WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (County Borough of Reading) Order, 1913.

Dated 14th February, 1913.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the Council of the County Borough of Reading, I hereby make the following Order :-

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (County Borough of Reading) Order, 1913."

BIRDS.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

II. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the County Borough of Reading to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:-

Honey Buzzard, Harrier, Hobby, Kite, Linnet, Merlin, Bearded Titmouse (Reedling or Reed Pheasant).

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

III. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, does not apply, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County Borough of Reading:

Bittern, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Goldfinch, Harrier, Hobby, Hoopoe, Kingfisher, Kite, Linnet, Merlin, Nightjar (Fern Owl, Goatsucker, Night Hawk), Oriole, Owl (all species), Bearded Titmouse (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), Woodpecker.

All Birds protected on Sundays.
