each case, the meaning assigned to the expression, as respects England and Wales, by the Interpretation Act, 1889.

ARTICLE IV .- This Order may be cited as the Casual Paupers Order, 1913.



BYE-LAW

made by the County Council of the North Riding of Yorkshire for regulating the use of locomotives and of waggons drawn by locomotives on any highway in the administrative County, except in the Boroughs of Scarborough and Thornaby-on-Tees:—

A person in charge of a locomotive drawing two or more loaded or unloaded waggons shall not cause or suffer the locomotive to travel on any highway without having (1) a cord or other efficient means of communication extending from the rearmost waggon to such locomotive, and (2) a person who shall (except during the time it is necessary for him to leave his position in order to comply with any Statutory Regulation or Bye-law relating to the use of locomotives on highways) travel in the rear of such waggons. Such last-mentioned person shall signal to the driver of such locomotive to stop or drive to the side of the highway when it shall be necessary to do so in order to enable over-

taking pedestrians, vehicles, horses, or cattle to pass by. And the person in charge of such locomotive shall, upon receiving any such signal as aforesaid, immediately stop such locomotive and waggons, or draw it and them to the side of the highway as the case may require.

Provided always that nothing herein contained shall apply to a steam roller not drawing more than three loaded or unloaded waggons.
