GENERAL ORDER OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT BOARD.

REGULATIONS AS TO CASUAL PAUPERS.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the several Poor Law Unions for the time being in England and Wales other than the Poor Law Unions comprised within the Administrative County of London;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by General Orders dated the 18th day of December, 1882 (hereinafter referred to as "the Order of 1882"), the 11th day of June, 1892, and the 4th day of May, 1897, We, the Local Government Board, prescribed Regulations with reference to casual paupers;

And whereas there have been constituted in certain areas Committees for the better administration of relief to casual paupers;

And whereas it is expedient that further provision should be made as hereinafter mentioned:

NOW THEREFORE, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order as follows (that is to say):—

ARTICLE I.—This Order shall apply and have effect throughout every Poor Law Union in England and Wales other than a Poor Law Union comprised within the Administrative County of London.
