N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration for future Examinations.

- 1. The limits of age are 20 and 25; candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of the examination.

All the subjects in Class I must be taken up. No candidate will be eligible who fails to pass a qualifying examination in English and Arithmetic. From Class II candidates may select not more than three of the subjects specified.

- 3. Application for permission to attend the examination must be made in the writing of the candidate, at such times and in such manner as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners.
- 4. A fee of £3 will be required from each candidate attending the examination.

NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE.

The National Health Insurance (Further Payments to Approved Societies) (Wales) Order, 1913 (No. 3), dated the 24th February, 1913, made by the Welsh Insurance Commissioners under Sections 78 and 82 of the National Insurance Act, 1911 (1 & 2 Geo. V, c. 55).

Whereas by Section 82 of the National Insurance Act, 1911 (in this Order called "the Act"), it is amongst other things provided that the sums required to meet expenditure properly incurred by Approved Societies (in this Order called "Societies") for the purposes of benefits under Part (1) of the Act to insured persons resident in Wales and the administration of those benefits shall be paid out of the Welsh National Health Insurance Fund (in this Order referred to as "the Fund"):

And whereas by Section 78 of the Act read with Section 82 of the Act it is amongst other things provided that if any difficulty arises in bringing Part (1) of the Act into operation in Wales the Welsh Insurance Commissioners (inthis Order called "the Commissioners") with the consent of the Treasury may by Order make any appointment and do anything which appears to them necessary or expedient for bringing Part (1) of the Act into operation in Wales and any such Order may modify the provisions of the Act so far as may appear necessary or expedient for carrying the Order into effect:

And whereas it is necessary in order to bring Part (1) of the Act into operation in Wales that payments should be made out of the Fund to meet expenditure properly incurred by Societies for the purposes of the benefits administered by them and the administration of those benefits:

And whereas up to the date of this Order it has not been possible, and will not for some time to come be possible, to carry to the credit had been credited in the Fund to that Society,

of the various Societies in the Fund all the sums which ought to be carried to the credit of those Societies in respect of contributions paid by or in respect of the members of those Societies before the date of this Order:

And whereas the regulations to be made under Section 56 of the Act read with Section 82 of the Act providing for the crediting of sums to Societies are not yet in force:

And whereas by reason of the premises doubts have arisen as to whether payments can lawfully be made out of the Fund for the purposes aforesaid unless this Order is made, and a difficulty has thereby arisen within the meaning of the said Section 78:

Now, therefore, the Commissioners in pursuance of the powers conferred on them by the Act and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, with the consent of the Treasury, hereby order as follows:—

1. At any time after the date of this Order there may be paid out of the Fund to any Society such sums as the Commissioners may in any case direct for the purpose of meeting expenditure incurred by the Society for the purposes of the benefits administered by the Society and the administration of those benefits, not exceeding, in the case of a Society which has given security to the Commissioners pursuant to the provisions of Section 26 of the Act, read with Section 82 of the Act, seven shillings, for each person certified by the proper officers of the Society to have been a member of the Society for the purposes of Part (1) of the Act on such date or dates as the Commissioners fix for the purposes of this provision, and in the case of a Society which has not so given security not exceeding the actual amount expended by that Society as certified by the proper officers of the Society.

Provided that—

- (a) in the case of a Society or branch of a Society having less than 500 members the said sum of seven shillings may be increased to such greater sum as the Commissioners in their discretion think fit:
- (b) any sums paid to a Society prior to the date of this Order for the purpose of meeting expenditure incurred by the Society for the purposes of benefits and the administration of benefits or either of such purposes shall, for the purpose of estimating the amounts payable to the Society under this Order, be deemed to have been paid under this Order, and shall be taken into account accordingly:
- (c) the total amount paid to a Society under this Order shall not exceed the net amount which, in the opinion of the Commissioners, having regard to the membership of the Society and to the amount of contributions previously paid by or in respect of members of the Society, may eventually be carried to the credit of the Society in the Fund.
- 2. Any payments made to a Society in pursuance of this Order shall, so far as they are payments which could properly have been made out of the Fund under Section 82 of the Act if made in the prescribed manner and if money had been credited in the Fund to that Society.

3. This Order may be cited as the National Health Insurance (Further Payments to Approved Societies) (Wales) Order, 1913 (No. 3).

Regulations under Section 9 (1).

COUNTY OF BUCKINGHAM.

PARISH OF DATCHET.

To the County Council of Buckingham ;-And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of Section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that, within any limits or place referred to in Regulations made by Us, the Local Government Board, with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour;

And whereas the County Council of Buckingham, having made application to Us to make a Regulation in pursuance of the said sub-section putting the above-mentioned provisions of that sub-section in force within the limits comprising certain roads or parts of roads within the Parish of Datchet, We directed a Local Inquiry to be held into the matter by one of Our Inspectors, and the Inquiry was held accordingly, and Report has been made to Us thereon:

NOW THEREFORE, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, We do, by this Our Order, make the following Regulations:

ARTICLE I.—The provisions of sub-section (1) of Section 9 of the Act with respect to the driving of a motor car at a speed not exceeding ten miles per hour shall apply and have effect within the limits comprising the roads or parts of roads within the Parish of Datchet which are specified in the Schedule hereto.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the third day of March, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen.

So much of the Windsor Road as extends from a point 50 yards north-west of its junction with Queen's Road to a point 50 yards south-east of its junction with the Avenue;

Queen's Road and High Street;

The road extending from the eastern extremity of Queen's Road at May's Crossing to a point in the Langley Road 50 yards north-east of Datchet House; and

So much of the Horton Road as extends for a distance of 100 yards from its junction with the road last above described.

BY THE LIEUTENANT-GOVERNOR.

A PROCLAMATION.

Isle of Man to wit.

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WHEREAS it is deemed advisable to make Orders for regulating the importation of animals into this Island.

Now I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of two members of the Council, and under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon me by the Cattle Diseases Prevention Acts, do hereby Order as follows:—

LANDING REGULATIONS.

Animals not Intended for Immediate Slaughter.

1.—No animal shall be landed in this Island except at the Port of Douglas.

2.—Any person importing animals shall give at least twelve hours notice, in writing or by

telegram, to the Chief Constable, Douglas, Isle of Man, and to the Superintendent in charge of the Government Lairs, of his intention to land the animals, and of the name of the boat by which it is proposed to import them.

3.—No animals shall be allowed to be landed unless accompanied by the certificate of a duly qualified Veterinary Surgeon, that such animals are free from disease at the time of shipment on an examination of such animals made within twenty-four hours prior to shipment. Such certificate shall be produced to an Officer of Police before the animals can be landed, and shall be delivered up to the Superintendent of the Government Lairs on the removal of the animals to the Lairs.

The official marking of animals by a Government Veterinary Inspector at a port of shipment will be accepted in lieu of a certificate.

Where animals are imported without a certificate, but are officially marked, they shall be inspected by an Officer of Police, who before permitting them to be landed shall satisfy himself that they are properly marked.

4.—(1.) Each cargo of animals landed under

this Order shall on landing be driven to the Government Lairs, and the animals shall be there detained until their movement therefrom is permitted by a Government Veterinary Inspector, to be appointed by the Lieutenant-Governor, which permission shall not be granted unless and until the whole cargo has been examined by him, and certified by him to be free from disease.

- (2.) If two or more cargoes or parts of cargoes are permitted to be in the Government Lairs at the same time, they shall, for the purposes of this Order, be treated as one cargo.
- (3.) Every consignment of animals removed to the Government Lairs shall be accompanied by a statement showing the place or premises from which the animals were originally moved, and their place of destination within this Island.
- -Animals landed under this Order and removed into the Government Lairs shall, while detained in such Lairs, be supplied with a proper and sufficient supply of food and water by the owners or consignees thereof.
- 6.—The Superintendent of the Government Lairs shall have power to forbid persons entering the same without permission from himself.
- 7.—The Superintendent of the Government Lairs shall keep in a book, to be provided for the purpose, a record of all animals moved into or out of the Lairs.
- 8.—The foregoing paragraphs shall apply to all animals imported into this Island which are not intended for immediate slaughter.

Animals Intended for Immediate Slaughter.

- 9.—Paragraphs one and two of this Order shall also apply to all animals imported into this Island for immediate slaughter.
- 10.—All animals imported for immediate slaughter shall, on being landed, be at once taken to the public abattoir in Douglas, and detained there until slaughtered.

Animals Suffering from Tuberculosis.

11.—Any animal removed to the Government Lairs which on being examined by the Government Veterinary Inspector is found to be showing symptoms of tuberculosis, shall at the option of the owner or consignee, either be at once removed from the Lairs to the nearest public abattoir and there slaughtered or sent back by such owner or consignee at his own expense to the port from which such animal was shipped.

Importation of Animals from Abroad.

- 12.—It shall not be lawful to land in this Island any animal brought from any country or place outside the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and the Channel Islands.
- 13.—It shall not be lawful to land in this Island-
 - (a) The carcase of an animal which has died or been slaughtered on board a vessel while in a port in any country outside the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and the Channel Islands, or during the passage from any such port to this Island or thereafter while in any port in this Island; or

(b) the dung of any such animal; or

(c) any fittings, pens, hurdles, or utensils used for or about any such animal unless they have been scraped and then thoroughly washed or scrubbed or scoured with water, and subsequently disinfected, and unless the permission of the Chief Constable has been obtained.

14.—The Principal Officer of Customs and Excise in this Island, or any Officer of Police, may seize and detain any carcase, dung, fittings, pens, hurdles, or utensils landed in contravention of this Order, and he shall forthwith report the facts to the Government Office with a view to their destruction or disposal.

Interpretation.

15.—In this Order,

"Government Lairs" means such place or places as the Lieutenant-Governor may from time to time appoint for the detention of animals under this Order.

"Animals" for the purpose of this Order means bulls, cows, oxen, heifers, calves,

sheep, lambs, goats, and swine.
"Disease" for the purpose of this Order means cattle plague (that is to say, rinderpest, or the disease commonly called cattle plague), Contagious Pleuro-pneumonia of cattle, Foot-and-Mouth Disease, Sheep-pox, Sheep Scab, Swine Fever (that is to say, the disease known as Typhoid Fever of Swine, Soldier, Purples, Red Disease, Hog Cholera, or Swine Plague), or Anthrax.

"Carcase" means the carcase of an animal, and part of a carcase, and the meat, flesh, bones, hide, skin, hoofs, horns, offal, or other part of an animal separately or otherwise, or any portion thereof.

Repeal.

16.—The Orders in Council of the 29th day of January, 1907, the 16th day of April, 1907, the 4th day of June, 1907, the 4th day of January, 1909, the 18th day of October, 1910, and the 1st day of July, 1912, are hereby repealed.

Commencement.

17.—This Order shall come into operation on the 17th day of February, 1913.

Short Title.

18.—This Order may be cited as "The Animals (Importation) Order of 1913."

(Authorizing the Transfer to and Vesting in the Holme Cultram Urban District Council of the Gas Undertaking of the North British Railway Company at Silloth; to empower the Council to carry on the Undertaking and Maintain Gas Works; to supply Gas within the Parish of Holme Low and other parts of the Urban District of Holme Cultram; to Manufacture, Store, Sell and Supply Gas and Residuals, Purchase of Lands, Confirmation of Agreement with Company; Quality and Testing of Gas Supplied; Levying of Rents and Charges; Laying of Pipes in Private Streets; Supply of Gas in Bulk and of Meters, Fittings and Apparatus, and Protection of same against Distress, &c.; Borrowing Powers; General Provisions; Incorporation and Amendment of Acts and other purposes.)

OTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament for leave to bring in a Bill in the ensuing Session of Parliament by the Urban District Council of Holme Cultram, in the county of Cumberland (in this notice referred to as "the Council") for an Act for all or some of the following purposes (that is to say):—

- 1. To authorize the Council to manufacture, store, supply and sell gas for all public and private purposes within the urban district of Holme Cultram (in this notice referred to as "the area of supply"), and to exercise the powers usually conferred upon local authorities for supplying gas, and the manufacture and dealing in residual products.
- 2. to construct, alter, improve, enlarge, extend or remove buildings, apparatus and works for or incidental to the manufacture and storage of gas and of coke, culm, asphaltum, pitch, coal tar, oil, lime, ammoniacal liquor and other residual products therefrom, and any dwellings for any persons employed in or about the gasworks, and to make, distribute, sell and dispose of gas, and to manufacture or convert, sell, dispose of and deal in coke and other products arising or resulting or obtained from the manufacture of gas, and any matters producible therefrom for all public and private purposes in and to all parts of the area of supply.

4. The lands intended to be used for the manufacture and storage of gas belong to and are in the occupation of the Company, and consist of:—

All those two pieces or parcels of freehold land in the parish of Holme Low, containing respectively '629 acres and '693 acres, and being the inclosures numbered 1077 and 1062 on the Ordnance Map of the said parish (scale $\frac{1}{2500}$) (2nd edition, 1900), upon which or part of which the gasworks of the Company have been erected.

- 5. To authorize the Council, in addition to the lands above described, to purchase by agreement, and to hold or take on lease, and to acquire rights or easements over any lands or other hereditaments which may be required for the general purposes of the gas undertaking of the Council, or of the Bill other than the manufacture and storage of gas or of the residual products therefrom, and to vary and extinguish all rights and privileges connected with such lands and hereditaments, and from time to time to sell, let or otherwise dispose of any lands for the time being belonging to them, and not required for the purposes of the undertaking.
- 6. To authorize the Council to break open and interfere with public and private streets, roads, passages and places, railways, tramways and bridges, and to lay down, maintain, repair and renew gas mains, pipes and works in, upon and under the same within the district.
- 7. To authorize the Council to enter into and carry into effect contracts and agreements with any company, corporation, body or person for the supply of gas in bulk to the Council or for the supply by the Council of gas within and beyond the district.
- 8. To authorize the Council to purchase or hire, provide, sell, let for hire, use and otherwise deal in and to fix, fit up, alter, repair, remove and refix stoves, ranges, ovens, prepayment and other meters, fittings, engines, machinery, pipes, lamps, burners, apparatus, appliances and things used in the supply or consumption of gas for lighting, motive power, heating, cooking or any other purpose whatsoever, and to provide materials and labour and do works necessary therefor or in connection therewith for such remuneration and upon such terms and conditions as they may think fit or as may be prescribed by the Bill (including security both as regards the consumers and other parties) for the safety and return of such articles and things, and to exempt all such articles and things from liability to distress or being taken in execution under process of law or in proceedings in bankruptcy.

- 9. To authorize the Council to levy and recover rents and charges for or in respect of the supply of gas and for the sale and hire of meters, fittings, stoves, engines, machinery, apparatus, appliances, pipes, lamps, burners and things, and to confer, vary and extinguish exemptions from the payment of rents and charges.
- 10. To require any person who has a separate supply of gas for power or other purposes, or who has a separate supply of electricity or other illuminant to pay a minimum charge for gas supplied by the Council, and to impose other terms and conditions in connection with such supply.
- 11. To prescribe the quality and illuminating power of gas supplied by the Council, and for testing the same, and to exempt the Council from any penalty for insufficiency of pressure, defect of illuminating power, or excess of impurity of gas supplied, and to make provision with regard to prepayment for gas; to enable the Council to refuse to supply gas to persons in debt to them in respect of other premises; to require notice by consumers before quitting premises supplied with gas; to prescribe a period for error in defective meters; to make provisions in regard to the inspection of fittings and other matters incidental to the objects of the Bill, including the following: -The payment of interest on deposits; the allowance of discounts on payment of accounts; the making of bye-laws; the prevention of waste or misuse of gas; the use of antifluctuators; the giving, service and authentication of notices and other documents; contracts incidental to supply of gas not to disqualify; and the imposition, recovery and application of penalties.
- 12. To authorize the Council to borrow money for the purposes of the Bill and to charge the moneys so proposed to be borrowed and interest thereon on the revenue of their gas undertaking and on the district fund and general district rate of the district, and to provide for the application of the revenue from the said undertaking and for any deficiency therein being made good out of the general district rate of the district or out of a special rate to be levied on the part of the district known as Part I, and for the formation and application of a reserve fund.
- 13. To incorporate with or without amendment the Gas Works Clauses Act, 1847, the Gas Works Clauses Act, 1871, the Lands Clauses Acts, the Local Loans Act, 1875, and the Public Health Acts, or so much of those Acts as may be applicable to the case of a local authority supplying gas.
- 14. To alter or repeal some of the provisions of the North British Railway Act, 1858, or other Acts relating to the Company.
