PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, chapter seventy-seven, of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the thirty-seventh and thirty-eighth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter sixty-three, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the thirtieth day of January, in the year one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, chapter seventy-seven, of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the thirty-seventh and thirty-eighth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter sixty-three, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your

Majesty in Council the following scheme for constituting a new archdeaconry within the Diocese of York, and for endowing such new archdeaconry, and for making certain new arrangements with respect to the existing archdeaconries in the said Diocese of York.

“Whereas the said Diocese of York now comprises four archdeaconries and no more, namely, the Archdeaconry of York or the West Riding, the Archdeaconry of Sheffield, the Archdeaconry of Cleveland, and the Archdeaconry of the East Riding.

‘And whereas the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of York, has represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that a new archdeaconry should be constituted within the said Diocese of York, and should comprise the rural deaneries of Doncaster and Snaith, which are at present within the said Archdeaconry of York or the West Riding, and the Rural Deanery of Wath, which is at present within the said Archdeaconry of Sheffield, and that such new archdeaconry should be endowed in the same manner which is hereinafter recommended and proposed, and, further, that there should be transferred to the said Archdeaconry of York or the West Riding the rural deaneries of Bulmer and Easingwold, which are at present within the said Archdeaconry of Cleveland, and the rural deanery of Escrick,
