The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-third at d thirty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-nine, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, and the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and fourteen, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the seventeenth day of October, in the year one thousand nine hundred and twelve, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirtynine, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, and the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and fourteen, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure of Silverdale and Knutton Heath (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice of Silverdale'), in the County of Stafford, and in the Diocese of Lichfield.

"Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Silverdale is vested in the Vicar or Incumbent for the time being of the Vicarage of Wolstanton, in the said County of Stafford, and in the said Diocese of Lichfield.

"And whereas the Reverend Charles James Winn, Vicar or Incumbent of the said Parish of Wolstanton, is desirous that the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Silverdale now vested in him as aforesaid as such Vicar or Incumbent should be transferred to and be vested in the Honourable and Right Reverend Augustus, now Bishop of the said Diocese of Lichfield, and his successors in the same Bishoprick.

"And whereas the said Augustus, Bishop of the said Diocese of Lichfield, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness, and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited, or by some or one of them is made necessary, he, the said Augustus, Bishop of the said Diocese of Lichfield, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned.

"And whereas it appears to us that the transfer of the patronage of the said Benefice of Silverdale which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the parish or district in or in respect of which the right of patronage or advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parish of Silverdale.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the said Charles James Winn, Vicar or Incumbent of the said Parish of Wolstanton, acting as such Vicar or Incumbent (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Augustus, Bishop of the said Diocese of Lichfield (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Silverdale now vested in him, the said Charles James Winn, as such Vicar or Incumbent of the said Vicarage of Wolstanton as aforesaid, shall be transferred from him, the said Charles James Winn, and from his successors, Vicars or Incumbents of the said Vicarage of Wolstanton, to the said Augustus, Bishop of the said Diocese of Lichfield, and his successors, Bishops of the same Diocese; and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Augustus, Bishop of the said Diocese of Lichfield, and by his successors, Bishops of the same Diocese for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Lichfield.

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter ninety-four, of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme or representation, bearing date the twelfth day of December, in the year one thousand nine hundred and twelve, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter ninety-four, the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, and the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme or representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of Saint Mary the Virgin, Acock's Green, and of the New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Sparkhill, both in the county of Worcester and in the diocese of Birmingham.

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the twenty-sixth day of February, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, and published in the London Gazette on the first day of the following month, part of the Parish of Yardley, in the said county of Worcester, and at that time in the diocese of Worcester, but now in the said diocese of Birmingham, was assigned as a District Chapelry to the Consecrated Church of Saint Mary the Virgin, situate at Acock's Green, in the said Parish of Yardley, and the said District Chapelry was named "The District Chapelry of Saint Mary the Virgin, Acock's Green."

"And whereas by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the thirtieth day of April, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninetyfour, and published in the London Gazette on the eighth day of the following month, part of the said Parish of Yardley was assigned as a District Chapelry to the Consecrated Church of Saint John the Evangelist, situate at Sparkhill, in the said Parish of Yardley, and the said District Chapelry was named 'The District Chapelry of Saint John the Evangelist, Sparkhill.'

"And whereas the said District Chapelry of Saint Mary the Virgin, Acock's Green, and the said District Chapelry of Saint John the Evangelist, Sparkhill, have, under the provisions of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, become new parishes of the character contemplated by that Act, by the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, and by the above-mentioned Act of the thirty-second

and thirty-third years of Her said late

Majesty, chapter ninety-four.

'And whereas it has been represented to us, and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Mary the Virgin, Acock's Green, and of the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Sparkhill, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Henry Russell, Bishop of Birmingham (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme or representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme or representation, and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Mary the Virgin, Acock's Green, and of the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Sparkhill, shall be altered so that all that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Mary the Virgin, Acock's Green, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, and is delineated and set forth upon the Map or Plan hereunto annexed, and is thereon coloured pink, shall be dissevered · from such New Parish, and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Spark-

"And we further represent, recommend, and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending, and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"The territory to be dissevered from the New Parish of Saint Mary the Virgin, Acock's Green, in the county of Worcester and in the diocese of Birmingham, and to be annexed to the New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Sparkhill, in the same county and diocese, being:

"All that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Mary the Virgin, Acock's Green, which is bounded upon the west by the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Sparkhill, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north, upon the east, and upon the south, by an imaginary line com-mencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Sparkhill, from the said New Parish of Saint Mary the Virgin, Acock's Green, at a point in the middle of Redding Lane opposite to the western end of the fence which forms the northern boundary of the plot of land which, by a Deed dated the tenth day of February, in the year one thousand nine hundred and ten, and being under the common seal of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners and under the hands and seals of Francis Wigley Greswolde Greswolde-Williams, of Bredenbury Court, Bredenbury, in the county of Hereford, Esquire, and of the Reverend Frederick Hubert Ward, Clerk in Holy Orders, the Vicar of the said New Parish of Saint John

the Evangelist, Sparkhill, was conveyed as the site of and for an intended new church at Tyseley, and as the site of and for a parsonage or house of residence for the spiritual person serving the said intended new church, and extending thence eastward to and along the said fence for a distance in all of fifty-six yards or thereabouts to the point where it meets the fence forming the eastern boundary of the said plot of land, and extending thence southward along the last-mentioned fence for a distance of seventy-seven yards or thereabouts to the point where it meets the fence forming the southern boundary of the said plot of land, and extending thence westward along the lastmentioned fence for a distance of fifty yards or thereabouts to its western end on the eastern side of Redding Lane, and continuing thence westward in precisely the same direction and in a straight line for a distance of seven yards or thereabouts to a point in the middle of Redding Lane upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Mary the Virgin, Acock's Green, from the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Spark-

And whereas drafts of the said scheme or representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such scheme or representation and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent or offered no objection thereto.

And whereas a period of more than one calendar month has elapsed since a draft of the said scheme or representation was transmitted to the said Patrons and Incumbents.

And whereas the said scheme or representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme or representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Birmingham.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Representation, bearing date the sixteenth day of January, in the year one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated Church of Saint Andrew, situate at Porthill, in the Parish of Wolstanton, in the County of Stafford, and in the Diocese of Lichfield.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Andrew, situate at Porthill, as aforesaid.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the Honourable and Right Reverend Augustus, Bishop of Lichfield (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), We, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said Parish of Wolstanton which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said Church of Saint Andrew, situate at Porthill, as aforesaid, and that the same should be named "The District Chapelry of Saint Andrew, Porthill."

"And with the like consent of the said Augustus, Bishop of Lichfield (testified as aforesaid), We, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said Church of Saint Andrew, situate at Porthill as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns, and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices, should be paid, and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: vided always that, so long as the Reverend Charles James Winn, Clerk in Holy Orders, the present Vicar or Incumbent of the vicarage of the said Parish of Wolstanton, shall continue to be such Vicar or Incumbent, all the fees which may be received in respect of such publication, solemnization, or performance at the said Church of Saint Andrew, situate at Porthill as aforesaid, shall be paid over by the minister thereof to the said Charles James Winn, and provided also that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us, the said Commissioners, to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in Your Royal Wisdom, shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint Andrew, Porthill, being:-

"All that part of the Parish of Wolstanton, in the County of Stafford, and in the Diocese of Lichfield, which is bounded upon the west of Lichfield, which is bounded upon the west partly by the new Parish of Chesterton, and partly by the new Parish of Talk o' the Hill, upon the north partly by the new Parish of Kidsgrove, and partly by the particular District of Saint John the Evangelist, Golden Hill, upon the east partly by the new Parish of Saint Mary the Virgin, Tunstall, partly by the new Parish of Saint Paul, Burslem, and partly by the Parish of Burslem, all in the partly by the Parish of Burslem, all in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the south, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Burslem from the said Parish of Wolstanton at the centre of the bridge or culvert which carries the road leading from Bridge Street to the Midland Tileries across Fowles Brook, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the said road (thereby passing under the line of the North Staffordshire Railway), and along the middle of the footpath leading into Pitgreen Lane! for a distance of twenty-seven chains or thereabouts to the point where such footpath joins Pitgreen Lane, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Pitgreen Lane for a distance of seventeen chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with High Street, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of High Street for a distance of three chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Woodland Parade, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Woodland Parade for a distance of twelve chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Albert Terrace, and extending thence southeastward along the middle of Albert Terrace for a distance of two chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with the roadway connecting Albert Terrace with the road called Dimsdale Parade, and extending thence southwestward along the middle of the said roadway for a distance of five chains or thereabouts to its junction with Dimsdale Parade, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Dimsdale Parade, and along the middle of the footpath leading past the northern side of the house and premises known as Dimsdale, towards Church Fields, for a distance of sixty-two chains or thereabouts to the junction of the said footpath with the road leading from Newcastle-under-Lyme to Congle. ton, upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Wolstanton from the said new Parish of Chesterton."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice,

is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Lichfield.

WHEREAS it is among other things enacted by the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, that the Legislature of any British Possession may, by any Act or Ordinance, confirmed by His Majesty in Council, repeal wholly or in part any provisions of the said Act (other than those of the third part thereof which relate to emigrant ships) relating to ships registered in that Possession, but that any such Act or Ordinance shall not take effect until the approval of His Majesty has been proclaimed in the Possession, or until such time thereafter as may be fixed by the Act or Ordinance for the purpose.

And whereas it is among other things enacted by the Colonial Courts of Admiralty Act, 1890, that the Legislature of any British Possession

may by any Colonial law-

(a) declare any court of unlimited civil jurisdiction, whether original or appellate, in that possession to be a Colonial Court of Admiralty, and provide for the exercise by such court of its jurisdiction under the said Act, and limit territorially, or otherwise, the extent of such jurisdiction, and

(b) confer upon any inferior or subordinate court in that possession such partial or limited Admiralty jurisdiction under such regulations and with such appeal (if any) as may seem fit, subject to the proviso that any such Colonial law shall not confer any jurisdiction which is not by the said Act conferred upon a Colonial Court of Admiralty.

And whereas it is further enacted by the Colonial Courts of Admiralty Act, 1890, that every Colonial law which is made in pursuance of the said Act or affects the jurisdiction of or practice or procedure in any Court of such possession in respect of the jurisdiction conferred by the said Act, or alters any such Colonial law as above mentioned which has been previously passed, shall, unless previously approved by His Majesty through a Secretary of State, either be reserved for the signification of His Majesty's pleasure thereon, or contain a suspending clause providing that such law shall not come into operation until His Majesty's pleasure thereon has been publicly signified in the British Possession in which it has been passed.

And whereas by an Act passed in the Session held in the 15th and 16th years of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, entitled "An Act to grant a Representative Constitution to the Colony of New Zealand," it is, amongst

other things, declared that no Bill which shall be reserved for the signification of His Majesty's pleasure thereon shall have any force or authority within the Colony of New Zealand until the Governor of the said Colony shall signify, either by speech or message to the Legislative Council and House of Representatives of the said Colony, or by Proclamation, that such Bill has been laid before His Majesty in Council, and that His Majesty has been pleased to assent to the same.

And whereas by a Proclamation, dated the 10th day of September, 1907, His late Majesty King Edward VII. was graciously pleased to change the style and designation of "the Colony of New Zealand" to "the Dominion of

New Zealand."

And whereas a certain Bill (1912, No. 53) passed by the Legislative Council and House of Representatives of the said Dominion, entitled "An Act to amend the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908," was presented to the Governor of the said Dominion for His Majesty's assent.

And whereas the said Bill was reserved by the said Governor for the signification of His

Majesty's pleasure thereon.

And whereas the said Bill so reserved as aforesaid has been laid before His Majesty in Council, and it is expedient that the said Bill should be confirmed and assented to by His Majesty:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of the said Acts and in exercise of the powers thereby reserved to His Majesty as aforesaid, does by the present Order, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, confirm and declare His Majesty's assent to the said Bill.

WHEREAS by the first section of the Colonial Probates Act, 1892, it is enacted as follows:—

"Her Majesty the Queen may, on being satisfied that the Legislature of any British possession has made adequate provision for the recognition in that possession of probates and letters of administration granted by the Courts of the United Kingdom, direct by Order in Council that this Act shall, subject to any exceptions and modifications specified in the Order, apply to that possession and thereupon, while the Order is in force, this Act shall apply accordingly."

And whereas His Majesty is satisfied that the Legislatures of the British Possessions hereinafter mentioned have made adequate provision for the recognition in those Possessions of Probates and Letters of Administration granted by the Courts of the United Kingdom. Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the above-recited Act in His Majesty vested, is pleased by and with the advice of His Most Honourable Privy Council to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

The Colonial Probates Act, 1892, shall apply to the British Possessions hereunder mentioned:—

The Province of Alberta, in the Dominion of Canada.

The Province of Saskatchewan, in the Dominion of Canada.

And the Right Honourable Lewis Harcourt, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS it is enacted by the County Courts Act, 1888, that it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by Order in Council, from time to time to alter the number and boundaries of the districts and the place of holding any Court:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the 31st day of March, 1913, the boundary of the Colchester Clacton and Harwich District of the County Court Circuit No. 38 shall be extended so as to include the whole of the Harwich Harbour and the whole of the River Stour between highwater mark from such harbour to Catterwade Bridge, Manningtree, and such part of the River Orwell between highwater mark situate in the Counties of Essex and Suffolk south of an imaginary line drawn from Bloody Point, Shotley, in a due easterly direction to Walton Battery, both in the County of Suffolk, and all the part of the Harwich Harbour, the River Stour and the River Orwell hereinbefore referred to, heretofore being part of the County Court Circuit No. 33, be incorporated into and become part of the said Colchester Clacton and Harwich District, and be excluded from and cease to be part of the County Court Circuit No. 33.

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (County Borough of Reading) Order, 1913."

BIRDS.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

II. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the County Borough of Reading to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:-

Honey Buzzard, Harrier, Hobby, Kite, Linnet, Merlin, Bearded Titmouse (Reedling or Reed Pheasant).

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

III. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, does not apply, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County Borough of Reading:

Bittern, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Goldfinch, Harrier, Hobby, Hoopoe, Kingfisher, Kite, Linnet, Merlin, Nightjar (Fern Owl, Goatsucker, Night Hawk), Oriole, Owl (all species), Bearded Titmouse (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), Woodpecker.

All Birds protected on Sundays.

IV. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, does not apply, the killing or taking of Wild Birds on Sundays is prohibited throughout the County Borough of Reading.
