#### PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, chapter seventy-seven, of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the thirty-seventh and thirty-eighth years of Her said Majesty, chapter sixty-three, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the sixteenth day of January, in the year one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

say:—
"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, chapter seventy-seven, of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the thirty-seventh and thirty-eighth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter sixty-three, have prepared and now humbly lay before

Your Majesty in Council the following scheme with respect to the archdeaconries and rural deaneries in the diocese of Wakefield.

"Whereas there are within the said diocese of Wakefield two archdeaconries, to wit, the Archdeaconry of Halifax and the Archdeaconry of Huddersfield.

"And whereas the Right Reverend George Rodney, Bishop of the said diocese of Wakefield, has represented to us that it is desirable to make certain new arrangements (being the arrangements hereinafter recommended and proposed) with respect to the said Archdeaconry of Halifax, and to the said Archdeaconry of Huddersfield, and to the rural deaneries within those archdeaconries.

"And whereas the existing areas of the said Archdeaconries of Halifax and Huddersfield, and of the rural deaneries therein, are set forth in the schedule annexed to an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council, bearing date the twenty-ninth day of January, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eightynine, and published in the London Gazette on the fifth day of the following month.

"And whereas we are of opinion that the new arrangements now proposed by the said George Rodney, Bishop of Wakefield, may properly be carried into effect.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said George Rodney, Bishop of Wakefield (in

testimony whereof he hath to this scheme set his hand and his episcopal seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that, as from the day on which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme shall be published in the London Gazette, and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, each of the said Archdeaconries of Halifax and Huddersfield shall comprise and consist of those rural deaneries, the names of which are set down in order under its name, and are numbered consecutively in the schedule to this scheme annexed, and that the name which in such schedule is given to any rural deanery shall be the name thereof, and that every parish, or cure, or church, the name of which is set down in numbered order under the name

of any rural deanery in the first column of the said schedule, shall belong to, and be a part of, the rural deanery and of the archdeaconry under the name of which it so appears, as aforesaid, and shall be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of the rural dean and archdeacon thereof, and shall not any longer belong to, or be a part of, any other rural deanery or of any other archdeaconry, or be subject to the jurisdiction or authority of any other rural dean or of any other archdeacon.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other matter, or thing, with respect to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, under or by virtue of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any

other Act of Parliament.

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the seventeenth and eighteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter eighty-four, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the twelfth day of December, in the year one thousand nine hundred and twelve, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the seventeenth and eighteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter eighty-four, have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for apportioning the income of the benefice (being a rectory) of Lydford, in the county of Devon and in the diocese of Exeter, between that benefice and a certain other benefice, namely, the benefice (being a vicarage) of Saint Michael and All Angels, Princetown, which said last named benefice is situate in the said county of Devon and in the said diocese of Exeter.

"Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to each of the said benefices of Lydford and Saint Michael and All Angels, Princetown, is vested in His Royal Highness Edward Albert Christian George Andrew Patrick David, Prince of Wales, Duke of Cornwall; and Rothesay, Earl of Chester and Carrick, Baron of Renfrew, Lord of the Isles and Great Steward of Scotland (hereinafter called His Royal

Highness) as parcel of the possessions of the Duchy of Cornwall.

"And whereas it has been made to appear to us that the said benefice of Saint Michael and All Angels, Princetown, is at present insufficiently endowed; and that the said benefice of Lydford has endowments of such an amount as that after the charge hereinafter recommended and proposed to be made shall have been placed upon the same endowments, the said benefice of Lydford will still be sufficiently endowed.

"And whereas it has been represented to us, and we are of opinion, that it is desirable that additional provision should be made for the cure of souls within the new parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Princetown, aforesaid, by means of that apportionment of the income of the said benefice of Lydford, which is hereinafter recommended and proposed.

"And whereas the said benefice of Saint Michael and All Angels, Princetown, is vacant, but the said benefice of Lydford is full of a clerk, the Rector or Incumbent thereof being the Reverend George Smith Thorpe, clerk in holy orders:

"And whereas a warrant under the Royal Sign Manual has authorized the passing of these presents under the seal of the Duchy of Cornwall, in token of the consent of His Royal Highness.

"Now therefore with the consent of His Royal Highness (testified as aforesaid) and with the consent of the Right Reverend Archibald, now Bishop of the said diocese of Exeter, acting as such Bishop (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal), and with the consent of the said George Smith Thorpe, acting as the Incumbent of the said benefice of Lydford (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that as from the date of the institution or licence (as the case may be) of an Incumbent to the said benefice of Saint Michael and All Angels, Princetown, and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same, all and singular the tithe commutation rentcharges amounting to fiftyseven pounds two shillings and elevenpence per annum, which are specified in the Schedule to this Scheme annexed shall be transferred by way of apportionment from the said benefice of Lydford. and shall be annexed to and form part of the endowments of the said benefice of Saint Michael and All Angels,

"Provided always that the whole of the first-fruits and tenths now payable to the governors of Queen Anne's Bounty in respect of the said benefice of Lydford shall continue to be payable by the Rector or Incumbent of the said benefice.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter ninetyfour; of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four; and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the new parish of Saint Peter, Maidstone, and of the new parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Maidstone, both in the county of Kent and in the diocese of Canterbury.

"Whereas, by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council, bearing date the fourth day of June, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-one, and published in the London Gazette on the tenth day of August following, a certain part of the parish of Maidstone, in the said county of Kent and in the said diocese of Canterbury, was assigned as a separate District by the name of 'The Saint Peter's District to the consecrated church known as Saint Peter's Chapel, situate in the said parish of Maidstone.

"And whereas the said district chapelry of Saint Peter, Maidstone, has, under the provisions of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, become a new parish of the character contemplated by that Act, by the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, and by the above mentioned Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four.

"And whereas, by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council, bearing date the eleventh day of July, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, and published in the London Gazette on the twentieth day of the same month, a certain part of the said new parish of Saint Peter, Maidstone, was assigned as a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Michael and All Angels, situate in the said new parish of Saint Peter, Maidstone, and the said district chapelry was named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Michael and All Angels, Maidstone.'

"And whereas the said district chapelry of Saint Michael and All Angels, Maidstone, has, under the provisions of the above mentioned Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, become a new parish of the character contemplated by that Act, by the above mentioned Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, and by the above mentioned Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four.

"And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint Peter, Maidstone, and of the said new parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Maidstone, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Archbishop of Canterbury (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend, and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication

in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation, and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint Peter, Maidstone, and of the said new parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Maidstone, shall be altered so that (firstly) all that portion of the said new parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Maidstone, which is described in the First Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink shall be dissevered from such new parish, and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said new parish of Saint Peter, Maidstone, and (secondly) all that portion of the said new parish of Saint Peter, Maidstone, which is described in the Second Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured green shall be dissevered from such new parish, and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said new parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Maidstone.

"And we further represent, recommend, and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending, or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULES to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

#### "THE FIRST SCHEDULE.

"The territory to be dissevered from the new parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Maidstone, in the county of Kent and in the diocese of Canterbury, and to be annexed to the new parish of Saint Peter, Maidstone, in the same county and diocese, being:—

"All that portion of the said new parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Maidstone, which is bounded upon the north by the said new parish of Saint Peter, Maidstone, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the west, upon the south, and upon the southeast, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Peter, Maidstone, from the said new parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Maidstone, at the junction of Malling Road with Queen's Road, and extending thence in a straight line due south for a cistance of one hundred and twenty yards precisely, and extending thence first eastward and then north-eastward in a line parallel to and at a distance of one hundred and twenty yards from the middle of Queen's Road for a distance of thirty-four chains or thereabouts to the point where such line crosses the middle of the roadway connecting Queen's Road with Bower Mount Road and London Road, upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Maidstone, from the said new parish of Saint Peter, Maidstone.

"THE SECOND SCHEDULE.

"The territory to be dissevered from the said new parish of Saint Peter, Maidstone, and to be annexed to the said new parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Maidstone, being:—

"All that portion of the said new parish of Saint Peter, Maidstone, which is bounded upon the south-west by the said new parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Maidstone, upon the north-west by the parish of Allington, in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north-east and upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said parish of Allington from the said new parish of Saint Peter, Maidstone, crosses the middle of the footpath or roadway leading from Hermitage Road into Giddyhorn Lane and Malling Road, and extending thence south-eastward along middle of the said footpath or roadway for a distance of eighteen chains or thereabouts to its junction with Giddyhorn Lane and Malling Road; and extending thence southward along the middle of Malling Road for a distance of nine chains or thereabouts to its junction with Queen's Road upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Peter, Maidstone, from the said new parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Maidstone.

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the patron and to the incumbents of the cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation, and such patron and incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto.

"We, the Ecclesiastical C mmissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter seventy, of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Representation: as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the Consecrated Church of Saint Luke, Grimsby, situate within the new parish (sometime district) of All Saints, Grimsby, in the county of Lincoln and in the diocese of Lincoln.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said new parish of All Saints, Grimsby, of the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Saint Andrew, Great Grimsby, and of the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Saint John the Evangelist, New Clee, both in the said county and diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such new parishes.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said new parish of All Saints, Grimsby, of the said new parish of Saint Andrew, Great Grimsby, and of the said new parish of Saint John the Evangelist, New Clee, should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all Ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Luke, Grimsby, situate as aforesaid.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Edward Lee, Bishop of Lincoln, as such Bishop, and also as the patron, in right of his See, as well of the vicarage of the said new parish of All Saints, Grimsby, as of the vicarage of the said new parish of Saint Andrew, Great Grimsby, and of the vicarage of the said new parish of Saint John the Evangelist, New Clee (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Representation), We, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said new parish of All Saints, Grimsby, of the said new parish of Saint Andrew, Great Grimsby, and of the said new parish of Saint John the Evangelist, New Clee, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said Church of Saint Luke, Grimsby, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated . Chapelry of Saint Luke, Grimsby.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in Your Royal Wisdom, shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Luke, Grimsby, comprising:—

"All those contiguous portions of the new parish (sometime district) of All Saints, Grimsby, the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Saint Andrew, Great Grimsby, and of the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Saint John the Evangelist, New Clee, all in the county of Lincoln and in the diocese of Lincoln, which, taken together, are bounded upon the west by the parish of Great Grimsby, in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south, upon the east, and upon the north, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Great Grimsby from the said new parish of Saint Andrew, Great Grimsby, at a point in the middle of the loop line of railway connecting the line of the Great Central Railway with the East Lincolnshire line of the Great Northern Railway, opposite to the middle of Pasture Street, and extending thence southeastward to and along the middle of Pasture Street (thereby crossing the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Andrew, Great Grimsby, from the said new parish of All Saints, Grimsby) for a distance of thirty chains and a half or thereabouts to the centre of the culvert which carries such road over the Weelsby Drain upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of All Saints, Grimsby, from the district of Saint Stephen, Grimsby, in the said county and diocese, and extending thence first north-eastward and then north-westward the along last-mentioned boundary (thereby following the middle of the Weelsby Drain) for a distance of twelve chains and a half or thereabouts to the centre of the culvert which carries Eleanor Street over the said drain, where such boundary meets the boundary which divides the said district of Saint Stephen, Grimsby, from the said new parish of Saint John the Evangelist, New Clee, and extending thence first south-eastward and then north-eastward along the last-mentioned boundary (thereby following in part the middle of Eleanor Street, in part the middle of Weelsby Street South, and in part the middle of Weelsby Street) for a distance of twenty-two chains and a half or thereabouts to the junction of Weelsby Street with Cope Street, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Cope Street for a distance of eight chains and a quarter or thereabouts to its junction with Victor Street, and extending thence north-westward first across Victor Street to the eastern end of the fence forming the boundary between the houses and premises known as Number 140 and Number 142 Victor Street, and then along the said fence for a distance in all of two chains and threequarters or thereabouts to the western end of such fence where it meets the fence forming the eastern boundary of the houses and premises situate on the eastern side of Hope

Street, and extending thence north-eastward along the last-mentioned fence for a distance of seven yards or thereabouts to the point where it meets the fence forming the boundary between the houses and premises known as Number 154 and Number 156 Hope Street, and extending thence north-westward along the last-mentioned fence for a distance of one chain and a half or thereabouts to the western end of such fence on the eastern side of Hope Street, and extending thence north-westward first across Hope Street to the fence forming the boundary between the houses and premises known as Number 153 and Number 155 Hope Street, and then along such fence for a distance in all of two chains or thereabouts to the western end of such fence, and extending thence south-westward along the fence forming the western boundary of the houses and premises situate on the western side of Hope Street for a distance of twelve yards or thereabouts to a point opposite to the fence forming the boundary be-tween the houses and premises known as Number 161 and Number 163 Albion Street, and extending thence north-westward to and along the last-mentioned fence (thereby crossing the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint John the Evangelist, New Clee, from the said new parish of Saint Andrew, Great Grimsby) for a distance in all of one chain and three-quarters or thereabouts to the western end of such fence on the eastern side of Albion Street, and extending thence first north-westward to and then south-westward along the middle of Albion Street for a distance of seven chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Newmarket Street, and extending thence first north-westward and then westward along the middle of Newmarket Street for a distance of eighteen chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Railway Street, and extending thence northward along the middle of Railway Street for a distance of eight yards or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the footbridge leading across the line of the Great Central Railway into Market Street, and extending thence westward to and along the middle of the said footbridge for a distance of nine chains and a quarter or thereabouts to the point at the bottom of the steps at the western end of such footbridge in the middle of the footpath running along the backs of the houses and premises situate on the eastern side of King Edward Street North, upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Andrew, Great Grimsby, from the said parish of Great Grimsby."

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And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Lincoln.

HEREAS by section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, after reciting that "Whereas in some instances tithings, hamlets, chapelries, and other places or districts may be separated from the parishes or mother churches to which they belong, with great advantage, and places altogether extra-parochial may, in some instances, with advantage be annexed to parishes or districts to which they are contiguous, or be constituted separate parishes for ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That when with respect to his own diocese it shall appear to the Archbishop of the province, or when the Bishop of any diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop that any such tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place or district within the diocese of such Archbishop, or the diocese of such Bishop, as the case may be, may be advantageously separated from any parish or mother church, and either be constituted a separate benefice by itself or be united to any other parish to which it may be more conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place, or district, parochial or extra-parochial, so as to form a separate parish or benefice, or that any extra-parochial place may with advantage be annexed to any parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes; and the said Archbishop, or Bishop, shall draw up a scheme in writing (the scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted to the said Archbishop for his consideration) describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent charges, and other ecclesiastical dues, rates and payments, and in respect to patronage and rights to pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested; and if the patron or patrons of the benefice or benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent in writing under his or their hands to such scheme, or to such modification thereof, as the said Archbishop may approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with any such scheme, or modification thereof, and shall certify the same and such consent as aforesaid, by his report to His Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to make an Order for carrying such scheme, or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect.

And whereas the Right Reverend Charles, Lord Bishop of Oxford, hath, pursuant to the exactment aforesaid, made a Representation in writing to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, as follows:—

"I, Charles, Bishop of Oxford, in pursuance of the 26th section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, do hereby represent to Your Grace as follows:

"There is in the county of Buckingham and diocese of Oxford the benefice or vicarage of Great Missenden the parish whereof (including the district of Lee Common hereinafter mentioned) contains a population of 2,189 or there-

abouts with accommodation in the parish church for 500 persons.

- "The net annual value of the said benefice of Great Missenden from all sources is two hundred and twenty-five pounds or thereabouts.
- "There is also in the same county and diocese the benefice or perpetual curacy of Lee, the parish whereof contains a population of 431 or thereabouts with accommodation in the parish church for 150 persons.
- "The net annual value of the said benefice of Lee is one hundred and fifty-five pounds or thereabouts.
- "A certain portion or district of the said parish of Great Missenden known as Lee Common with a population of 366 or thereabouts is distant three miles from the church of Great Missenden and half a mile or thereabouts from that of Lee.
- "That it appears to me and I do hereby represent to Your Grace that under the provisions of the said Pluralities Act 1838 such portion or district of the parish of Great Missenden known as Lee Common (more particularly delineated and described on the plan annexed to the Scheme appended to this Representation and thereon coloured pink) may be advantageously separated therefrom and be annexed to the said parish of Lee to which it is contiguous for ecclesiastical purposes.
- "By virtue of my bishopric I am the patron of the benefice of Great Missenden and the Reverend George Edwin Wilson is the present Incumbent thereof.
- "Arthur Lasenby Liberty, of Lee Manor, in the said county of Buckingham, Esquire, is the patron of the benefice of Lee, and the Reverend Reginald Palmer is the present Incumbent thereof.
- "That pursuant to the directions contained in the said 26th section of the Pluralities Act 1838, I, the said Lord Bishop, have drawn up a Scheme in writing annexed to this Representation describing the mode in which it appears to me that the alteration above proposed may best be effected and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent charges and other ecclesiastical dues, rates and payments, and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested, and I do hereby submit the same to Your Grace together with the Consents in writing of the said patron of the benefice of Lee and of the Incumbents of both the said benefices to the intent that if Your Grace shall on full consideration and inquiry be satisfied with such Scheme you may certify the same and such Consents as aforesaid to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

#### SCHEME.

"It is proposed to separate from the parish of Great Missenden all that portion or district known as Lee Common which is more particularly delineated and described in the plan attached hereto and thereon coloured pink and to annex the same to the contiguous parish of Lee.

"That the Incumbent of the benefice of Lee shall have the sole and exclusive cure of souls within such portion so to be separated from Great Missenden.

"That all fees, ecclesiastical offerings and emoluments arising from the said portion so to be separated from Great Missenden shall henceforth belong to the Incumbent of the benefice of Lee.

"That no alteration shall be made in the endowments of the said benefices or either of

them.

"That no alteration shall be made in the patronage of the said benefices or either of them."

"That, pursuant to the directions contained in the 26th section of the said Act of Parlia-ment, the said Lord Bishop has drawn up a Scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to him that the proposed alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent charges, and other ecclesiastical dues, rates, and payments, and in respect to patronage and rights to pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested, which Scheme, together with the Consents thereto, in writing, of the said Lord Bishop, the patron or person entitled to present by virtue of his bishopric to the benefice of Great Missenden (if the same were now vacant), the Reverend George Edwin Wilson, the Incumbent of the said benefice; Arthur Lasenby Liberty, Esquire, the patron or person entitled to present to the benefice of Lee (if the same were now vacant); and the Reverend Reginald Palmer, the Incumbent of the said benefice, has been transmitted to us by the said Lord Bishop for our consideration.

"The Representation and Scheme of the said Lord Bishop and the Consents above referred to are hereunto annexed.

"And we, the said Archbishop, being on full consideration and inquiry satisfied with the said Scheme, do hereby, pursuant to the said Pluralities Act, 1838, certify the same and such Consents as aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may, in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do, make and issue an Order for carrying the said Scheme into effect.

The Wild Birds Protection (County Borough of Hastings) Order, 1913.

Dated 21st February, 1913.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the Council of the County Borough of Hastings, I hereby make the following Order:—

#### Title.

I. This Order may be cited as the Wild Birds Protection (County Borough of Hastings) Order, 1913.

#### BIRDS.

#### Close Time extended.

II. The period during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall be extended throughout the County Borough of Hastings, except with respect to the following Birds, so as to be between the last day of February and the 1st day of September in any year:—

Curlew, Godwit, Lapwing, Mallard, Plover, Redshank and other Sandpipers, Snipe, Teal and other Wild Ducks, Wild Geese, Wild Swan, Whimbrel, Widgeon, Woodcock.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the County Borough of Hastings to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the schedule to the Act:—

Black-headed Bunting, Cirl Bunting, Corn Bunting, Reed Bunting, Snow Bunting, Yellow Bunting (Yellow Hammer), Bustard, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Chiffchaff, Corn Crake (Land

Rail), Peregrine Falcon, Pied Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher, Hobby, Kestrel, Martin, Merlin, Nuthatch, Osprey, Kentish Plover, Raven, Redstart, Red Backed Shrike, Stonechat, Swallow, Swift, Bearded Tit, Blue Tit, Coal Tit, Crested Tit, Great Tit, Long-tailed Tit, Marsh Tit, Wagtails (all species), Blackcap Warbler, Dartford Warbler, Garden Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Reed Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Willow Warbler, Wood Warbler, Wheatear, Whinchat, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Fire-crested Wren, Goldencrested Wren, Wryneck.

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

IV. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as varied by Clause II. of this Order, does not extend, the killing or taking of any of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County Borough of Hastings:—

Avocet, Common Bittern, Little Bittern, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Chough, Crossbill, Peregrine Falcon, Pied Flycatcher, Goldfinch, Great Crested Grebe, Hen Harrier (Ringtailed Hawk), Marsh Harrier (Moor Buzzard), Montagu's Harrier, Hoopoe, Kingfisher, Common Kite, Wood Lark, Nightjar (Fern Owl, Goatsucker, Night Hawk), Oriole, Osprey, Owl (all species), Kentish Plover, Ringed Plover (Stonehatch), Redpole, Raven, Siskin, Spoonbill, Stone Curlew (Great Plover, Thick-knee), Tern or Sea Swallow (all species), Bearded Tit, Dartford Warbler, Wheatear, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker.

#### All Birds protected on Sundays.

V. During those periods of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, and by Clause II. of this Order does not extend, namely:—Between the 31st day of July in any year and the 2nd day of March following as regards the Birds named in Clause II., and between the 31st day of August in any year and the 1st day of March following as regards all other birds, the killing or taking of Wild Birds on Sundays is prohibited throughout the County Borough of Hastings.

#### Eccs.

#### All Eggs protected within certain Areas:

VI. The taking or destroying of Wild Birds' Eggs is prohibited for a period of five years from the date of this Order within the following areas in the County Borough of Hastings, namely, the line of Cliffs and the Alexandra Park.

The above areas are shown in pink on a map deposited with the Town Clerk, sealed with the Home Office seal, and dated the 21st February, 1913.

Certain Eggs protected throughout the County Borough.

VII. The taking or destroying of the Eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Gounty Borough of Hastings:—

#### TRADE BOARDS ACT, 1909.

Order of the Board of Trade under Section 5 (2).

Whereas by section 4 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, it is amongst other things provided, as follows:—

(1) Trade Boards shall, subject to the provisions of this section, fix minimum rates of wages for time-work for their trades (in this Act referred to as minimum time-rates), and may also fix general minimum rates of wages for piece-work for their trades (in this Act referred to as general minimum piece-rates), and those rates of wages (whether time or piece-rates) may be fixed so as to apply universally

to the trade, or so as to apply to any special process in the work of the trade or to any special class of workers in the trade, or to any special

- If a Trade Board report to the Board of Trade that it is impracticable in any case to fix a minimum time-rate in accordance with this section, the Board of Trade may so far as respects that case relieve the Trade Board of their duty.
- (2) Before fixing any minimum time-rate or general minimum piece-rate, the Trade Board shall give notice of the rate which they propose to fix, and consider any objections to the rate which may be lodged with them within three months.
- (3) The Trade Board shall give notice of any minimum time-rate or general minimum piecerate fixed by them;

And whereas by section 5 of the said Act it is amongst other things provided:—

- (1) Until a minimum time-rate or general minimum piece-rate fixed by a Trade Board has been made obligatory by order of the Board of Trade under this section, the operation of the rate shall be limited as in this Act provided.
- (2) Upon the expiration of six months from the date on which a Trade Board have given notice of any minimum time-rate or general minimum piece-rate fixed by them, the Board of Trade shall make an order (in this Act referred to as an obligatory order) making that minimum rate obligatory in cases in which it is applicable on all persons employing labour, and on all persons employed, unless they are of opinion that the circumstances are such as to make it premature or otherwise undesirable to make an obligatory order, and in that case they shall make an order suspending the obligatory operation of the rate (in this Act referred to as an order of suspension).

And whereas a Trade Board was established by the Board of Trade under the said Act on 23rd November, 1910, for those branches of the Ready-made and Wholesale Bespoke Tailoring trade in Great Britain which are engaged in making garments to be worn by male persons, and was constituted in accordance with Regulations made by the Board of Trade under the said Act, and dated 25th July, 1910;

And whereas the said Trade Board gave notice on 9th November, 1911, that they proposed to fix minimum time-rates of wages for male workers in the said trade;

And whereas the said Trade Board gave notice on 4th April, 1912, that they proposed to fix minimum time-rates of wages for female workers in the said trade;

And whereas, after considering the objections to the minimum rates proposed for male workers lodged with them within three months from 11th November, 1911, and the objections to the minimum rates proposed for female workers lodged with them within three months from 4th April, 1912, the said Trade Board gave notice on 19th August, 1912, that they had fixed minimum time-rates of wages for male and female workers in the said trade, and the rates fixed are set out in the Schedule hereto;

And whereas the said rates have been in limited operation since the 19th day of August, 1912;

Now, therefore, the Board of Trade, in pursuance of the powers in them vested as before recited, do, by this order, make the said minimum time-rates fixed by the said Trade Board and set out in the said Schedule hereto obligatory in cases in which they are applicable

on all persons employing labour and on all persons employed in the said trade.

- (b) The minimum or lowest time-rate for Learners under 14 years of age shall be 3s. a week, and on reaching the age of 14 they shall be entitled to the amounts shewn in column I. above as if they had commenced at 14.
- (c) The learners' rates are weekly rates based on a week of 50 hours, but they shall be subject to a proportionate deduction or increase according as the number of hours actually spent by the learner in the factory or workshop in any week is less or more than 50.
- (d) The advances to be given to learners shall be paid on the first pay days in January and July, the learner being entitled to her first advance on the first of such pay days following her entry into the trade provided that she has been in the trade at least three months.

(e) A learner shall cease to be a learner and be entitled to the full minimum time-rate for a worker, applicable to her under Section (1) upon the fulfilment of the following conditions:—

- (f) No female learner shall be held to be entitled to the full minimum rate under Section (1) until she has attained the age of 18 years notwithstanding any employment she may have had.
- (g) Any female who has been previously employed in any branch of the trade as described in Section (1) and has not held a certificate or certified copy certificate and is subsequently taken on as a learner shall count the whole period of such previous employment for the purpose of claiming the time-rate at which she is to be paid, and shall have such period of employment entered upon her certificate or certified copy.

#### Section (3).

The above rates shall apply to all female workers as specified above who are employed during the whole or any part of their time in any branch of the Ready-made and Wholesale Bespoke Tailoring Trade which is engaged in making garments to be worn by male persons, but they shall not apply to any persons engaged merely as Clerks, Messengers, Stockroom Assistants, Warehouse Assistants, Saleswomen, Travellers, Packers, Parcellers, Distributors, Cleaners, or to any other persons whose work stands in a relationship to the trade similar to that of the foregoing excluded classes.

#### Section (4).

- A. female learner is a worker who:-
- (a) Is employed during the whole or a substantial part of her time in learning any branch or process of the trade by an employer who provides the learner with reasonable facilities for such learning.
- and (b) Has received a certificate or certified copy certificate issued in accordance with rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board and held subject to compliance with the conditions contained in this Section, or has made an application therefor which has been duly acknowledged and is still under consideration. The Trade Board may, if any condition contained in this Section is not in fact complied with, cancel the original certificate, whereupon any copy thereof shall become cancelled. Notice of such cancellation shall forthwith be given to the learner and her employer.

Provided that an employer may employ a female learner on her first employment, in the branch or branches of the trade as above described, without a cert ficate for a probation period not exceeding four weeks, but in the event of such learner being continued thereafter at her employment the probation period shall be included in her period of learnership.

Provided that notwithstanding compliance with the conditions contained in this Section a person shall not be deemed to be a learner if she works in a room used for dwelling purposes and is not in the employment of her parent or guardian.

#### MINIMUM TIME-RATES FOR MALE WORKERS.

#### Section A.

The minimum (or lowest) time-rates for male workers in those branches of the Ready made and Wholesale Bespoke Tailoring Trade in Great Britain which are engaged in making garments to be worn by male persons shall (subject to the provisions of this notice as to male learners) be as follows clear of all deductions.

(1) For male workers other than homeworkers ... ... 6d. an hour. (2) For male homeworkers ... ... 6d. an hour.

#### Section B .- Learners.

(1.) In lieu of the above rates male "learners" (as hereinafter defined) shall receive the following minimum or lowest time-rates clear of all deductions, that is to say:—

Learners commencing employment in the Tailoring trade at and over the age of 19 may serve a period of six months at 15s. 8d. per week and thereafter a period of six months at 19s. 10d. per week. They shall then receive such rates as their age may entitle them to under the foregoing provisions.

provisions.

(2 The learners' rates are weekly rates based on a week of 50 hours, but they shall be subject to a proportionate deduction or increase according as the number of hours actually spent by the

learner in the factory or workshop in any week is less or more than 50.

Section C.

The above rates shall apply to all male workers as specified above who are engaged during the whole or any part of their time in any branch of the Ready-made and Wholesale Bespoke Tailoring Trade which is engaged in making parments to be worn by male persons; but they shall not apply to any persons engaged merely as Clerks, Messengers, Stockroom Assistants, Warehouse Assistants, Salesmen, Travellers, Packers, Parcellers, Distributors, Mechanics, Engineers, Carpenters, Cleaners, and to others whose work stands in a relationship to the trade similar to that of the above excluded classes.

Section D.

A male learner is a worker who:

(1.) Is employed during the whole or a substantial part of his time in learning any branch or process of the trade by an employer who provides the learner with reasonable facilities

for such learning.

and (2.) Has received a certificate or certified copy certificate issued in accordance with rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board and held subject to compliance with the conditions contained in this Section, or has made an application therefor which has been duly acknowledged and is still under consideration. The Trade Board may, if any condition contained in this Section is not in fact complied with, cancel the original certificate, whereupon any copy thereof shall become cancelled. Notice of such cancellation shall forthwith be given to the learner and his employer.

Provided that an employer may employ a male learner on his first employment in the branch or branches of the trade as above described, without a certificate for a probation period not exceeding four weeks, but in the event of such learner being continued thereafter at his employment the probation period shall be included in his period of learnership.

Provided that notwithstanding compliance with the conditions contained in this Section a person shall not be deemed to be a learner if he works in a room used for dwelling

purposes and is not in the employment of his parent or guardian.

In totalling up any reckonings, in the aggregate arrived at when paying the rates fixed hereunder, every fraction of a farthing shall count as a farthing.

The expression HOMEWOEKER shall be held to mean a worker who works in his or her own home or in any other place not under the control or management of the employer.

ARTICLE I.—The provisions of sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Act with respect to the driving of a motor car at a speed not exceeding ten miles per hour shall apply and have effect within the limits comprising the parts of roads within the Urban District of Witham which are specified in the Schedule hereto.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the twenty-fourth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and

thirteen.

So much of the main road from London to Colchester as extends from a point in Newland Street, Witham, 223 yards north-east of the centre of Witham Bridge to a point 45 yards north-east of the junction of Newland Street with Collingwood Road;

having charge of or helping in the charge of a carriage. The expression "Interior of a Carriage" shall not include the upper deck of covered carriages.

3. Every passenger shall enter or depart from a carriage by the hindermost or conductor's platform, and not otherwise, unless to directed by the conductor.

When a carriage stops, no person shall board the carriage until all passengers desiring to alight therefrom shall have done so.

- 4. No person shall smoke inside any carriage, except in a compartment set apart for the purpose, and no person shall spit in, on, from, or against any carriage.
- 5. No passenger or other person shall, while travelling in or upon any carriage, play or perform upon any musical instrument.
- 6. No person in a state of intoxication shall enter or mount upon any carriage, and if found in or upon any carriage shall, upon the request of the conductor, leave such carriage, and in the event of refusal to leave shall be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.
- 7. A person whose dress or clothing might in the opinion of the conductor soil or injure the linings or cushions of the carriage, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or who, in the opinion of the conductor, might, for any other reason, be offensive to passengers, shall not mount, enter or remain on or in any carriage, and may be prevented from so\_doing, and if found on or in any carriage shall on the request of the conductor leave the same, upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned.

Provided that on carriages specially run for artisans, mechanics and daily labourers, no person shall be prevented from entering or remaining in or on a carriage under the provisions of this bye-law, on the ground of the condition of his dress or clothing, if such condition is solely due to the nature of his employment.

- 8. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language whilst in or upon any carriage, or conduct himself offensively, or in any way wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger. No person shall distribute advertisements or tracts of any kind, or beg or collect alms or subscriptions, or sell any article, or play any game or gamble, or deposit remnants of food or fruit in or upon any carriage, waiting room or building used in connection with the tramways.
- 9. No person shall commit any nuisance in, on, or against any carriage, tramway station, waiting room or premises used in connection with the tramways.
- 10. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil or damage the cushions or the linings, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice, in or upon any carriage, or break or scratch any window of, or otherwise wilfully damage, any carriage.

Any person acting in contravention of this bye-law shall, in addition to the penalty imposed by these bye-laws, be liable to pay the amount of any damage done.

11. Each passenger shall upon demand, and whether the fare shall have been demanded or not, before leaving the carriage, pay to the conductor or other duly authorised officer of the

Corporation, the fare legally payable for the journey and obtain a ticket therefor. Any person leaving a carriage shall be deemed to have completed the journey, except when transferring from one carriage to another under any regulations of the Corporation. Any passenger who desires to take advantage of a through fare must ask for and obtain a ticket issued in respect of such through fare.

Any passenger paying for a stage less than the whole journey run by the carriage shall be deemed to have completed the journey at the end of the stage paid for, and if staying on the carriage shall pay the fare legally payable for the remainder of the journey as a new passenger. Tickets shall not be transferable.

12. Each passenger shall immediately upon demand show his ticket to any officer or servant of the Corporation, and shall also, when required so to do, either deliver up his ticket or in default thereof pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

A passenger not being an artisan, mechanic or daily labourer, within the true intent and meaning of the statutory provisions relating to the Corporation shall not use or attempt to use any ticket intended only for such artisans, mechanics or daily labourers.

13. Any person entering or mounting on any carriage, and having any luggage (including the tools of an artisan, mechanic or daily labourer) shall, if so requested by the conductor, place such luggage upon either of the platforms and shall not take or place same in the interior or on the upper deck of the carriage, unless permitted by the conductor so to

No person shall bring on to any carriage luggage of a size or bulk, which, in the opinion of the conductor is likely to cause inconvenience, hindrance or annoyance to passengers.

14. No person, not being a servant of the Corporation, shall travel or ride upon the steps or platforms of any carriage, or stand on the upper deck or sit on the railings, buffers or guards of any carriage, and any person so travelling, standing or sitting, shall cease to do so immediately on request by the conductor.

No person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of a carriage, or travel therein or thereon, otherwise than on a seat provided for passengers except in the interior of the carriage with the consent of the conductor.

- 15. No person except a passenger or intending passenger shall enter or mount any carriage, and no person shall enter, mount, or leave, or attempt to enter, mount, or leave any carriage whilst in motion.
- 16. When any carriage contains the full number of passengers which it is provided it shall carry, no person beyond such number shall enter, mount or remain on such carriage when warned by the conductor not to do so.
- 17. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or upon any carriage, except by permission of the conductor, nor in any case in which the conveyance of such dog or other animal might be offensive or an annoyance to passengers. No person shall take a dog or other animal into or upon any carriage after having been requested not to do so by the conductor. Any dog or

other animal taken into or on any carriage shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the carriage immediately upon request by the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

- 18. No person shall travel in or on any carriage with loaded firearms, or with any article, instrument, or implement, or any material or substance which may be dangerous or offensive to passengers.
  - 19. No person shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Corporation in the execution of his duty, upon or in connection with any carriage or the tramways, and no person other than the driver or conductor, or other servant of the Corporation acting in the performance of his duty, shall change or remove the route indicators or destination boards, or interfere with the controllers, brakes, lights, ventilators, trolleycord, or any part of a carriage or its equipment.
  - 20. If at any time a carriage becomes disabled, or in any way damaged, or from any cause unable to proceed, the passengers shall, upon the request of the conductor, leave the same, and if such passengers have paid their fares, they shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of their fares so paid, but on the production of their tickets shall be allowed to complete their journey by the next available carriage.
  - 21. Any person who shall commit, whilst in in or on any carriage, any breach of these byelaws and regulations, shall, if the offence is continued be liable, in addition to the penalty hereinafter provided, to be immediately removed from such carriage by or under the direction of the conductor, and if such person shall have paid his fare, he shall not be entitled to claim its return.
  - 22. The conductor shall enforce these byelaws and regulations, and prevent the breach thereof to the best of his ability.
  - 23. Any person offending against, or committing a breach of any of these bye-laws and regulations, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.
  - 24. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each carriage in use a printed copy of these bye-laws and regulations.
  - 25. These bye-laws shall come into force on the 18th day of April, 1913.

Such last-mentioned person shall signal to the driver of such locomotive to stop or drive to the side of the highway when. it shall be necessary to do so in order to enable overtaking pedestrians, vehicles, horses, or cattle to pass by. And the person in charge of such locomotive shall, upon receiving any such signal as aforesaid, immediately stop such locomotive and waggons, or draw it and them to the side of the highway as the case may

Provided always that nothing herein contained shall apply to a steam roller not drawing more than three loaded or unloaded waggons.

# WINDING-UP ORDERS.
