

Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Paul, Stanley, Liverpool.'

"And we further recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the whole right of patronage of the said District so recommended to be constituted and when such District shall have become a New Parish under the provisions of the firstly hereinbefore mentioned Act then of the said New Parish and of the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereto, shall be assigned to and be absolutely vested in the Saint Paul's Trustees, their heirs and assigns, for the same purposes as the advowson of the said late Church of Saint Paul was held by them, as contemplated by the said twenty-fifth section of the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Act, 1910, and shall and may from time to time be exercised by them.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Paul, Stanley, Liverpool, being:—

"All that part of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Ann, Stanley, in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Liverpool, which is bounded upon the south by the New Parish of All Saints, Stoneycroft, upon the east, upon the north-east, and upon the north-west by the Parish of West Derby, both in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the south-west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of West Derby from the said New Parish of Saint Ann, Stanley, at the junction of the road called Tynwald Hill with Green Lane, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Green Lane for a distance of twelve chains and a half or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the passage running along the backs of the houses on the southern side of Portelet Road, and extending thence north-eastward to and along the middle of the said passage (thereby crossing Menstone Road) for a distance of fourteen chains or thereabouts to its present eastern end near the south-western corner of the close numbered 279 upon the Ordnance Map of Liverpool published in the year one thousand nine hundred and eight upon the scale of twenty-five inches to a mile and also upon the map or plan annexed to this Scheme, and extending thence north-eastward first to the south-western corner of the said close and then along the fence forming the southern boundary of such close for a distance of nine chains and a half or thereabouts to its eastern end on the western side of the passage running along the backs of the houses on the western side of Stoneville Road, and extend-

ing thence first eastward to the middle of such passage and then southward along the middle of the said passage and in a line in continuation thereof for a distance in all of six chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of Derwent Road, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Derwent Road for a distance of eight yards or thereabouts to its junction with Derby Lane, and extending thence southward along the middle of Derby Lane for a distance of thirty-one chains or thereabouts to its junction with Prescott Road upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Ann, Stanley, from the said New Parish of All Saints, Stoneycroft."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the firstly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patron and to the Incumbent of the New Parish of Saint Ann, Stanley, out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patron and Incumbent have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

NOW, THEREFORE, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said first-mentioned Act. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Liverpool.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-nine, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, and the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and fourteen, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the twelfth day of December, in the year one thousand nine hundred and twelve, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-nine, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred
